Interview with Patrick Rollens, Public Information Officer for the City of Corvallis regarding the first City Council meeting of the new year in which the council learned about a charter amendment that is expected to be on the May Primary Ballot. In addition they learned of a proposal from the City Manager, Mark Shepard regarding a strategic operational plan when it comes to future meetings of the council. This would be breaking down goals at worksession by the council that will be worked out at council meetings on a timely basis. The council agreed to the proposal.

The council agreed to the use of the emergency clause allowing a special meeting to hold the third and final reading of the ordinance to confirm its existence in the city code. The ordinance established a 100 ft buffer for siting of a marijuana facility from residential areas. The state law provides a 1,000ft distances around schools.

Provided a repor on the much anticipated vote on whether Benton County would opt-in or opt-out of the Linn County 1.4 billion dollar class action lawsuit against the state claiming the Oregon Department of Forestry breached its contract with 15 counties, including Benton, was held in Corvallis by the three commissioners. Lili a' Neville, Benton County spokesperson reported the vote count to us and the reasoning behind it. She told us the Commissioners vote 2 to 1 to Opt-in. The Commissioners had until today, January 25th to vote on the issue.
