

QUARTERLY REPORT #1 for 2017

Jan 1, 2017 to March 31, 2017

During the last quarter we forgot to mention that HC&S held its final harvest. We did an in depth video series dedicated to the closure of the mill and the end of an era on Maui. Maui Mayor Alan Arkawa also comes under fire for making comments about rocks in Iao Valley saying there are no sacred rocks. His comments drew a protest outside of his state of the county address, which we covered. During that event, he also came under fire for announcing the proposed closure of the Waiehu Municipal Golf Course in Wailuku. In crime headlines, a Lahaina man and woman were arrested and charged for allegedly kidnapping a California couple at Nakalele Point and holding them captive while making several stops in Central Maui. Surveillance was released of one particular stop at the Maui Lani Longs, leading to the arrest of the woman suspect. The male suspect was arrested in the following weeks. Our ongoing coverage of the Capobianco trial continued as he was sentenced to life in prison, and a request for a new trial was denied.

Also of interest was Hawaii's response to the #boycotthawaii hashtag that became a trending item on twitter after Hawaii challenged Trump's travel ban. And locally, we got news of the closure of Kmart, and broke the story of Savers closing in Kahului. And at Haleakala, the famed sunrise viewing becomes so popular that the NPS implements an online reservation system.
