Winterfest Preps for Opening

Arvest Winterfest opens tomorrow, and it's all hands on deck getting the rink ready for public use. It takes 15 truckloads of sand, 13 miles of tubing, and 300 tons of refrigerant are needed to make the Winterfest ice rink a reality. Crews have been working for two weeks to get the rink ready, flooding it with water so it can start to freeze. The rain recently has caused a minor setback, but it's wind that really causes headaches because the friction of the wind on the ice will melt it. At 9000 square feet, the rink is one of the largest public rinks in the country, something that the Winterfest organizers take great pride in. Organizers also say the light reflected off the BOK melts the ice, along with direct sunlight. Winterfest runs from this Saturday all the way through January 5th, 2020.

Vaping Lung Injury Cases Reported

The Oklahoma Health Department reports three more cases in the last week of severe lung injury linked to vaping. Across the country, the increase is 275 for a total of nearly 1100 cases in 48 states. Patients report a history of vaping and suffer from what looks like pneumonia. They struggle to get enough air in their lungs, and many end up in intensive care.

Women in Recovery Celebrates 10 Years

Family and Children's Services runs the Women in Recovery program for incarcerated women to help give them a new trajectory on life, addiction, and trauma. The program also helps mother reunify with their children. Through the program, Mimi Tarrasch says they've been able to impact more than 1700 children since starting Women in Recovery by helping women break a cycle of incarceration, often caused by trauma and drug addiction. Since starting the program a decade ago, they've been able to decrease the number of women incarcerated in Tulsa County. The program also says they've helped save the state more than 25 million dollars.

Medicaid Expansion Signatures Gathered

The group behind a petition to put Medicaid expansion in Oklahoma on the November ballot next year has turned in their signatures today. They needed about 178 thousand signatures to put State Question 802 before voters. Supporters say they got more than 300 thousand signatures. The measure would expand Medicaid for certain low-income adults from 18 to 65 whose income does not exceed 133% of the federal poverty level.

Veteran Awarded High School Diploma

A 95-year-old WWII veteran got the chance to feel like a high schooler again. Lewie Shaw got his high school diploma from Claremore High School today. Mr. Shaw attended Alluwe High in Nowata County back in the 40s but was drafted for WWII before he could graduate. Today, Shaw accepted his diploma in the same military uniform he was giving in 1943, in front of a huge crowd. He was able to receive his diploma today thanks to a law passed in 2001 that cleared the way to give diplomas to veterans of World War 2 and the Vietnam war.

TPS Students Learn about Farm to Table

They will learn how local farmers grow fruits and vegetables as well as how dairy farms work. At the end, students will get to take home a starter vegetable plant.

Flu Numbers Updated

The state health department says 16 new people were hospitalized with the flu in the last week. That brings the total number of hospitalizations to 90 since September 1st. More than 50% of those people were older than 65. Here in Tulsa County, 32 people have ended up in the hospital. Flu shots are still available at the Tulsa Health Department and local pharmacies.

Another person has died from the flu in Oklahoma. State health officials say this involved a patient in northwest Oklahoma. That brings the total number of flu deaths this season statewide to 4, including one in Tulsa county. All of those patients were at least 50 years old. It's not too late to get the flu shot, but officials warn it can take two weeks for the flu shot to take full effect.

Schools Invest in Smart Thermometers

Parents take the thermometers home and in conjunction with a special app, they then enter their child's temperature and symptoms. Mayor Encourages Vote for Improve our Tulsa Plan

Mayor GT Bynum is encouraging Tulsans to vote on the Improve our Tulsa package on November 12th. About two thirds of the 639 million dollars of the package focuses on improving and rehabbing streets and bridges, maintaining sidewalks, traffic engineering, bicycle improvements, and transportation infrastructure. The rest of the money would go toward parks and recreation, replacing a police helicopter, more fire equipment, and economic development infrastructure. Taxes will not go up with this package, it's a six-year extension of the third penny sales tax and general bond program funded through property taxes. The mayor says more than anything, we need street improvements.

River Parks Unveils Turkey Mountain Expansion Plan

The plan also includes an expansion, acquiring surrounding land to bring more park entrances, parking and a variety of new programming opportunities. Trail users say they're excited to see what changes are in the future for this more than 600-acre park.

Tulsa police have arrested a man after an investigation involving shots fired last week at a woman and her two children. Officer Jeanne Pierce says the woman passed the suspect, Demarco Releford, while she was driving near 42nd and north Harvard with her children. He started following her, then passed in front of her and when she saw him standing on the corner, she yelled at him to go away. That's when police say he pulled a gun and began shooting into her vehicle. The woman fled to a nearby family member's house and thankfully, no one was hurt.

Deadly Stabbing Downtown

Tulsa police arrested Lance Gatzman today, accused of attacking a young man and stabbing him in the chest outside of Youth Services of Tulsa in downtown Tulsa. Officers say the two young men got in a fight over a bicycle. Youth Services of Tulsa is an organization that for 50 years has worked to help Tulsa's youth meet their full potential, but today they had to witness a terrible scene. Homicide Sergeant Brandon Watkins says the witnesses tried to break the fight up, but it didn't work and Gatzman pulled out a knife. Officers say Gatzman took off but didn't get far. Youth Services says they are heartbroken, and they are focusing on their youth and staff right now.

Marshal Involved Shootings

Tahlequah Police Chief Nate King was among the group of officers that entered an apartment in Tahlequah after a call from a woman who says 37-year-old Eddie Maxwell tried to shoot her after he shot her sister, 40 year old Rachel Maxwell in the head. Police say Eddie was sitting in the living room when they arrived with a gun, refusing to follow their commands. The Cherokee National Marshal Service SWAT team entered to take over for Tahlequah PD and one of the Marshals fired shots, killing Eddie. Rachel was found dead inside the apartment as well. Police say the shooting was captured on body cam video and they will be releasing it before November 12th.

Gas Station Robbed in Midtown

Officers say an oddly dressed suspect walked was to blame for an armed robbery in Tulsa near 51st and Yale. They say the suspect was wearing a wig, tights, makeup, a women's scarf and possibly discarded a bra in the street. Lt Brian Blair from the Tulsa Police Department says their suspect ran out of the doors with money in hand, and officers arrived shortly after to search the area. Police say the suspect matches a description from an armed robbery just last week at a similar business near 41st and Sheridan. They are currently waiting for surveillance video

Police Investigate String of Storage Break-ins

Tulsa Police are investigating break-ins at 50 storage units. At least 50 storage units were broken into and hundreds of items ransacked and left out in the rain at Quality Storages near 21st and Sheridan. Officials believe most of the theft here has been happening over the last couple of weeks. Police say the property owner is partly to blame for the crime, because several fences are down, and the property manager says he is only on site once a day. Officials say people renting units here have been making monthly payments as usual, not aware that the items they thought were secure here were not secure at all.

Man Arrested at Hard Rock

Catoosa Police said they have arrested Rodney Rodriguez in the parking lot of the Hard Rock Hotel and Casino tonight after he attacked a stranger in the hotel elevator. They say by the time officers arrived, the suspect had made his way to the parking lot and noticed an employee getting into her car. He walked over to her and tried to pull her out of the car several times to carjack her, but she was able to get away and drive off. When police arrived, they said Rodriguez refused to listen to commands, even after officers tased him. After a struggle in which Rodriguez tried to bite officers, they were finally able to subdue him and put him in a cruiser. Police say Rodriguez is facing multiple charges, but that his actions may have been the result of meth.

Broken Arrow Police arrested a man they say was posing as a police officer tonight and making traffic stops. Police say a victim pulled into a gas station on Tuesday night and a vehicle followed him in, blocking his car from leaving. The car was a white Ford Explorer, similar to a police unit. The man approached the victim and told him he was speeding and identified himself as a police officer. He left after talking to the victim, but a few hours later the victim spotted him again and called the real police. Officers showed up and found the suspect hiding behind a dumpster. Police say they will rarely pull over people in unmarked units and if they do, they will always be wearing a BAPD uniform.

Sequoyah County deputies arrested a Sallisaw teacher accused of sleeping with her students. 29-year-old Brandy Foreman is charged with four counts of sexual battery. Investigators say the Central Public Schools teacher admitted to having sex with at least two teenage students on multiple occasions from 2017 to 2019. The school's website also has Foreman listed as a cheer coach.
