**02-01-02 Old Man Winter Might Bring Some Snow...Might**

Meanwhile just before 2pm this afternoon the Clay County Schools announced that they would be delaying school Tuesday by two hours.

**01-19-15 Anniston Police Chief Holds Press Conference**

**This Morning Anniston Police Chief Shane Denham held a press conference to discuss a shooting that occurred Friday night in the Saks community that left one man dead, and another man injured.**

**And another man on paid leave.**

**At the briefing Chief Denham outlined why Anniston PD chose to contact the State Bureau of Investigation**

**Chief Denham also said that Friday night when Anniston police responded to a call at around 9:30 p.m. of gunfire in the neighborhood, and officers found 42-year-old Deatrice Marquiste Barclay dead just steps from his front door.**

**Barclay was pronounced dead by Calhoun County Coroner Pat Brown at 10:27pm.**

**Denham declined to give details about the shooting because he passed the case to the State Bureau of Investigations but did give some clarification as 23 year old Joel Evan Abbott who was also seriously injured in an apparent shootout, was not the city jailer who has been placed on paid leave pending the outcome of the investigation.**

**Chief Denham said the case is now in the hands of state investigators, and said all other details will have to come from them.**

**The State Bureau of Investigations continues**

**No arrests have been made in the case.**

**Jacksonville State University will inaugurate John M. Beehler as its 12th president during an investiture ceremony on April 8th, 10 a.m., at Pete Mathews Coliseum.**

**The theme for the event is "Transformative, Innovative and Engaged for Success: The T.I.E.S. that bind the university together.**

**Beehler, who was hired last year, began serving as university president on July 1st.**

**The inauguration day schedule will begin at 10 a.m. with the investiture ceremony, which will be followed by an inaugural reception on the fifth floor of Meehan Hall, from 12 to 2 p.m. From 2:30 to 4:30 p.m., there will be an open house at the President's Home.**

## **03-23-16 Talladega Forest Wildfire Under Control**

**Tuesday, U.S. Forest Service crews continued to fight a wildfire, which closed two trails and a road, in the south portion of the Cheaha Wilderness, according to officials.**

**The High Falls Trailhead, National Forest System Road 650 and portions of the Odum Trail are closed as a team from Asheville, North Carolina, and Talladega National Forest employees attempt to put out the estimated 154-acre fire.**

**Crews used natural barriers, such as streams, along with other tactics to manage the wildfire with the least impact to natural resources and wilderness values.**

**Officials with the fire management office spotted the smoke Sunday around 3:30 p.m. and reported it.**

**And at this time they are not sure of what might have caused the wildfire.**

**A news release sent by the Forest Service stated crews were using "minimum impact suppression tactics" with the natural topography to manage the wildfire.**

**Crews are using existing trails and streams to create fire lines to keep the fire from growing.**

**While Heard said there's no threat to homes, the release advised residents near the fire to stay indoors, avoid exercising outside and limit driving.**

**Firefighters hope to have the wildfire extinguished by Thursday.**

**Rainfall is expected Thursday.**

## **03-23-16 Georgia Officials Give More Info In Search For ID Of Dead Man**

**Authorities with the Georgia Bureau of Investigation have released more information concerning the body of an unidentified man who's body was found near the Alabama/Georgia line last Thursday.**

**The body of a white male suspected homicide victim was found on U.S. 78 about 7 p.m. two to three miles from the state line in Haralson County, which borders Cleburne County in Alabama.**

**The man's body is described as being between 40 to 50 years of age, 5 feet 10 to 6 feet tall, medium to heavy build with short dark colored hair.**

**Authorities believe the man had been deceased for about two to three days before he was discovered and also believe that he was killed at another location and was taken to where he was found.**

**Investigators now say the body had three tattoos - two on his calf which read "CARNEY" and "TO THINE OWN SELF BE TRUE." and Another, which was shown in a previous photo, reads "AURORA."**
