## PSO Deploys to Hurricane Michael

The Public Service Company of Oklahoma joined members of the Grand River Dam Authority in Florida to help clean up in the aftermath of Hurricane Michael. PSO's McAlester Response Team arrived in Pensacola and have also stationed a crew in Panama City, just past the devastation on Mexico Beach. PSO sent a total of 120 employees and contractors.

## Earthquakes Shake Oklahoma

Oklahoma was rattled by another earthquake today. According to the US Geological Society, a magnitude 3.1 earthquake struck near Wilson, Oklahoma at 7:47am. Thousands of earthquakes have been recorded in Oklahoma in recent years, many of which have been linked to the underground injection of wastewater from oil and natural gas production. Oil and gas operators have been directed to close some of the injection sites and reduce volume in others.

## Weather Impacts Local Pecan Harvesters

The Flying G Ranch is in great shape for harvesting a bumper crop of pecans this year thanks to this year's rainfall amounts, but the owner, Mike Sprading says the demand for pecans is higher than ever. Hurricane Michael took out one of Georgia's largest crops in years, with one farmer estimating he lost 4000 trees alone. Flooding in central Texas has also impacted their pecan crops. Pecan orchards are placed in low lying areas near water for better soil and access to irrigation, but that also puts them at higher risk for flooding and washing the pecans away.

## Tulsa Fire Asks Residents to Prep for Cold

Emergency personnel around the Tulsa Metro have already prepared for the cold and they've taken dozens of cold weather-related calls. Tulsa Fire responded to 57 fires around the area during the last two weeks of October. Fire Captain Chad Martin said most were related to space heaters. Martin said to make sure your space heaters are plugged into the wall and not an extension cord to cut down on fires. He also said to keep your floor furnaces clear when you turn them on for the winter. The number one way to keep your home safe is to make sure your smoke detectors are working properly. With the possibility of snow on the way, firefighters also advise on taking it slow on the roads.

#### Winterfest Forced to Close due to Severe Weather Threat

Although cooler temperatures are best for the 9,000 square foot ice rink in the heart of downtown, Friday's weather shouldn't ruin the ice.

## December Tornado Rips Through Eastern Oklahoma

FOX23 Meteorologist Laura Mock took the Skyview Drone to survey damage tonight after a rare December tornado struck in Cherokee County. The survey started near Gore, where there were several homes with torn off roofs. To the north in Blackgum, the community was gathered cleaning up some of the worst damage Mock saw. The National Weather Service is working to rate the storm from Friday night, but unfinished roads and different building construction types made it tough. The total damage path is estimated to be about 65 miles long. Not only does the NWS need to continue to survey the rest of the damage path, but they will also be checking other areas that were tornado warned on Friday.

#### Lake Tenkiller Suffers Direct Hit from Tornado

A rare December tornado touched down in Cherokee county last night with Snake Creek Marina on lake Tenkiller bearing the brunt of the damage. Early estimates report around 200 boats gone, and the whole marina is destroyed. A 40-foot house boat is almost completely sunk, a brand new 80,000-dollar pontoon was washed ashore, and metal and concrete from hundreds of boat slips were scattered on top of boats. Only a few boats survived the tornado. This is the third storm to destroy Snake Creek Marina, but none of them were this bad. Johnny Houston said his boat survived the last two storms but wasn't as fortunate last night. He believes last night's storm is the last straw for people who dock their boats at Snake Creek Marina. Houston lives on the hill above the marina where there is damage to several homes. He said his family didn't have time to seek shelter but he's thankful the tornado passed by his house.

#### Chicken Creek Area Destroyed

The Chicken Creek area of Cherokee county was also devastated by an EF-2 tornado that blew through the area last night. Several power lines are down, trees are uprooted, and there was just a general mess of debris everywhere. The residents who have damaged homes will be rebuilding for quite some time.

## **Group Approves Medical Marijuana Labeling and Testing Rules**

A medical marijuana group has unanimously approved Oklahoma's medical labeling and testing rules for medicinal marijuana. The measure will now to go the State Department of Health. Some of the proposed requirements will include labels with the harvest date, name of the grower, the THC level, and the name of the lab that tested the product. The group says it's an effort to keep the public safe from pesticides and other hazardous substances. If approved, the requirement will go into effect in May.

Goins said the majority of people that are taking the classes are disabled veterans who have PTSD or permanent pain from injuries. Younger people suffering from epilepsy and Parkinson's disease are also in attendance. Goins wants people to remember that marijuana is a medicine, and can be a safer alternative to other drugs.

#### Flu Blamed for Another Death in Oklahoma

State health officials say that another person has died from the flu in Oklahoma. That brings the number of flu deaths this season to 4 statewide. Doctors typically see most flu cases from December through February. In the past week, 17 people were hospitalized because of the flu for a total of 112 since September. The elderly is particularly at risk. Doctors say the flu shot remains your best protection against the flu.

## Students Head Back After CO Leak

The district has not installed carbon monoxide detectors, and the school passed inspection and got the approval to reopen tomorrow.

location. Charges were also filed for assaulting the guard. She finally turned herself in on that warrant today.

## **Thieves Target New Construction Sites**

Someone inside the car grabs the satchel, but Cook was unwilling to let go, fell, and was dragged a few feet as the SUV took off. Cook's homicide is one of just four that remain unsolved in 2018. Sergeant Brandon Watkins says they are making good headway in each of those cases.
