Local event (39 seconds)

Interview with Rebecca Wires, Lebanon Senior Center Activities Planner at the Lebanon Senior Center regarding an upcoming event: "Silver Follies" scheduled for September 16th providing an opportunity for seniors, 50 years and older to show off their talent on stage...whether it be singing, dancing or perhaps showing a painting that they have done or a quilting piece.

Interview with Linn County Roadmaster, Darrin Lane regarding construction work in the county on various roads updating by slurry-seal and other forms of pavement on various sections of the county, plus the latest information on the construction on signal lights and other improvements to highway 34 and Seven Mile Lane Intersection near the freeway.

Local event: (56 seconds)

Interview with the City of Albany spokesperson, Marilyn Smith regarding the Albany City Council awarding a low bid of 19-and-a-half million dollars to Gerding Builders of Corvallis for the new Police and Fire Stations. Groundbreaking will be held on August 9th and work will be completed on both stations in early Spring of 2017

Aired on KSHO (7/12-13 2016) on various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (50 seconds)

Interview with Linn County Commissioner Will Tucker regarding the recent Linn County Fair which he reported had a record turnout at 30-thousand-47 fairgoers for the four days, beating the old record by approximately 1-thousand people. And a half-a-million dollars was raised in the 4-H, FFA Auction for students and the livestock program.

Aired on KSHO (7/18-19 2016) on various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (43 seconds)

Interview with Pat Hare, City Administrator for Adair Village who noted that construction would begin at the end of the month on two water storage tanks which should help the constant loss of water in the old pre world war II TANKS. The cost of the project: 2.5 million dollars with 500-thousand dollars in forgivable loans to the city. Hare said this will be the largest capital improvement project Adair Village has had since incorporation.

These are some issues the KSHO staff deemed as important to our listening audience:

Local event: (55 seconds)

Interview with Charlie Fautin, Deputy Director for Benton County's Health Department discussing the latest information on the Zika Virus in this State and Locally Blood Services throughout the country is beginning to test all blood donations regarding the Virus. However, as of now there is no Zika contaminant in blood in our area. But, he says they are watching closely for any travelers or tourists coming into the area who might be carrying the mosquito virus.

Aired on KSHO (9/1-2 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (61 seconds)

Interview with Albany State Representative Andy Olson regarding a state legislative committee he is a part of discussing transportation improvements in Oregon. The committee is meeting in various cities around Oregon to collect information and report back to the 2017 legislative session. He mentioned that he was most concerned locally with the heavy traffic on Interstate 5 from Eugene to Salem and would hope extra lanes could eventually be constructed, but funding is still the main obstacle.

Aired on KSHO (9/7-8 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (31 seconds)

Interview with Drew Robertson with the Community Service's Consortium about the Youth/Build/AmeriCorps program. The program is hiring mentors to guide youth in their young lives in east Linn County and the Lebanon area. The age group to become a YouthBuild mentor is around 21.

Aired on KSHO (9/19-20 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (83 seconds)

Interview with Angela Beers-Seydel in the Springfield ODOT office regarding the continued closure of the Sheep Creek Bridge East of Sweet Home on Highway 20. The closure has caused major concerns for motorists traveling to and from Central Oregon into the Mid-Willamette Valley with closure announced earlier at approximately 8 weeks. (Subsequently the bridge opened up in the last week of September)
