Flooding Prompts Water Rescues

Rain falling in the Tulsa Metro caused a big mess for drivers this morning. The storms not only left behind damage from the flooding, but it also caused road closures. There was debris left floating in the street, and cars left abandoned, stalled out all over midtown. Part of the road at Yale avenue was even washed away. Tulsa firefighters responded to several water rescues this morning around the city. Nick Ridener with the TFD says minutes after the storm hit Tulsa, TFD were out performing rescues from cars. First responders remind the public not to drive through standing water or around barricades.

Flooding Causes Scare at Historic Mansion

City Postpones Decision on Marijuana Zoning

Tulsa's city council postponed a decision that would have stopped application for medical marijuana growers. The city of Tulsa does not have any zoning language in place for medical marijuana businesses right now. On Wednesday night, a motion went before city council to issue a 90-day moratorium on permits for growers and processors. Opponents say it could hurt small businesses trying to get into the industry. City officials say the zoning changes for medical marijuana businesses are already in the works and could be in place as early as mid-November.

Fair Food Is Inspected

The Family Safety Center says it gets about 300,000 dollars through the act, and they're able to help more than 5,000 people each year. The facility's associate director says delaying the vote until December 7th is not helpful for the agencies.

Proposed Adult Store Stirs Up Controversy

An adult entertainment store is eyeing Tulsa for its newest location and is drawing criticism from local businesses and schools. Hustler Hollywood is hoping to open a store in the vacant building on 41st and I-44, and city councilor Karen Gilbert confirmed the store has been granted a building permit, much to the dismay of the neighboring stores in the area. Airsoft Tulsa general manager Jon Macalvania says his clientele is mostly youth, and he's worried about a different sort of customer coming to the area. Macalvania has been in business for 10 years and doesn't want a place like Hustler to hinder kids' safety. Hustler Hollywood is also drawing criticisms from nearby Bishop Kelley High School.

Turley Community Meets to Discuss Development

Police knew that Ricky Sier had been with Aundre right before he was killed, and wanted to talk to him. Ricky turned himself into police Sunday afternoon, but after interviewing him, officers don't believe Sier pulled the trigger. Sgt. Dave Walker says they are now treating Sier as a witness. Police are looking for the shooter of Aundre Byrd and will continue to investigate.

Hit and Run Leaves One Dead

Tulsa police are investigating why a man hit and killed by a car this morning was laying in the middle of the road in the first place. It happened around 5am this morning on 81st street, just east of Yale. The driver of the car says she saw the man in the road and attempted to swerve, but still hit him. Officers say the women did not appear to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol, but they performed a blood test to make sure. Officers are investigating if the victim was hit by multiple cars. The cause of death and the victim's identity is to be determined by the medical examiner.
