Local event: (54sec)

Interviewed Darrel Tedisch, the City of Albany's Emergency Management Specialist who says they have identified 8 natural hazards that can have an effect on the City and it's citizens to varying degrees. This includes: Flooding to Earthquakes to Droughts. The Albany Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan is up for review to be updated next year (2015). Local Event: (35 sec)

Interviewed Michelle Godfrey of the Oregon Department of Transportation regarding the Oregon Road Usage Charge Program. This is the first of it's kind Mile Usage pilot program for vehicles in the state that tries to tap dwindling revenue to pay for highways. With the increase in electric and hybrid cars the gas tax is fading there and there is concern about trying to keep the infrastructure in the state up to standards. The program was established by the legislature last year and again on a volunteer basis at first with plans to go into effect July of next year.

Interview Albany City Manager Wes Hare about a portion of the City's Municipal Code dealing with second-hand dealers. The city council in several worksessions were attempting to put in place a city-wide ordinance covering various restrictions and enforcement of so-called panhandlers and second-hand dealers. (Eventually the ordinance was approved)
