EMSA Responds to High Amounts of Heat-Related Calls

EMSA and Tulsa Emergency Management Officials are asking people to take these dangerously high temperatures seriously. So far, the agency has responded to 246 heat-related calls. 140 people have been admitted to the hospital.

FOX23 Severe Weather Team Monitors Drought, Wildfire in Pawnee County

Continuous drought conditions have sparked a wildfire in Pawnee county. Firefighters with the Drumright Fire Department are assisting several other departments with the fire, which is near Hallett and Highway 412.

Damage Reported in Broken Arrow After Night of Busy Storms

Businesses and homeowners are cleaning up in Broken Arrow after a tornado tore through the area overnight. The storm, which was rated as a low-end tornado, snapped trees, and left debris across the city. While no injuries were reported, thousands of power outages were reported.

Green Country Experiences Difficult Drought, Ranchers Request Help

Cities and towns across Green Country have been struggling with drought and burn bans for months due to a lack of rain. To help, the Cherokee Nation is giving \$1,000,000 in relief funds to help ranchers in our area. The program will assist 2,000 ranchers with a \$500 payment. It will help with the hay shortage ranchers are experiencing.

Tulsa County Issues Burn Ban Amid Ongoing Drought

Tulsa County officials have issued a burn ban as the area continues to experience hot, dry conditions with no rain in sight. The burn ban rules that using fire pits, outdoor fireplaces, and campfires are prohibited. If anyone violates the ban, they face fines up to \$1,200 or six months in jail.

Cleanup Begins After Strong Storms Roll Through Rogers County

Despite many areas in Green Country experiencing drought, a microburst dropped rain and left damage behind in Rogers County. A mobile home was damaged after a tree fell, and power lines are down. But no one was hurt in the storm. The storm lasted about 30 minutes.

Tulsa County Sheriff's Office Hosts Training for Oklahoma School Resource Officers

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister Speaks on Banned Book in Tulsa Public Schools

Two books have been pulled from libraries in Tulsa Public Schools after complaints grew online. Tulsa Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Deborah Gist said the books have been removed but she's not happy with how parents treated the issue. State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the books "pornographic."

Oklahoma State Board of Education Votes to Demote Tulsa Public Schools' Accreditation

The Oklahoma State Board of Education voted to demote Tulsa Public Schools' accreditation after members decided TPS violated House Bill 1775, the critical race theory law. The board voted for a harsher punishment than was originally suggested. Members said they wanted to set examples and hold districts accountable.

Parents Are Frustrated About the New Dress Code at Jenks Public Schools

Jenks Public Schools has issued a new dress code policy ahead of the new school year. Dresses and skirts must be down to the upper or mid-thigh. The code is for grades 7 through 12. Parents are angry, saying the code targets girls and provides nothing for the boys. The district says the change was not properly

communicated to parents and they want students to "dress reasonably" and maximize time in the classroom.

University of Tulsa Launches Open House Project to Share New Initiative

Brookside Bridge Reopens After 7 Months of Construction

The Brookside Bridge on Peoria has reopened after seven months of construction. The bridge, which stands over Crow Creek, will offer more pedestrian traffic to local businesses. While it's expected to boost business in the area, local businesses say they did enjoy fewer traffic throughout the project.

Some Bixby Residents Endure Days Without Running Water

At least 80 homes in Bixby are without running water after an issue involving equipment was reported. Families say they never received answers from the city and have been forced to purchase gallons of water to eat, drink, and bath. The lack of action has forced the Lt. Governor to get involved.

Section of Signal Hill Reopening as Crews Continue Construction

A section of Tulsa's Signal Hill has reopened, four months after crews closed the intersection to make repairs. While the project is not yet completed, one lane along Yale between 81st and 91st is now open. Drivers say even one lane is a large improvement from the detours they have taken for months.

Tulsa International Airport Expands Terminal, Will Accommodate More International Flights

Tulsa International Airport has announced plans to expands its terminal to accommodate more international flights. The decision comes after the Federal Government threatened to pull its customs and border protection facility out of the airport. Meals on Wheels of Metro Tulsa Prepare to Open New Facility Worth \$15 Million

Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg Visits Tulsa, Shares Plans to Revamp Greenwood

New Section of Highway 20 Opens to Drivers in Claremore

Tulsa Police Investigate Massive Brawl Involving Dozens of People, Weapons

Tulsa police are investigating after they say two people were hurt following a brawl at a west Tulsa apartment complex. Witnesses say the fight started after a group of people were shooting fireworks around a group of teens near the Parkview Terrance Apartments. The victims were stabbed but were able to get back to their apartment. No arrests have been made.

Two People Arrested in Major Animal Abuse Sting in Rogers County

Two people have been arrested after Rogers County deputies say they found 36 animals in one home. There were also animal carcasses on the property. Rescued animals included dogs, birds, reptiles, and horses. Neighbors said they didn't believe the animals were being abused and blamed a worm outbreak on their frail condition.

Multiple People Arrested Following High-Speed Police Chase in Sapulpa

Several people are in police custody after a police chase ended in north Tulsa. Officers say the chase started after the car was stolen from a Sapulpa business. Officers were able to find the car thanks to the SUV's connect app.

Tulsa Police Investigate Overnight Stabbing at QuikTrip

Tulsa police officers were called to a QuikTrip near 51st and Yale after a man was stabbed while walking his dog across the parking lot. The victim, who survived the attack, said his attacker robbed him first. But even though he complied, the suspect attacked. The attack was caught on surveillance footage.

Tulsa Police Department Installs Flock Cameras, Uses Technology to Fight Crime

The Tulsa Police Department has installed flock cameras at several areas across the city. The technology is used to reduce incidents in Tulsa's high-crime areas. The cameras read license plates and can be used in real time. Since the cameras were installed, detectives have been able to arrest two people connected to a carjacking.

Victim in Critical Condition Following Shooting at Tulsa's Las Americas Grocery Store
