**And in Montgomery, the March deadline to register and pay property taxes on motor vehicles has been extended through Friday, April 13th, for vehicle owners residing in counties included in the recent State of Emergency issued by Gov. Kay Ivey.**

**The extension applies to residents in Calhoun, Cleburne, Etowah, Clay, Talladega and St. Clair Counties.**

**On March 30, the Alabama Department of Revenue issued a proclamation declaring the extension as a result of the severe weather March 19.**

***As the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention say that Indians based Caito Foods LLC has recalled packages of pre-cut watermelon, honeydew melon, cantaloupe and fresh-cut medley products after people reported feeling sick.***

***Recalled products were distributed in Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Missouri, North Carolina, and Ohio.***

***The CDC is investigating to determine if products were sold to additional stores or states***

***The fruits were sold in clear, plastic clamshell container***

***Officials urging people to throw out pre-cut melon sold within in recalled area.***

***Retailers are advised not sell or serve recalled pre-cut melon products distributed by Caito Foods Distribution, Gordon Food Service, and SpartanNash Distribution.***
