Quarterly Children's Television Programming Reports Clarification

As noted in the Core Programming Processing Guidelines Certification Exhibit attached to the Station's 303-S filed March 31, 2022, the station can confirm that it aired at least three hours per week on each of its main and multicast streams and uploaded all children's television programming reports on a timely basis from the third quarter of 2014 through the annual children's programming report covering December 31, 2020, through December 31, 2021.

While preparing the Station's 303-S License Renewal Application, we noted that for the question concerning preempted programming, "Is the rescheduled date the second home?," the station answered "no" in every instance in its Quarterly Children's Programming Reports from the third quarter of 2014 through the third quarter of 2019 (the last report on which the Commission asked this question). This practice was based on a misunderstanding by the station regarding the rescheduling of preempted programming. The station did air many of its preemption make-goods in a primary second home. In instances where the primary second home was also preempted or otherwise unavailable, the program preemption was made good in an alternate second home, with the required prior promotion.

Station takes seriously its children's television programming obligations and has reviewed the requirements with outside counsel to ensure future reports are completed properly.
