Section 1: issues and concerns in the Kansas City area:

- **(KCJK-FM)** During Q3 of 2023, 105-1 The X was actively soliciting through both live and recorded on-air mentions, web graphics, and social media posts.

(KCJK-FM On Air Mentions)

July 20th, 1:35pm – During 105-1 The X Undercover, Joel acknowledged the late Chris Cornell’s birthday and the death of Chester Bennington on that day in 2017. Both men died by suicide. Joel plugged the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 988 for anyone feeling hopeless or down.

July 21st, 1;47pm – Joel spoke with a caller on-air who was feeling bad, and hoped we would announce a plug for the Lifeline at 988 in order to put that energy into something positive to help others.

August 17th, 1:33pm – Joel plugged the 988 Lifeline during 105-1 The X Undercover while discussing Depeche Mode frontman Dave Gahan’s suicide attempt on this day in 1995.

August 18th, 1:39pm – Joel mentioned the heat wave that starts tomorrow and will likely last through Thursday with highs approaching triple digit temperatures and heat indexes well above 100 degrees. Listeners were advised to find shade, hydration, air conditioning, cooling centers, and to check on loved ones over the next week.

August 18th, 4:53pm – Jaye mentioned cooling centers were available and where to locate them for the weekend heat wave

August 19th, 5:15 pm—Cassie talked about cooling centers and where to find them

August 20th, 11:20am – Cassie talked about cooling centers and where to find them.

August 24th, 11:07am – Joel mentioned that even though the public school year just started, about two dozen Kansas City Public Schools opted for early release this week because their air conditioning systems can’t keep up with the heat wave. Additionally, the Kansas University Jayhawks football kickoff celebration this Friday was also cancelled out of safety concerns.

August 29th, 1:08pm – Joel reminded listeners that Missouri’s new hands-free mobile phone law went into effect yesterday. Any mobile phone use while driving is a secondary violation and subject to a \$150 fine for the first offense. However, Missouri Highway Patrol notes they will focus on education rather than fines until January 2025.

September 6th, 10:08am and 11:15am – Joel reported that Metallica frontman James Hetfield tested positive for covid over the weekend. Joel also added that in his capacity as music director and working with record labels and music promoters, he's in contact with many people who travel for work who seem to be contracting covid more often lately. Joel added he's thinking about sacrificing a weekend to get a flu shot and a covid booster.
