Weather

Northern Counties See Snow

The store is small at just 200 square feet, but that's all residents need to make a difference at the senior living facility nearby. Residents at the facility are limited because they can't drive and there aren't many stores in the area that are easy to walk to. After speaking with the owners of the Pythian Manor and receiving a grant from Humana, the Healthy Community Store Initiative set up the Pythian Market and have seen sales go up about 136%.

Right now there are more than 1000 dispensaries for medical marijuana in Oklahoma but a few are being called into question for how close they are to schools. Ivy League Cannabis in Moore recently received complaints that it doesn't meet the required thousand-foot distance from Vista Academy, an alternative school in the Moore District. The Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Association uses a tight measurement system and they have a national mapping program they recommend to find nearby schools. OMMA says they have yet to make a decision one way or another on a situation like this.

An Oklahoma organization dedicated to helping people after natural disasters are now victims themselves. Kevin Trimmel is one of the many volunteers with Oklahoma Large Animal First Responders, a nonprofit formed after the 2013 Moore tornado. Trimmel says someone broke into their rescue trailer, stole all their equipment specifically for animal rescue. The thieves cut the locks and stole 8000 dollars' worth of equipment, including medicine and syringes, lights, generators, and helmets. The items will not be easy to pawn or resell, so there is no rhyme or reason why they were stolen. Trimmel said the nonprofit is made up of volunteers familiar with horses and other large animals are frustrated by the loss but are not losing sight of their main purpose.

Once they arrived on the scene police contacted several people, one of which appeared to be stabbed. Muskogee EMS arrived to bring Jimmy Thompson to St Francis in Muskogee where he died from his injuries. Police now say investigators were able to find a possible suspect as 54-year-old Allen Syfrett. They found Syfrett at a nearby home and took him into custody. Police said this is still an active an ongoing investigation.

Neighbors in the area were surprised to hear something like that would happen in

the neighborhood. The suspect, Alejandro, is now in the Tulsa County Jail facing a shooting with intent to kill charge. The victim is expected to be okay.

Homicide at Normandy Apartments

Tulsa Police are investigating Tulsa's latest homicide at the Normandy Apartments near 38th and Sheridan. Officers say Frankie Foster is the victim who was shot and killed on Saturday. Homicide Sgt. Brandon Watkins says his team has been chasing leads on this all day. Witnesses said they saw a car pull up behind the vehicle Foster was in on Saturday night and began firing shots into it. Officers said they received calls just after 7pm about a shooting and are currently investigating and working to find out if it was a drive-by shooting or if the victim and suspects knew each other. Police say there were several shell casings recovered around the car and that another person was inside the car with Foster when he was shot.

Double Shooting in Okmulgee

A double shooting in Okmulgee this morning left a 12-year-old boy fighting for his life. The shooting happened at a home near the intersection of North Wilson Avenue and East Lafayette. Officers from the Violent Crimes Task Force were knocking on doors this morning trying to get information from neighbors. A local pastor said the community needs to focus their support on the family of the two victims. Okmulgee Police have identified 21-year-old Leon Maurice Grand III as one of the shooting victims, and he is expected to be okay. The other victim, a 12-year-old boy is still in very critical condition.

My41 runs weather alert tickers from FOX23 News during periods of severe weather. When there is a tornado warning in the Tulsa metro area, My41 also simulcasts weather cut-ins produced by FOX23 News.
