DESERET NEWS SUNDAY EDITION

The Deseret News Sunday Edition airs weekly on KSL-TV at 9:00 a.m. on Sundays. The show highlights Deseret News content centered around six areas of editorial emphasis: family, faith in the community, excellence in education, values in media and culture, causes related to helping the poor and financial responsibility.

Each week, the program will go in-depth on these topics and bring you insights from voices around the country. The program is approximately 30 minutes in length and is typically hosted by Dave McCann.

Below is a summary of the topics they addressed:

January 5, 2014 NO PROGRAM AIRED

January 12, 2014 On this week's "Deseret News Sunday Edition," Dave McCann discusses the "Fight the New Drug" campaign, what a newsroom contest revealed about clutter and why attractiveness is a source of inequality that impacts wages and grades.

- A growing number of teenagers are struggling with increasing appetites for pornography. It is often first found during an innocent Web search at home, and experts say the age of first exposure is continuing to fall. It is now around 11 or 12. A nonprofit group — Fight the New Drug — has been raising awareness about the dangers of pornography by taking the message directly to students at schools around the country. Later this month they will publicly release a free online recovery program. McCann discusses the program with Clay Olsen, executive director of "Fight the New Drug," and Dr. Jason Carroll, associate professor in the School of Family Life at Brigham Young University.
- During the Moneywise segment, Dave McCann finds himself in the middle of piles of books. The books are remnants of a newsroom contest between Deseret News writers Michael De Groote and Ryan Morgenegg. Every workday they had to bring in a book from home until one of the bookaholics, cried uncle. As they explain to McCann, the contest revealed the secrets of demolishing clutter.
- Add "looks" to the list of factors that can provide an advantage or disadvantage in life. New research suggests attractiveness is a source of inequality that impacts wages, grades, and even how others perceive a person's competence. Deseret News writer Lois Collins examined the study and joins McCann in the Culture segment to explain why she was surprised by some of the findings.
- The show concludes with "The Pulse," a weekly segment that rounds up topics generating chatter online.

January 19, 2014 On this week's "Deseret News Sunday Edition," Ravi Zacharias discusses religious freedom, a National Geographic picture spurs help for persecuted Christians, and writer Celia Baker explains Common Core.

- This week's show begins with a focus on faith and freedom. Ravi Zacharias is an internationally renowned Christian apologist and author. He believes the

ideas of secularization and pluralization have become distorted in today's culture. He discusses the key issues that surround life and liberty.

- The second segment of the show features an inspiring story about the power of a picture. A photograph tucked inside the pages of a National Geographic had a profound impact on the woman who took the picture and a man in Idaho who saw it. The two ended up joining forces to help a group of Christians in India who have been persecuted for their beliefs. According to a new Pew report, religious freedom is under increasing pressure around the world. Eric Schulzke has studied the issue and discusses the report with host Dave McCann.
- Common Core state standards are one of the most politicized and misunderstood changes in grade-school education. Teachers in most states are now using them in the classroom. Critics of the new standards believe there are few things more dangerous happening in the country. The standards were created by the National Governors Association and the Council of Chief State School Officers to improve academic achievement and increase accountability. In a four-part series, the Deseret News explores how teachers are incorporating Common Core. Reporter Celia Baker gives a preview and explains some of the misconceptions.

January 26, 2014

This week's "Deseret News Sunday Edition" takes a closer look at some of the social issues raised at Sundance, offers tips for identifying sneaky charges and checks "The Pulse."

- The Sundance Film Festival wrapped up this weekend. While it gets a lot of attention all over the world for the stars it attracts, the festival has also become a tool for increasing awareness of key global challenges, especially through documentaries. Dave McCann discusses some of the key issues raised with reporters Carole Mikita and Matthew Brown.
- Forget what is in your wallet and take a look at your bills if you want to save money. That's the advice from financial writer Michael De Groote. He joins McCann to discuss the items on your bill you need to watch for and also explains how you can get rid of phantom charges.
- National editor Allison Pond joins McCann to discuss the topics creating buzz on the Internet. She explains why minivans shouldn't be considered just a mom car and why toilet paper and diapers may be the key to figuring out a country's demographics. Pond and McCann also discuss Harvey Weinstein's decision to stop making violent films.

February 2, 2014

This week's "Deseret News Sunday Edition" takes a closer look at the National Edition, a "Mediatrician" explains how to keep kids healthy and an Olympian talks about juggling motherhood and competition.

- The Deseret News has been taking a new approach to covering news with the National Edition. A print subscription mailed directly to homes is now available in Utah and several other states around the country. Reporter Keith McCord discusses how this paper fills a gap for readers with Clark Gilbert, CEO and president of the Deseret News, and Paul Edwards, editor of the Deseret News.

- Comcast has been holding parental control seminars around the country, and that's where the Deseret News caught up with "Mediatrician" Michael Rich. He is the director of the Center on Media and Child Health at Children's Hospital Boston, Harvard Medical School and Harvard School of Public Health. He is also a parent. "As a former Hollywood filmmaker, I am a lover of media. But as a pediatrician, I see that media have both positive and negative effects on children's health," said Rich. He explains how to keep kids healthy in the Digital Age.
- This week, the world will begin watching some of the best athletes compete in the Winter Olympics. Most Olympians credit strong family support for getting them to the games. Family is so important to one athlete she actually never leaves home without them. Bobsledder Noelle Pikus-Pace travels to competitions around the world with her husband and children. She talks about the importance of family in a Kellogg's commercial. Pikus-Pace is not the only Olympic parent, but she is the only one who travels to every competition and training with her entire family. Dave McCann visited with Olympic freestyle skier Ashley Caldwell. She talked about the importance of her family and all the people she will be thinking about if she wins the gold.

March 2, 2014 On this week's "Deseret News National Edition," editors from The Atlantic and the Deseret News discuss the "Father Factor" series, the director of Stop Predatory Gambling explains the push to get government out of gambling, and Carole Mikita looks at the return of religious movies.

- The state of contemporary American fatherhood is the subject of a new editorial collaboration between The Atlantic and the Deseret News. The series, which is now online, looks at the social, cultural and economic factors affecting family life. Mike Headrick discussed the series with Eleanor Barkhorn, senior editor at The Atlantic, Paul Edwards, editor of the Deseret News, and Lois Collins, writer for the Deseret News.
- It is getting harder and harder for people at the bottom of the economic ladder to climb up. One group believes if lawmakers want to get serious about improving upward mobility they need to remove government from the gambling business. Deseret News reporter Eric Schulzke discussed this idea with Les Bernal, national director of Stop Predatory Gambling.
- "Son of God" opened in theaters over the weekend and it's getting plenty of buzz. Religion reporter Carole Mikita talked with producers Roma Downey and Mark Burnett about an emerging trend in biblical topics in movies.

March 9, 2014 On this week's "Deseret News National Edition," Deanie Wimmer discusses CPAC and religious freedom with Matt Brown and Mark Kellner, 'Tiger Mom' Amy Chua discusses her new book and Michael De Groote explains the pros and cons of buying a new versus old car.

- Religious liberty issues took center stage at the 2014 Conservative Political Action Conference or CPAC. Deanie Wimmer provides an overview of some of the pending cases that involve religious freedom and civil rights. She also discusses the CPAC conference with Deseret News editor Matt Brown and reporter Mark Kellner, who attended the conference in Washington, D.C.
- ‘Tiger Mom’ Amy Chua has gotten a lot of praise and criticism for her ideas on parenting. Her latest book "The Triple Package" is stirring some pretty heated discussion with a list of religious and ethnic groups. In a phone interview, Chua explains why she feels a lot of the media coverage has misrepresented her books.
- When it comes to buying a car some people wonder, is it better to buy old or new? Financial writer Michael DeGroot explains why the old wisdom doesn't necessarily ring true anymore.

On this week's Deseret News National Edition, Dave McCann discusses mental illness, the religious connections to the new 'Cosmos' TV show and a variety of other topics.

- Mental illness is a major health concern that impacts many families. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration recently released the latest estimated rates of mental illness among adults. According to the survey, Utah has the highest rate followed by Oklahoma, West Virginia, Oregon and Washington. New Jersey, Illinois, Nevada, Connecticut and North Carolina have the lowest rates. Dave McCann discusses the report with Dr. Peter Delany director of SAMHSA's Center for Behavioral Health Statistics and Quality. And Deanie Wimmer shares the story of a family living with mental illness. Wendy Fayles had to check her daughter into a psychiatric hospital when she was 12 years old. A decade later Fayles and her daughter Kelsey explain how the experience shaped their lives and how they have found hope and healing. Deseret News writer Lois Collins has covered mental health issues for years. She and McCann discuss how media coverage has changed and what needs to be done to erase stigmas.
- Editor Matt Brown delivers The Pulse and explains why the movie "Noah" will arrive in theaters with a disclaimer. He also discusses why the "Cosmos" series is being criticized for portraying religion and believers unfairly. Brown and McCann also talked about the future of public libraries.
- It's not live from New York on Saturday Night but it comes from a place some people might associate with sketch TV comedy shows, but it is picking up fans around the country. Peter Rosen explains.
- Finally this week, a story that is sure to inspire. The Paralympic Games conclude tonight in Sochi. We caught up with an American mom before she left. She competed in several Alpine ski events, careening down hills at break neck speeds - blind. And Wimmer discovered the driving force behind it all - is love.

Health care is no game, but will your family "win or lose" under the Affordable Care Act? Though loud voices on both sides are working to characterize it as either a brilliant triumph or a complete failure the experiences of the families you are about to meet sum up the one thing families know for certain about this foray into health care reform. How well it works depends on your individual situation, Richard Piatt reports.
- New research shows that even more chemicals than previously thought can cause brain damage and behavioral disorders and some of those chemicals are found in products that we use in our homes every day. Deseret News reporter Lane Anderson explains why it is hard to avoid these chemicals and possible solutions.
- National editor Allison Pond wraps up the show with The Pulse.

The KSL Junior Weather Specialists (formerly Weather Labs) is a weather/science program for fourth graders. They are conducted at the Discovery Gateway Museum on Wednesday mornings (except the third Wednesday of each month). A limited number of on-site school visits are also made. Schools participating come from the public, private, charter, web-based and home school sectors.

During each session schoolchildren, their teachers, administrators, and parents go to Discovery Gateway, a Salt Lake City-based children's museum, to meet with one of KSL's meteorologists to learn about science, weather, and broadcasting. Each group and experiment is taped for future on-air use.

The KSL Junior Weather Specialists is also available on ksl.com. Within the site one can find information such as "ask the Meteorologist," weather folklore, weather games, weather experiments, weather safety, and weather facts. Also, students and parents can click on and see streaming video of previously aired segments.
