

**STATEMENT CONCERNING BROADCAST OF
POST-FILING ANNOUNCEMENT**

On January 31, 2005, Stations WQTO and WMTJ were granted licenses by the Federal Communications Commission to serve the public interest as a public trustee until February 1, 2013. Our licenses will expire on February 1, 2013. We have filed applications for license renewal with the FCC. Copy of these applications are available for public inspection during our regular business hours. They contain information concerning each station's performance during the last eight years.
