Strong Winds, Cooler Temperatures Across Green Country

Tulsa's First Ozone Alert Day of 2022 Issued

FOX23 Investigates Lack of Street Lights Across Tulsa

Green Country drivers have reported outages of streetlights across Tulsa, including lights on Interstate 44. The outages create dangerous roads for drivers at night. The City of Tulsa responded to our claims, saying the lights could be out due to a shortage, a burned-out lamp, vandalism, or a pole was knocked down during a crash.

Broken Arrow Creates Advisory Panel to Address Population Boom

The City of Broken Arrow has created an advisory panel to study possible redistricting options for the City Council. Broken Arrow's population grew 15 percent according to the 2020 Census. The panel's findings will present their ideas to the City Council for a vote. That vote is expected to take place later this year.

Oklahoma Lawmakers Pass Major Financial Incentive for Companies, Aims to Impact Green Country

The Oklahoma House of Representatives has passed a massive financial incentive package that would attract out-of-state businesses. House Bill 4455, also known as "The Lead Act," offers tax incentives to build factories and facilities in Oklahoma. The incentives, with a price tag of \$698 million dollars, is expected to pass through the Oklahoma Senate.

Google Announces Multi-Million Dollar Investment in Pryor

Google has announced plans for a multi-million-dollar investment at its data center in Pryor. The \$75 million dollar investment will bring more jobs to the facility, which is Google's second largest data center in the world. The facility, at Pryor's Mid-America Industrial Park, will allow continued growth in Mayes County.

Oklahoma's Grocery Sales Tax Hangs in the Balance

Earlier this year, Oklahoma Governor Kevin Stitt proposed cutting the grocery tax to help Oklahomans battle inflation. Members of the House of Representatives voted to repeal the tax, but the Senate did not. If the tax is repealed, Oklahomans would still pay grocery taxes to local municipalities.

OG&E Customers Ask Company to Reject Proposed Rate Hike

Construction Begins on Highway 169 Project in Owasso

City of Tulsa Hosts Amnesty Program

Oklahoma Governor Signs Bill, Closes Loophole Allowing College Professors, Students to Have Relationships

New Details Released Involving Indian Boarding Schools, Victims Break Silence

Jury Selection Begins for Man Accused of Shooting, Killing Tulsa Police Officer

Jury selection has begun for David Ware, the man accused of shooting two Tulsa police officers in June 2020, killing one of them. Tulsa County District Attorney Steve Kunzweiler is aiming for the death penalty in Ware's case. Sergeant Craig Johnson died from his injuries; Officer Aurash Zarkeshan survived.

Bartlesville Man Arrested, Accused of Stabbing Three Family Members

A Bartlesville man has been arrested, accused of stabbing three family members. The suspect's mother did not survive her injuries, but his sister and uncle recovered. Woman Shot, Killed While Trying to Calm Armed Man in Tulsa

Man Dies from His Injuries 16 Years Later, Police Investigate as Homicide

Man Nearly Runs Over Tulsa Police Officer, Suspect in Custody

Four People Killed During Mass Shooting at the Natalie Medical Building

Police Search for a Suspect After a Police Chase Enters the Tulsa Area
