Cleveland Residents Conserve Water After Heavy Rain

Pawhuska Opens City Tornado Shelters Ahead of Storm Threat

Osage Nation Firefighters Prep for Oklahoma's Fire Season

They are preparing for Oklahoma's fire season to begin as the leaves start to turn and fall, creating a fuel source.

Anniversary of Strongest Cold Front on Record

In the fall in Oklahoma, it's not uncommon to see summer and winter-like temperatures all in one day. Saturday marked the anniversary of the "Great Blue Norther" in Green Country, which brought some of the lowest cold temps on record. Steve Piltz with the NWS in Tulsa said it's not impossible to see cold temps like that again in the area. In fact, it's not uncommon for eastern Oklahoma to see mid-90s in the afternoon and snow the same night, with tornadoes in-between.

August Tornado Recovery Continues Into November

Car-Tec Auto says their returning customers have vanished, thinking that the tornado permanently shut them down. Chipotle has re-opened, Phone Doctors hopes to reopen Thursday, and Panera Bread plans to re-open at the end of November.

Rogers County Brush Fire Burns 20 Acres

Osage County Grass Fire Burns 100 Acres

Firefighters with Skiatook, Sperry, Avant, Country Corner, and Ramona were all out tackling the flames overnight. They are unsure what caused the fire to start, but are warning the public that the fire danger is extremely high today.

When you download the app, it asks you if you are trained in CPR and ready to help in an emergency. When a heart attack is called into dispatch, those trained and nearby will get an alert that someone needs help. Those people can administer CPR before emergency crews arrive. The app also lets them know where the nearest defibrillator is. Broken Arrow is the first city in Oklahoma to receive this life-saving technology.
