- **Logan City's Winter Parking Ordinance is now in effect. This means NO Overnight parking is allowed between the hours of 12 midnight and 6a.m. from now until March 15th on city streets. This is to allow snow plows to remove snow more safely and efficiently.
- **Richmond's Winter Parking Ordinance is now in effect: It shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of any motor vehicle, or any vehicle towed, pulled, or otherwise associated with motor vehicles, to park such a vehicle on any street or road of Richmond City between ten (10) p.m. and seven (7) a.m. between November 1st and March 31st. Drivers may park for no longer than five (5) minutes in the event of loading or unloading passengers only if the vehicle is plainly marked with operating four-way flashing lights. Vehicles loading or unloading property at a commercial facility may park up to a maximum of thirty (30) minutes only if the vehicle is plainly marked with operating four-way flashing lights and active loading or unloading is taking place.
