my right side, and it just stayed there. I couldn't hold myself up in a chair, I just slumped over, and that's when they called for the stroke team.

A team led by Dr. Demetrius Lopes, one of only a handful of neurosurgeons across the country—and the only one in Chicago—who was testing a new device that literally vacuums clots from inside the brain's tiny vessels.

A clot not only blocks blood flow, it blocks the surgeons ability to see the twists and turns a vessel takes beyond the clot. An earlier device used in stroke patients required the surgeon to blindly pass through a clot in order to grab hold.

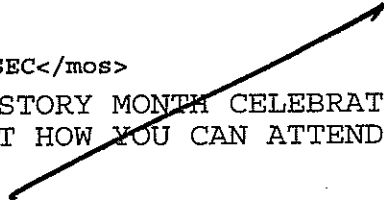
