Tulsa Fire Officials say lightning is most likely to blame for a fire at The Park at Forest Oaks Apartments near 71<sup>st</sup> and Wheeling (South Tulsa). The people living in the unit that was hit did not want to go on camera, but let FOX23 see the damage inside. They speculate it was the metal lining of their chimney that took the direct hit. Fortunately firefighters were able to contain the flames to just two units in the complex. Neighbor Christopher Scott says "it's pretty shocking that it actually hit the apartment as opposed to all the trees around, but I'm just glad that no one got hurt." The people affected say they are still working with the owner on finding other living arrangements.

The Tulsa Health Officials are preparing for what could be a challenging mosquito season. The Tulsa Health Department staff are being trained this week and mosquito traps will be put out next week which is almost a month earlier than normal. With recent rains and more in the forecast, the mosquito population could explode especially if people do not remove or treat standing water near their homes. Scott Meader with the Tulsa Health Department says "if it keeps raining there could be more mosquitoes and if it's hot and dry there could be a different types of mosquitoes". The Health Department could start spraying for mosquitoes by the end of May.

Superintendent Dr. Deborah Gist told FOX23 that she knows many may be worried about our child's education. She stopped by FOX23 News Studio today to talk about the cuts. One proposal is to consolidate three West Tulsa Schools. Dr. Gist says she is confident the recommendation will still provide quality education for all students. Dr. Gist also says "this is many decades of underinvestment in our education and now for the past 10 years we have taken higher cuts to our state aid per pupil than any other state in the country."

**School Budget in Broken Arrow School District**

Another local superintendent, Dr. Jane Dunlop is calling on state lawmakers to change how they fund education. Broken Arrow Public Schools already slashed 7-point-7-million-dollars from the budget. Dr. Dunlop says "if we don't create new revenue streams in Oklahoma then education in the state is in dire straits".

The City agreed to look at property tax incentives and will continue to lobby at the Capitol not only for more revenue, but new ways districts can get more funding.

Budgets are tight, margins are thin...when you play by the rules and someone who doesn't...comes in and tries to take away what we worked so hard for." Police say the suspects drove the stolen car to a park in East Tulsa and set it on fire.

FOX23 is learning more about the threat of West Nile virus in the Tulsa area. The Tulsa County Health Department confirmed a mosquito in a trap in North Tulsa tested positive for the virus. Health officials are taking this seriously, however, it is only one confirmed sample of more than 240 tested this season. Luisa Krug, an Epidemiologist with the Tulsa County Health Department says "some people do take a really long time to recover. Even the less severe cases can take months, to get rid of the weakness, fatigue, stuff like that." July through October in Oklahoma are typically the months with the highest risk of West Nile virus.

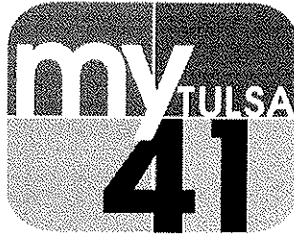
### **Mosquitos Concern in Green Country**

There is a new round of West Nile virus testing being done by the Tulsa County Health Department. This is despite not having a mosquito test positive in two weeks. FOX23 reported earlier this month that a mosquito trap in North Tulsa tested positive for the virus. The City is already spraying for mosquitoes and will ramp up efforts as the population increases. There has been no reports of confirmed West Nile cases in Oklahoma.
