### CC Covid 19

Late Friday, after declaring a national emergency over the COVID-19 pandemic, President Donald Trump declared Sunday March 15t as a National Day of Prayer.

Friday Alabama Governor Kay Ivey has declared a state of emergency and announced that all K-12 public schools will be closing at the end of the day Wednesday, March 18, 2020, and will reopen Monday, April 6, 2020.

Dr. Eric Mackey, State Superintendent of Education, will continue to work with Governor Ivey's COVID-19 Task Force to evaluate and decide whether continued closure will be needed and will continue to provide necessary updates.

The Alabama State Department of Education will work with state health officials, local districts, and other stakeholders to support local communities with continued planning efforts as the COVID-19 situation evolves in Alabama.

Also, the Alabama State Department of Education has submitted a waiver to the U.S. Department of Agriculture to allow eligible schools to serve drive-through or graband-go meals to qualifying students during this closure. We will provide updates and also work with schools to assist them with those plans.

Parents and guardians should anticipate receiving specific details regarding meal distributions from their local school districts.

We appreciate your collaboration as we work together to deal with this difficult issue.

In East Alabama the Corona Virus holds steady after Calhoun County had its first reported case Wednesday, while reports of the Covid 19 Corona Virus in Alabama continue to grow as the number has risen to 68 positive cases a jump from 51 Wednesday.

That has prompted Alabama Governor Kay Ivey and the ADPH have issued new rules and guidelines in an effort to curb the spread of Covid 19.

## PET SAFETY Covid-19 03-20-2020

### Are our Pets at home safe?

While this virus seems to have emerged from an animal source, it is now spreading from person-to-person in China. There is no reason to think that any animals including pets in the United States might be a source of infection with this new coronavirus. To date, CDC has not received any reports of pets or other animals becoming sick with COVID-19. At this time, there is no evidence that companion animals including pets can spread COVID-19. However, since animals can spread other diseases to people, it's always a good idea to wash your hands after being around animals. ## **Disinfect For Covid 19**

Use diluted household bleach solutions if appropriate for the surface. Check to ensure the product is not past its expiration date. Unexpired household bleach will be effective against coronaviruses when properly diluted.

Follow manufacturer's instructions for application and proper ventilation. Never mix household bleach with ammonia or any other cleanser.

To make a bleach solution, mix:

5 tablespoons (1/3rd cup) bleach per gallon of water

OR

4 teaspoons bleach per quart of water

Alcohol solutions with at least 70% alcohol.

Household cleaners and disinfectants: Clean the area or item with soap and water or another detergent if it is dirty. Then, use a household disinfectant.

Follow the instructions on the label to ensure safe and effective use of the product.

Many products recommend:

Keeping the surface wet for several minutes to ensure germs are killed.

Precautions such as wearing gloves and making sure you have good ventilation during use of the product.

Most EPA-registered household disinfectants external icon should be effective.

# **Covid 19 Corona Virus Factors**

If you have possible or confirmed COVID-19 there is a list of recommendations that can be found on the web at cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019.

Some highlights include...

Stay home from work, school, and away from other public places. If you must go out, avoid using any kind of public transportation, ridesharing, or taxis.

Get rest and stay hydrated.

Cover your cough and sneezes.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or clean your hands with an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

As much as possible, stay in a specific room and away from other people in your home. Also, you should use a separate bathroom, if available. If you need to be around other people in or outside of the home, wear a facemask.

Avoid sharing personal items with other people in your household, like dishes, towels, and bedding

Clean all surfaces that are touched often, like counters, tabletops, and doorknobs. Use household cleaning sprays or wipes according to the label instructions.

If you develop emergency warning signs for COVID-19 get medical attention immediately. Emergency warning signs include\*:

**Trouble breathing** 

Persistent pain or pressure in the chest

New confusion or inability to arouse

Bluish lips or face
