After the news that the Trump administration wants to ban flavored vape products, local vape stores want to set the record straight about deaths and illnesses being tied to vaping. Rolling Vapors owner James McEntire says flavored vaping product sales have dropped dramatically in just weeks because of the speculation about vaping and related deaths. James says it's easy to buy tainted and even fatally flawed vaping products off the black market and from non-reputable sellers online and says stores like his are being unfairly lumped into the problem. James says his products are government tested and people need to buy from established folks who have been selling for years and are therefore educated on the industry. Hotbox Tulsa owner Resham Korlhe says he's seen some vape smokers try to go back to

cigarettes as a result of all the bad press. Both owners say the new rules and bans will hurt their bottom lines, and not the actual folks selling illegal and tainted products. Some stores in the Tulsa area have already voluntarily removed their flavored products just because they aren't sure what's going on. The ones who still have it on their shelves are confident in the quality of what they sell.

Local Business Deals with Homeless Problem

A local business has been battling a homeless problem in midtown Tulsa. Cindy Salter owns Jackson Square strip mall since 1991 at 51st and Lewis and has been noticing an uptick in garbage left behind at her property. At the back of the mall, trash has been piling up so Salter put out a garbage can which eventually had to be locked because the tenants found homeless people sleeping in it on 15 different occasions. Salter says she's sympathetic to those who are homeless, but after a recent confrontation, she's had to enlist the city to help. Councilman Cass Fahler is helping Cindy with the situation, and the city says the best thing to do is to call 311 for help.

Coweta Police Train for Active Shooters

The Coweta Police department held an active shooter training today. Coweta police chief Mike Bell said the unit actually failed the training, but it's what he expected. He hopes to learn from their mistakes, so if this were to happen in real life, they would know what to do. Bell says it's important that police and fire get inside the building as quickly as possible. The two-hour training consisted of two people playing active shooters. Volunteers played people hurt, some dead, and rescue teams took them out of the building. The training is a coincidence, happening at the same day and time as the El Paso Walmart shootings. Chief Bell also said he plans to meet with the community on how they should respond if there is a shooting.

Airport Makes Repairs to Runways

The Tulsa International Airport is laying some of the thickest concrete in Oklahoma, at a whopping 17 inches thick in an effort to make repairs to the taxiway Juliet. Juliet is one of the main ways planes get to the main runway at TIA, and Airport Operations Manager Donald Wyatt says it got to be in such bad shape because of wear and tear and there were fears that planes travelling over it could suck in stones that broke off from the pavement. Simply patching and filling potholes was no longer a viable option. Senior Project Engineer Brian Aussiker says the pavement is so thick for multiple reasons. Although TIA doesn't have regular Boeing 747 service, it must be ready to accommodate one of the biggest planes in the world at any time. The airport says the project should be finished in time for the holiday travel season.

City Looks for Local Artists for Greenwood Project

Tulsa Mayor GT Bynum says a million-dollar grant from Bloomberg Philanthropies is creating positive energy in one of Tulsa's downtown historic districts. He says the Greenwood Art Project is an effort to commemorate and recognize the accomplishments of Black Wall Street, the country's most prominent district of black-owned businesses in the 20th century, and also an effort to never forget the subsequent massacre that occurred. Lead artist of the project, Rick Lowe, says the goal is to invite local artists to help tell Greenwood's story through multiple temporary art installations. Local artists like Phetote Mshairi say that for them, the project isn't just personal, and it's about reminding others that when you come together, good can come from tragedy. The city says they're expecting a variety of art, everything from music to poetry, to sculptures and designs.

The victim originally said the franchise he works for told him they were going to take the \$80 out of his paycheck to make up for what was lost, but Dominos explained their policy is not to penalize employees who are victims of a crime.

Jail Guard Accused of Smuggling Weapons

The Tulsa County Sheriff's Office has fired a jail guard, accused of smuggling guns and knives into the jail. Yesterday, 100 law enforcement officers, including special ops and SWAT, conducted a thorough search of the jail, checking cells and patting down inmates. No weapons were found in the sweep. Casey Roebuck, spokesperson for the Sheriff's office, says the guard was fired over a separate issue. His name has not been released since he has not been charged with a crime.

Man Killed in 47th Homicide

Police have released the name of the man killed in Tulsa's 47th homicide of the year. Police say Luis Simich was shot and killed near 91st and Mingo. Officers say the victim and his estranged wide were having issues for a while before Saturday's shooting. Luis texted his estranged wife to say he was coming over, and officers aren't sure how the argument escalated but they did say Luis spray painted her car and then rammed into the car that belonged to the man who was in the house with his estranged wife. Simich then aggressively came at the man and that's when the man shot him in the torso. Police say the man claimed self-defense. Homicide sergeant Brandon Watkins says they did talk to the man accused of firing the gun and have released him pending further investigation.

Murder-Suicide in Edmond

Terror unfolded in Edmond with two 911 calls, the first from a friend to one of the soon to be victims, Sarah Semlar, and the other from the gunman himself. Keith Garber called 911 to say he had just killed his wife and her friend. When the police arrived, they found Garber had turned the gun on himself as well, lying dead in the front yard. The bodies of Semlar and her friend Adam Crawford were found inside. Police also found Garber's 11-year-old daughter still alive and hiding in the closet. The daughter is now safe with other family members. Police say they are still investigating a motive for the murders.

Police Arrest Burglary Suspect

Tulsa Police say they have arrested a man who broke into an apartment and then hid from them in the attic. Officers say they first got the call from a woman who noticed two men breaking into one of the apartments near 23rd and Jackson. They say the two had gone through the back door, and fortunately the resident who lived there was not home at the time. When officers arrived on the scene, one man fled and the other tried to get away by crawling into the attic. He then tried to crawl into a neighboring attic of one of the other apartments. Officers had to call in the fire department so they could borrow a truck with a ladder and planned to use a vent to spot the man, who eventually came out on his own.

Armed Robbery Video Released

Tulsa Police have released surveillance video showing an armed robbery at a local convenience store. TPD Robbery Sergeant Brian Blair says the robbery happened at a Kum n Go near 51st Street and 145th East Avenue in the early morning hours of September 3rd. Two men stormed the building wearing ninjalike masks and then split up. One suspect goes to find the store employee and puts him on the ground before making him open the register while the other sprays the camera lenses with fake Christmas snow. Blair says both suspects had guns, and they'd like to catch them before the duo hits again. Blair is hoping that someone knows who the suspects are, even though their faces are covered. He urges anyone with information to call Crimestoppers.

Police Arrest Career Thief

Tulsa Police say they have arrested a man who has made a career out of stealing from home improvement stores not only in Tulsa, but also in surrounding cities. Police arrested Joel Scarlett after arriving in time to nab him in the parking lot at Home Depot after he loaded his cart full of high-priced items and then walked past the registers. Officers say this is not their first run-in with Scarlett and point to a separate case where he tried to make a fraudulent return at a local Lowe's, where he tried to return a Shop-Vac box without the Shop-Vac inside. On top of those two cases, Scarlett has a long list of other charges accusing him of shoplifting, possibly making a career out of selling the stolen items. Bixby and Owasso also have cases against him.
