City officials say dumping in the northern part of town is a huge problem. Surveillance stations have been set up and police say they aren't just giving out citations and warnings but they are making actual arrests.</p> <p>A new program is being tried out in El Paso in dealing with asylum seekers. The pilot program — known as Prompt Asylum Claim Review — streamlines the asylum process so that migrants who are seeking safe refuge in the United States will receive a decision in 10 days or less, rather than the months or years it currently takes, according to Customs and Border Protection officials. The reviews are largely to determine if Central American migrants can be sent back to their homelands.</p> <p>The city of McAllen Census Complete Count Committee, or McAllen CCCC, and Workforce Solutions are looking to hire workers for the upcoming 2020 Census. They plan on hosting 48 recruiting events throughout the Rio Grande Valley in the coming weeks, including a job fair from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Saturday at the McAllen Public Library.</p> <p>This weekend is the National Prescription Drug Take-Back Saturday. There are numerous drop off locations throughout the Valley for you to safely get rid of old and expired prescription drugs. One such location for the drug take back is 10am to 2pm near the food court at the Valley Vista Mall.</p> <p>The USMCA, the trade deal that will replace the North American Free Trade Agreement, has been signed by the leaders of all three countries and was ratified by Mexico last summer. It awaits its final drafting with provisions from Congress so it can be put on the floor for a vote, then implemented. The Texas delegation is pushing for a vote but a major concern Representative Vincente Gonzalez of McAllen has is security along the trucking route in Mexico. He says security needs to be part of the deal.</p> <p>A man is custody after putting utility workers in danger on South Padre Island. The man drove his vehicle into a cable that knocked over AEP workers who are replacing the transmission poles damaged in Sunday night's storm. The workers will be okay.</p> <p>The jobless rate in the Brownsville-Harlingen Metropolitan Statistical Area dropped nearly a half- point in September, dipping to 5.2 percent from 5.6 percent in August. In the McAllen-Edinburg- Mission market, the jobless rate for September did show a half-point drop to 5.9 percent from 6.4 percent in August. The Texas jobless rate is 3.4-percent.</p>

Jason Clark, owner of Pioneer Auction Service, said, 'Before the auction started we were handed a letter and asked if we would sell this young ladys hog that was overweight and she was going to take the proceeds and give it to her cousin which was a young mother of four and just got diagnosed with stage 4 stomach cancer' Jason said a prayer and hoped it would turn out good for the young lady.</p> <p>When the time came to sell the 'benefit hog', she stepped into the ring with a picture of her hog. According to research published in the Journal of the Institute of Archaeology of Tel Aviv University, the more than 100 coins found beneath the ancient road prove it must have been completed between 31 and 40 [AD], a period mostly covered by Pilates governorship.

The total for October was 45,250 apprehensions. And, for the first time in more than a year, the majority of the people apprehended were from Mexico and not Central American countries such as Honduras, Guatemala and El Salvador.</p> <p>According to the report from the Department of Homeland Security, the Rio Grande Valley continued last month to be the top entry point for undocumented immigrants. About 9,750 migrants were apprehended between the ports of entry in that sector last month.</p> <p>The cold weather we had this week has a negative impact on sea turtles. More than 200 sea turtles have been rescued in the past two days. Crews with Sea Turtle Inc. are back out today looking for more of the cold-stunned turtles. If you happen to come across a turtle just floating in the water or not moving on the shore, call Sea Turtle Inc. at 956-243-4361.</p> <p>The University of Texas System approved an across-the-board tuition hike of 2.6% for its eight academic campuses, amounting to a \$290-a-year increase for in-state, undergraduate students at its flagship university in 2020 and 2021. The Texas A&M University System has also approved a rate increase that mirrors the one passed Thursday by the UT System.</p> <p>Questions are being raised about how long it took to get a baby to a critical care center when the child fell ill at an immigration camp. The baby and family were at a tent city</p>

				<p>near the Gateway International Bridge. Doctors agreed the child needed urgent care. However, an immigration attorney says the parents had to wait approximately three hours for Customs and Border Protection to allow them into the U.S. to seek emergency care.</p> <p>Plenty of changes at Edinburg City Hall. New councilmember David White was sworn in. Shortly after that, multiple city officials were fired including the city manager, city secretary and others. Five of six board members were replaced on the economic development board. Costco says the coupon is a fake.</p> <p>Dean Foods is filing for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection, in part because consumers aren't drinking milk the way they have in the past. The company, the largest milk producer in the U.S., says rising debt and declining sales are forcing it to turn to bankruptcy.</p>

Not thinking much of it, he turned left when his light turned green.</p> <p>But when he saw the car make a U-turn and come barreling back toward a crowd of pedestrians and construction workers at the intersection, he made a heat of the moment decision. 'I didnt want him to hurt anybody' Marciano told CBC. 'I figured, sacrificing a car was really no big deal. And thats what I did' Marciano drove his SUV over the median blocking the lane in front of the speeding car. The car slammed into the</p>

				<p>passenger side of his SUV. Only the suspect was injured. Now, police are hailing Marciano as a hero for protecting the dozen or so pedestrians who were in harms way. Marciano said the intersection was busy with people going to the nearby CHUM hospital, workers out on their lunch break and ever-present construction workers.</p> <p>'It came into my mind, I said: 'this isnt going to happen here' he said. Marciano said he wasn't thinking about his own safety in the moment, but was confident his truck could take the hit.</p> <p>Police arrested the 19-year-old driver at the scene on multiple charges, including impaired driving and driving a stolen vehicle. Though Marcianos SUV was heavily damaged in the collision, his insurance company told him they were not holding him responsible for the crash.</p>

Gallup found that 87 percent of respondents replied positively when asked "Do you believe in God?" When the question was rephrased — in this case, poll subjects were asked if God was "something you believe in?" — that number dropped to 79 percent. Still lower was the number of respondents who said that they believed in God when asked if they were "convinced that God exists." Just 64 percent of respondents said yes, down from 79 percent in 2005.</p> <p>The faith-based film Overcomer stayed in the Top 5 for three weekends and grossed \$34.6 million, but its director says the lives it helped change is more worthy of celebration. The Kendrick Brothers film opened in theaters in August and will release to home video in the coming weeks – on digital platforms Nov. 26 and on Blu-ray and DVD Dec. 17. The report was issued by a group called Human Rights First. The MPP program is currently under review by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in California and has been allowed to continue while the case is pending.</p> <p>Due to the continued violence in Mexico and the theft of</p>

cargo from trucks, two local Congressman are asking House Speaker Nancy Pelosi to insure that Mexico promises to increase security along the routes that trucks travel as part of the new NAFTA agreement. The two congressmen say they want a firm commitment from the Mexican government to guarantee the protection of highways between the United States and Mexico used for trade and tourism.

Early voting for runoff elections in Edinburg and La Joya ends today. This is the last day for early voting. The election will be December 10th. Early voting ended on Tuesday for the runoff election in Alamo. That election is this Saturday.

The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley received close to \$400,000 in two federal grants for programs that research and aid rural businesses throughout South Texas. One grant will provide targeted technical assistance to socially disadvantaged groups. The other grant will support the Texas Rural Cooperative Center, which guides rural businesses and cooperatives in South Texas with startup, expansion and operational improvements.

The poem was about life, and getting old, and losing friends — and it made Weisbord want to sing. Weisbord, who grew up playing piano, decided to set it to music as a surprise gift for Tripps 100th birthday. Listening to Weisbord perform his words on the piano sparked the idea for an album.</p> <p>'I spent my entire life time wanting to become a songwriter, and at 102, I thought, Why not finally do it' Tripp told People. Over the course of two years, they spent several hours each week testing melodies and writing lyrics. They would meet in the morning and sit at the grand piano in Weisbords apartment.
