Despite the good news, experts are still taking some precautions. Because while the numbers are headed in the right direction, roughly 100,000 Americans are still being infected with Covid-19 every week, and more than 150 are dying from the infection every day. From June 1 to November 30, the Atlantic hurricane season extends, although you will not see major storms. At the same time, it occurs in the Eastern Pacific, affecting Hawaii and the Pacific coast of Mexico. In these seasons, there are things you should know to be prevented Naloxone is sold under various brands including Narcan. Last spring, a statewide law allowed for broader access to emergency treatment for opioid overdose, a phenomenon that's become increasingly common in Florida. All 67 counties in Florida now have naloxone available for distribution. Heart disease is the second leading cause of death in Hispanic women, just behind cancer.
