KSL Television airs Sunday Edition every Sunday morning at 9:00 am. Each program is approximately 30 minutes in length and is typically hosted by Richard Piatt or Nadine Wimmer. Below is a summary of the topics they addressed:

January 6 Hosted by Richard Piatt Government, Public Safety, Transportation

- The old 112th Congress is out and the new 113th Congress is in. But, most of the old issues remain. We asked local politicians to grade Congress and the President for their actions on the fiscal cliff. We are also going to discuss if it's possible for compromise and civility to return to Capitol Hill.
- Here is a 2012 statistic that should disturb all of us. 29 Utahns died as a result of -domestic violence last year. We are going to discuss prevention in a moment but first Carole Mikita introduces us to a survivor who is speaking out in hopes her story will help save others.
- In the future, we may have another way to cross Utah Lake by boat. Doug Wright offers his opinion on plans to build a bridge to unite the East and West sides of Utah County.

January 13 Hosted by Richard Piatt Government, Health Care, Health

- The 2013 Legislative session gets underway in a few weeks and a resolution could end the practice of what's known as "boxcar bills." That's when legislators open an empty bill file at the beginning of the session, which they can then introduce text into later — potentially at the last minute. Critics argue it's not transparent or in the public interest. We'll discuss the issue with Sen. Aaron Osmond and political science professor Tim Chambliss.
- Utah is one of four GOP-led states that has been given the go-ahead by the federal government to run its own health insurance exchange. But even before now, Utah has been a pioneer in state-run health care reform. A program now called "Avenue H" is a health insurance exchange for small businesses. But to make it compliant with federal law, Utah has to figure out how to offer individual insurance plans. Richard Piatt discussed all of that with Celia Nash, an insurance broker with the most groups on Avenue H. and Judi Hillman, director of the Utah Health Policy Project.
- KSL is dedicating the year 2013 to giving you and your family reliable information you can use to feel your best. If you've ever met KSL's Doug Wright, you may have noticed a small plastic box on his belt and wondered, "what is that?" That little device is key to helping him maintain his fitness with every step he takes.

January 20 Hosted by Richard Piatt Education, Global Conflict, Immigration

- The Utah Legislature convenes a week from Monday. Education will again be a key issue. And this year: A different approach. Last week an initiative called Prosperity 2020 emerged, and the business leaders associated with it presented their plan for investing in education. The plan calls for, among other things, showing a commitment to funding education by talking about new state

revenues — a taboo topic on Capitol Hill. Joining Richard Piatt to discuss education and needs for the future are Randy Shumway, Vice Chair of Prosperity 2020, and Mary Ann Holladay, director of the Utah Women & Education Initiative.

- We're going to take a more 'global' view now, and talk about something a lot of people don't want to talk about. There is violence in many corners of the world and the conflict in Syria has flown under the radar for many Americans. The U.N. said this month that more than 60,000 people have been killed in the violence in Syria since 2011. This week alone, attacks left nearly 100 dead. We are going to discuss how the conflict started and why it should matter to us here in the U.S.
- The Utah Legislature will get another chance to endorse the Utah Compact. The Compact is a statement of principles meant to address the complex challenges associated with a broken national immigration system. Doug Wright offers his opinion on why it's time for the Legislature to finally endorse it.

January 27

Government, Gun Control

- Monday, it starts. Utah's 60th Legislature — an annual event that often comes with a mix of anticipation and dread — convenes. Important topics at the top of the agenda this year include: Education funding, ethics reform, and even taxes may be up for debate. Richard Piatt welcomed Representative Don Ipson of Saint George, the Assistant Majority Whip and Representative Rebecca Chavez Houck, Assistant Minority Whip to talk it over.
- Richard Piatt continued his legislative preview with Deseret News reporters Lisa Riley Roche and Dennis Romboy and Steve Kroes, president of the Utah Foundation.
- Last week, Democrats in Washington proposed bringing back an assault weapons ban first passed in 1994. There is obviously going to be a lot of debate on the issue, so Doug Wright makes the case for a more civil discussion.

February 3

Immigration, Infertility, Technology

- Starting today... Lawmakers begin to sort out differences between their immigration plan and president Obama's. Like: How long will it take for people living here illegally to become citizens? Immigrants say five years. But lawmakers want to make sure the borders are secure first - that could take longer. Another big difference: the white house wants same-sex immigrants to apply just like all other families. Conservatives may have issues with that. Some still aren't sold on the idea of allowing 11 million illegal workers to stay here at all. Groups pushing for reform want to see it happen quickly, a solution for the nation and for millions who dream of becoming Americans.
- If you've faced infertility or know someone who has treatment can seem like a bit of a game. Lori Prichard shows how information and technology are improving the odds of the fertility game, and two physicians discuss the treatments at length.
- Utah is aiming to be known as a high-tech state. But Doug Wright has found an area where we could use some improvement and a proposed bill that could fix it.

February 10

Community Issues, Bullying

- Jennifer Stagg shares the story of a boy whose parents share the devastating effects of bullying on their family. Richard Piatt discusses solutions with Rep. Carol Spackman Moss, who is sponsoring anti-bullying legislation, and Dr. Greg Hudnall, assistant superintendent of the Provo School District.
- Deanie Wimmer shares the story of how a simple act of courage had a huge impact on a student being bullied. She also discussed how students can use a website to anonymously report bullying and threats of suicide.
- Internationally-renowned motivational speaker Nick Vujicic has chosen Utah to kick off his national Teen Suicide and Teen Bullying prevention campaign. Learn more details about the upcoming events in March.

February 17

Gun Control, Mental Illness, Transportation

- Today we're taking on the fight over guns. It's a red-hot topic across the country. Congress and lawmakers here find themselves in the middle: Is there a balance between gun rights and gun control? Here in Utah most of the proposed bills are not about taking guns away, rather, strengthening the rights of those who own them. We will discuss the bills with Clark Aposhian, chairman on the Utah Shooting Sports Council and Gary Sackett, board member of the Gun Violence Prevention Center.
- Every time there is a mass shooting, a lot of attention turns to mental illness. But the reality is, the vast majority of people who are violent do not suffer from mental illness. Those inaccurate beliefs about mental illness and violence have led to widespread stigma and discrimination. So where does mental illness fit into the debate over gun control? Rebecca Glathar, executive director of the Utah chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness discusses it.
- The legislature is considering a proposal that would expand the 80 mile per hour zones the Highway Patrol has been testing. Doug Wright takes the idea on a test drive.

February 24

Health, Distracted Driving, Economy

- Health insurance mandates that require every individual to be insured go into effect early next year, but decisions yet to be made by state leaders have many Utahns hanging in the balance. And one of those anxiously waiting for that decision joined us. Michael Twede is 26-years-old and has serious medical needs. Having insurance has always been a huge concern for him. Matt Slonaker from the Utah Health Policy Project also joined the discussion.
- Have you ever driven distracted? Every year, hundreds of thousands of people are injured or killed because of it. Socially, it often seems acceptable. But legally, does more need to be done? Mike Headrick spent the last several weeks investigating the issue on Utah roads and shared his special report. He also visited with a woman responsible for a fatal accident.
- The penny costs more to manufacture than it is worth; its buying power is almost nil. So is it time to stop?

March 3

Sequester, Arts, Gun Control

- The looming specter of the Sequester is upon us, and it appears life as we know it will go on. The big question remains: What are the long term impacts of this government dysfunction? Richard Piatt discussed the political and potential economic impact with Kirk Jowers, director of the Hinckley Institute of Politics and Natalie Gochnour, chief economist for the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce.
- The Beverly Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program brings high-quality arts education to Utah elementary school students across the state. But last year the legislature cut funding for the program in half. A grassroots advocacy group is requesting that the legislature reinstate the original \$4 million, which will help take the program to about 130 schools next year. Richard Piatt discussed the program with the Superintendent of the Salt Lake School District, McKell Withers, and the director of Friends of Art Works for Kids, Lisa Cluff.
- A concealed weapons permit class in Utah lasts four hours. But actually shooting a gun or even holding it, is not a requirement. News Specialist Devon Dolan spent the last month investigating whether Utahns who take the class are prepared or not. One of the most talked about bills at the Capitol this year would have Utah become another "Constitutional Carry" state. House Bill 76 would pretty much do away with Utah's Concealed Weapons permit process and also has gotten the attention of gun right's supporter Doug Wright. He offered his opinion on the issue.

March 10

Sex trafficking, Prison Relocation, Health

- Sex trafficking is not a crime most people think about or realize still happens in this country and our own state. But a report released in the fall shows America's legal system is failing children who are sexually exploited for money, and that includes Utah's system. Shared Hope International gave Utah a "D" grade, saying our state does not do enough to protect victims and adequately punish perpetrators. Nationally, victims are defined as under age 18 and not able to consent. In Utah, victims are considered under age 14. And Utah laws do not add special penalties when perpetrators pay to have sex with children or view pornography. A bill before the legislature, HB163 would strengthen Utah's sex trafficking laws. Richard Piatt discussed the issue with Stephanie Larsen, an advocate for victims. Four generations of women in her family were victims of sex trafficking. High school student Madi Palmer also joined the discussion. She is a volunteer with Backyard Broadcast, a youth organization that seeks to end child sex-trafficking.
- Is it time to move the state prison? A lot of people say yes and SB72 would create a board to oversee the possible relocation. But time is running out to deal with that bill. Estimated costs to move the prison fall in between the range of \$550 million and \$600 million. But it will open up that spot of prime real estate at the point of the mountain for new development. Critics argue SB72 is being rushed and worry about the influence of special interests. Richard Piatt discussed the issue with the bill's sponsor, Senator Scott Jenkins, and majority whip, Rep. Greg Hughes.
- Protecting the health of Utah kids is what HB13 is all about. It would penalize adults who smoke in cars when kids are inside. Our own Doug Wright was willing to risk one of his most cherished belongings so that you understand his opinion on the issue.

March 17

Government, Adoptions, Discrimination

- The 2013 Utah Legislative session is now history. A 13 billion dollar budget has been passed, and several hundred laws are set to go into effect later this year. Richard Piatt discussed the session with leadership from both parties.
- Haiti has received a lot of criticism for the way they have handled adoptions. Orphanages are packed with children who are not actually orphans but because of dire poverty their parents gave them up. Haiti has changed adoption laws and that has made it a lot more difficult for families in the U.S. to adopt. The Wunderli family recently returned from Haiti with their three adopted children and shared their experience.
- Proponents of a statewide anti-discrimination bill have tried for years to get one passed. This year they came closer than they ever have before but it still failed. In Doug Wright's opinion the legislature needs to take more forceful action next year.

March 24

Business, Debt Crisis, Sports

- This weekend City Creek Center celebrated its first anniversary. It has had a huge impact on downtown, as did The Gateway when it opened in 2001. Many people have wondered about the competition between the two malls as well as Trolley Square. Linda Wardell general manager of City Creek, Scott Bennett general manager of the Gateway, Jason Mathis from the Downtown Alliance and Jason Lee business reporter for the Deseret News sit down together to talk about the future.
- The non-partisan campaign "Fix the Debt" is gaining the support of Americans from all walks of life who want common sense solutions to fix the nation's debt crisis. Here in Utah the movement has support from business and community leaders including the state's top political party leaders. Thomas Wright and Jim Dabakis explained the campaign to Richard Piatt.
- Jennifer Hamson is a two-sport college athlete from Lindon. She is an All-American in volleyball at BYU and an impressive center on the basketball team. But when the games end and the crowds disperse, she is still a 6-foot 7-inch co-ed.

The KSL Junior Weather Specialists (formerly Weather Labs) is a weather/science program for fourth graders. They are conducted at the Discovery Gateway Museum on Wednesday mornings (except the third Wednesday of each month). A limited number of on-site school visits are also made. Schools participating come from the public, private, charter, web-based and home school sectors.

During each session schoolchildren, their teachers, administrators, and parents go to Discovery Gateway, a Salt Lake City-based children's museum, to meet with one of KSL's meteorologists to learn about science, weather, and broadcasting. Each group and experiment is taped for future on-air use.

The KSL Junior Weather Specialists is also available on ksl.com. Within the site one can find information such as "ask the Meteorologist," weather folklore, weather games, weather experiments, weather safety, and weather facts. Also, students and parents can click on and see streaming video of previously aired segments.
