Nearly a week after it ripped through Louisiana, the grip of hurricane Ida's impact continues to tighten. Power lines toppled, lines stretched long, and some houses just pieces of their original form. On Friday, President Biden got his first glimpse of the destruction. Welcomed by Governor John Bel Edwards, President Biden toured one of the hardest hit communities of Laplace Louisiana. The area was not only hit by strong storm gusts, but flood waters left people trapped, their homes partially submerged. Biden says he will be next to Louisiana as they rebuild, but they need to build back better, a nod to his massive infrastructure plan he hopes passes soon.

The fair runs September 30th through October 10th.

Video Captures ATM Theft

The ATM at the Chase Bank near 41st and Yale is out of order until further notice. Police say thieves used a truck and a chain to rip off the front of the machine and then went in after the loot. Officers say the group got what they came for but didn't say an exact amount. Video surveillance footage shows the thieves were covered incredibly well, making them hard to identify. In a Facebook post, police say the thieves were there for about 2 minutes and this is part of a growing problem. Detectives say they've seen 6 ATM thefts since June. Lt. Tim Means isn't sure if these are all connected but he says this one and the one in July definitely are. Police say the white truck in the July case was stolen and recovered after a chase with the suspects who dumped the truck and ran away. Officers are asking anyone with information to please call Crimestoppers.

State Deploys Mobile Health Units

The State Department of Health is working to make sure people in rural counties have access to health care. Starting Tuesday, the health department will deploy a fleet of mobile wellness units. They're heading to District 4 in northeastern Oklahoma which includes Washington, Craig, Mayes, Ottawa, Delaware, Wagoner, Rogers, and Nowata counties. The wellness units can do everything from COVID testing to regular health screenings.

Tulsa Hospitals Expand Morgues

Some Tulsa area hospitals are expanding their morgues because of an increase in COVID deaths. In the past month, the state reported 543 new deaths. With the spike in COVID cases across Oklahoma, Tulsa area hospitals like Hillcrest are preparing for more deaths. A statement from the hospital says "Due to the increased Covid 19 rates and mortality in our community, it was necessary to expand resources and capacity. Hospitals work closely with final homes to ensure patients and families are taken care of. This includes expanding the size of our morgue as a service to our partners during the latest surge." Compared to this time last year, the number of COVID infections has increased dramatically. There are over 5600 more COVID infections. Since the beginning of the pandemic, more than 9,200 people have died.

Fauci Suggests Booster Shots

If you've taken the Moderna or Pfizer vaccine, you'll likely need a third dose. That's according to the nation's top infectious disease expert Dr. Anthony Fauci. On Thursday, Dr. Fauci said he thinks the three does will most likely be the recommended full dose regimen for protecting people from the coronavirus. Johnson and Johnson is also studying the possibility of adding a second dose as a booster to it's one-shot vaccine.

New Report Shows 9/11 Illness Impact

A new report shows more people may have died of illnesses related to the 9/11 attacks than those directly killed. The Justice Department revealed this information in a special report about the 9/11 Victim Compensation Fund Tuesday. The DOJ report says 48% of the claims filed, which is more than 18,000 people, listed 9/11 related cancers as one of their eligible conditions.
