Jennifer: "the doctors said my body went into shock and my blood would not clot." While delivering Casey James, Jennifer Lyons' uterus tore. The mother of six began to bleed uncontrollably. Jennifer Lyons/blood recipient: "my husband and my sister remember the tubes, blood pouring out of my body for days, the slow drip of the precious life saving blood being put back into my body." In all, Jennifer received 17 units of donated blood over two and a half days. She knows how fortunate she is in a climate of blood shortages, so many donors stepped forward. I still wake up every morning thanking God for the blood donors. Jennifer met six of her actual donors on this the 20th Anniversary of Lifesource. Generous, giving people who through new technology will ultimately be able to help even more of those in need.

A simple cough in the doctors' office may be able to tell if you have lung cancer. University of Maryland researchers have developed a test for current and former smokers. It analyzes DNA

from coughed up phlegm looking for telltale genetic signs of lung cancer. The non-invasive in office test identified 76% of stage 1 lung cancer. Current tests only find 47% of cancers.

Scientists say if they know the infection spreads from the eyes they may be able to both protect and treat children with R – S – V better.

Doctors say they were disappointed in the study results from more than 300 heart patients. The anti-depressant that worked best for heart patients: Citalopram.

But a new study finds a procedure called uterine artery embolization where surgeons cut off blood flow to the growths is a safe alternative and can help women preserve their uterus and their fertility.

Statins and the sexes; the popular cholesterol lowering drugs do not work as well for women. A study in the Canadian Medical Association Journal finds statins reduce the risk of death better for men after a heart attack. The researchers say men and women produce statins differently and women need a higher dose to achieve the same positive effects.

Topic: The Silent Epidemic

You probably have half a dozen cans and cleaners in your kitchen right now. But those items could be used by your young son and daughter to get high. The epidemic is inhalant abuse also called huffing or dusting. It's not new but with more aerosol items available; inhalant abuse is slowly on the rise. A tense game of Jenga for 16 year old Samantha Morris and her parents; "eight months ago Sam would have, instead, gone straight to her room to get high." Samantha Morris, recovering inhalant abuser; "it was an easy high, it was a cheap high, it was a high I liked." That high came from huffing or inhaling aerosol cans three or four times a night. For six months she hid this addiction. What makes it worse, Morris was on a drug recovery program for pot and alcohol. "I wanted to still get high but I wanted to get high off of something that wouldn't show up on a drug test." More than one thousand common household products are considered dangerous if inhaled. It's readily available and cheap. The National Inhalant Prevention Coalition calls "huffing" the Silent Epidemic. According to the National Institute on drug abuse the number of inhalant abuses is increasing from 627 thousand in 1994 to an estimated one million in 2002. Drug experts say the average inhalant abuser is eleven and while pot and alcohol are still the drugs of choice for adolescents, inhalants often follow. Even more frightening, inhalants could kill with one use. It's called Sudden Sniffing Death Syndrome. Claudia Evenson has been an addiction specialist at Rosecrance in Rockford for 26 years. Claudia Evenson, addiction specialist; "the bottom line is the heart stops. Mom and dad don't know what happened and this kid has died from inhalant abuse. Inhalants hit the brain instantly." In 2001, 15 year old David Manlove in Indianapolis died from inhalants. Like Sam, he was recovering from pot and alcohol addiction. Without his parents knowing, David was huffing. At a friend's pool that summer he inhaled dust-off underwater and went

into cardiac arrest. His desire to get high was more powerful than we knew as parents but more importantly, more powerful than he knew. Kim and Marissa Manlove have now dedicated their lives to telling David's story to make other parents aware.

Topic: Collagen Shots

They offer a quick fix when it comes to fighting wrinkles, or so we thought. Now doctors say injectable skin fillers may help erase the signs of aging for good. Muriel Walter didn't want a face lift. But she did want to turn back the hands of time. The line right around the lip was starting to show aging and I wanted to plump it up. Northwestern University doctor Murad Alam used an injectable product known as Restylane to fill the fine lines around Walter's lips. The effect has lasted much longer than either one anticipated. Muriel's long lasting result supports a recent study from University of Michigan scientists who found the hyaluronic acid based product seems to activate the cells that make the key ingredient to a youthful look, collagen. Dr. Murad Alam, Assistant Prof Dermatology, Northwestern University: this is the first study that gives evidence that even though the majority of each of these fillers goes away after a few months a small proportion might remain. That's good news because a typical Restylane treatment costs between five and seven hundred dollars. But doctors say a little injectable goes a long way.

Topic: Sleep Study

In tonight's medical watch, a wake-up call for women when it comes to sleep. A national survey is shedding light on a problem that's keeping more than half of American women up at night. These women aren't alone. In its 2007 "Sleep in America Poll" the National Sleep Foundation found 60% of American women aren't getting the rest they need. Doctors say it's an eye opening revelation. Dr. James Wyatt, Director Sleep Disorders Center, Rush University Medical Center; throughout the life span women's biology sort of puts them at higher risk for having insomnia. And that's from a number of factors, the biology, the busy lives, the propensity to be more susceptible to anxiety and depression that may fuel insomnia. Among those taking the hardest hit, working moms. 72% say they suffer from insomnia like symptoms. Stay at home moms fare even worse. 74% say they struggle to get a good night's sleep.

Topic: Diabetes

When it comes to treating patients with diabetes, caring for the underinsured and those without coverage is a major public health issue. A health system here in Chicagoland is doing its part to connect with communities where diabetes is on the rise. You see amputations, you see renal function failing. Eye disease, heart disease, it's huge. For the uninsured, access offers a sliding scale fee system. Based on a patient's ability to pay for as little as fifteen dollars, patients can see a primary care physician, get lab work done and have regular screenings. It's just a good thing for us to get in front of disease, because that is one of the things I always tell the patient. "Listen, we've diagnosed you with this, let's get in front of it, rather than follow behind it." It is completely treatable and there are a lot of little steps that could help you.

Topic: Titanium Bones

In tonight's medical watch avoiding amputation, a local doctor is offering patients a chance to save their limbs. At just twenty seven years old, Larry Helmer has suffered his share of pain. As a teenager he battled bone cancer in his left leg. He underwent chemotherapy followed by two major surgeries to reconstruct his knee and stabilize his femur. But the pain returned. Orthopedic Surgeon Shawn Palmer offered Larry a chance to save his leg with a total femur replacement. It's a rare and complicated surgery that only a handful of surgeons are willing to perform. What he has is a construct that is made of titanium. It has a hip replacement at the top, the femoral segment made of titanium, and then a new hinged knee replacement at the bottom. Larry Helmer: it's still pretty recent that I had the surgery, 7 weeks or so. I can bend, maneuver, and it's not stopping me. Before I would bend and all of a sudden here would be pain and I'd have to stop. Now it's normal. If this could be the last surgery, that'd be great. Dr. Shawn Palmer: the message to patients is, don't feel like there's nothing that can be done until you have exhausted all your resources of investigating who's available in your community to find out what can be done to help.

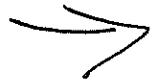

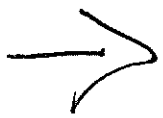

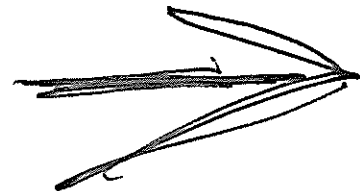
