****From Logan City:** Beginning this week and into the future waste and recycling routes for those in Logan city service areas will change. **Waste will still be collected on the same day**, but garbage, recycling, and green waste cans **may be picked up earlier or later than residents are used to**. During this transition, it is very important to make sure your cans are set out to the curb before 7 am for collection.

****MAJOR ROAD CLOSURE – 1400 North between 550 – 600 West is CLOSED** to complete widening of the roadway, the railroad crossing, sidewalks and traffic signals. The closure is expected to last through August. **1400 North between 600 – 1000 West will be OPEN to traffic as well as northbound and southbound traffic on 600 West**. The closure will only affect the east leg of the intersection. Please use alternate routes.

****Firework Restrictions In Effect.** Fireworks **may be lit** in **UNRESTRICTED** areas from 11am until 11pm July 2-5 and July 22-24 and until midnight on July 4 and 24. Fireworks are never allowed in restricted areas. Description of **Restricted Areas** for 2023: **East side-** East side of 1200 East from the north city boundary to Hwy 89./ South side of Hwy 89, from 1200 East to 600 East, then the north side of Canyon Road from 600 East to Crockett Avenue./ East side of Crockett Avenue from Canyon Road to Riverside Drive, continuing the east side of Riverside Drive to Mountain Road, continuing the east side of the Logan River to Stewart Nature Park./ The north and east side of the Logan City boundary from Stewart Nature Park to the southern city boundary. **West side** - West side of 600 West from the north city boundary to 200 South. North side of 200 South from 600 West to 1000 West. West side of 1000 West from 200 South to the south city boundary.
