Weather

Rains Prompt Dam Release

The Army Corps of Engineers is preparing to release more water from the Keystone Dam today than they have in a quarter of a century. Volunteers are out filling sandbags at the District 12 Levee in Sand Springs as a precaution since the levels in the lake are so high due to the heavy rains in the area. The volunteers, along with a sand machine from the Army Corps of Engineers, are able to fill about 10 bags per minute. James Bishop said he decided to volunteer after seeing the event on Facebook. He even recruited friends to come along as well. Bishop said he plans to spend a large portion of his Sunday helping out his community.

Governor Declares State of Emergency

After a historic week of tornadoes and flooding, Governor Kevin Stitt signed an executive order, declaring state of emergencies in all 77 Oklahoma counties. He also got the White House on board to offer support through FEMA. Stitt was in Claremore today to survey the damage and said it's great to see communities pulling together like this. He oversaw volunteers filling sandbags to combat the flooding in Rogers County, where the Verdigris river is swollen beyond its usual banks, threatening many areas.

Storm Damage in Jenks

The city of Jenks is picking up after a storm tore through the town around 3am on Sunday morning. Stoplights are out, gas stations are pitch black, and debris is covering the roadways. At the peak of the power outages, more than 30,000 customers were left without power. Lanes were closed on the Creek Turnpike near the Peoria/Elm exit, and a trooper and OTA workers were blocking the area due to downed power lines. Trees were spotted leaning on homes, and branches were also covering power lines. Jenks Police say thankfully no one was hurt.

Broken Arrow Suffers Storm Damage

Broken Arrow is also picking up today after the same powerful storm system ripped through Jenks and Bixby. There were many reports of tree and fence damage, with one homeowner saying 56 feet of his fence blew away on both sides of his house. Trees are uprooted from yards, trampolines went flying over fences, and power is out across town. Down near Washington and South Juniper Avenue, crews shut down the road due to downed power lines. The area is also filled with tree damage. Police say if

you are out driving to be cautious of these power lines. PSO says they are working hard to restore power for those who are without it, and report 475 customers still without power.

Water Release Increased at Dam

The Army Corps of Engineers announced today that they will be stepping up the water being released at the Keystone Dam tonight, and again tomorrow morning. The Corps is trying to hold the release at 250,000 cubic feet per second, but because of the additional rainfall last night they are having to up it to 275,000 cfs by 7pm tomorrow. This week Tulsa County released maps that help people see where the previous release rate could cause flooding. The city is having an updated news conference with new maps available this evening.

Sapulpa Cleans up After Tornado

Residents and business owners in Sapulpa are picking up today after a tornado blasted through the town overnight. One neighbor, Jacob Kluding, said no sooner had he pulled into his driveway from attending a Driller's game earlier that evening than the storm hit, shattering glass. Kluding said he didn't even hear the sirens and got his family to safety in their safe spot by using an app on his phone to get alerts. Kluding reported shattered windows and a tree on top of his car, ruined furniture and belongings from water damage. Neighbors say it could be awhile, but they believe Sapulpa will recover.

Flood Waters Unmoor Historic Submarine

An exclusive look was given today at the moment when the floodwaters pulled the World War II submarine, U.S.S. Batfish, from it's display in Muskogee last month. Water from the Arkansas river was as it's highest and overflowed into the War Memorial Park, causing the sub to break loose. Security camera footage shows the moment the Batfish's line broke and it began to float away. Luckily it hit a nearby tree, otherwise officials say it would have floated down river, unmanned and out of control. As of now, the immediate concern is that the Batfish doesn't roll onto its side. It's currently being held in place with ropes tied to trees.

Lake Levels Keep Tourists Away

Despite the heat outside, many people are still dealing with the side-effects of last month's flooding rains. Michael Fawcett, owner at Redbud Marina on Oologah lake, says they are a month behind where they usually are business-wise due to last month's flooding. The parking lot to the marina is still under water, and the lake is still 18 feet above where it should be. The high lake levels are keeping tourists from coming to Oologah lake, which hurts local businesses. Fawcett says the marina has been in his family for forty years and this is the worst flooding he's ever seen.

Keystone Marina Rebuilds after Flooding

The owners of Keystone Harbor Marina are working to get back on their feet after historic flooding just a few weeks ago. The marina is now open for business, but the main road to the boathouse is still under water. Ron Howell, the marina's owner, says it should be gone before Thursday, just in time for their planned three fireworks shows. Howell says he's lucky because even though a foot and a half of water got into the boathouse, they had no damage. Then last week, rain reflooded a bridge and the road leading to the parking lot. Howell is hopeful the water will be 100% gone by Thursday and plans to put on three fireworks shows this year since Pier 51 down the road is still closed and cannot put on one of their own this year. Howell says it's the least he can do.

After the state of Oklahoma settled with Purdue Pharma, the majority of the 270-million-dollar settlement went to Oklahoma State University Center for Wellness and Recovery. Following that, lawmakers voted to make changes to the law so that any future settlement would go to the state treasury. So, while Attorney General Mike Hunter is currently fighting Johnson & Johnson in court, Governor Stitt is questioning where the recent 85-million-dollar Teva settlement because he says it doesn't comply with the new law of where the money will go. Hunter said on day one of the Johnson & Johnson trial that there was no settlement talks ongoing, and they have not been able to reach an agreement with the state.

Ragu Recalled for Plastic

The maker of the spaghetti sauce Ragu announced today that plastic fragments could be an unwanted ingredient in some jars. So far there are no reports of injuries or complaints, and the voluntary recall was announced as a precaution. The recall involves three specific varieties: chunky tomato, garlic & onion, and old-world styles.

Health Department Surveys Mosquitos

The Tulsa Health Department is out today testing standing water for mosquitos and treating it. Back in May, a mosquito trap tested positive for West Nile, and a human case was confirmed earlier this month. Following the historic flooding, the health department has been going around surveying areas and then treating the water to get rid of or prevent mosquitos. Breeding is most likely to happen in shallow, standing water that's in the sun. The health department says not to worry about moving water sources like creeks and urges residents to drain standing water any way they can. They also encourage using bug spray when you are outside.

Students Honored by Governor

Some local teens will be honored next week for saving a woman's life. Governor Stitt is scheduled Monday evening to honor four Sapulpa students at the Central Technology Center on Main Street. Authorities say brothers Seth and Nick Byrd, along with Wyatt Hall and Dylan Wick took action by rushing into a burning home to rescue a 90-year-old woman. The event starts at 6pm Monday.

City Issues Heat Alert

Animal Rescue Holds Free Spay Clinic

The incident happened near 51st and Peoria on Friday. Police say a man shot and injured two people, one outside the Cici's Pizza and one at a nearby China Wok restaurant. A Tulsa officer ended up shooting the suspect and killing him as he then pointed a gun at cars on the I-44 near the Peoria exit.

My41 runs weather alert tickers from FOX23 News during periods of severe weather. When there is a tornado warning in the Tulsa metro area, My41 also simulcasts weather cut-ins produced by FOX23 News. FOX23 News is committed to being on-air and online, giving the latest conditions as severe weather moves into the KOKI-TV/KMYT-TV viewing area.

Relay for Life – My41 sponsored a fundraising walk for the American Cancer Society on June 14, 2019. Our stations produced and aired PSAs several times in advance of the event to encourage community participation. The event raised over \$139,000 for the American Cancer Society.
