These are some issues the KSHO staff deemed as important to our listening audience:

Local event: (56 seconds)

Interview with Marilyn Smith, Public Information Officer for the City of Albany about a request from the Albany Library Board to the City Council to make the campuses at both city Libraries, that is the Downtown Carnegie Library and the Main Library on 14th Avenue, smoke free. The council decided on a 3 to 3 vote with Mayor Konopa breaking the tie to prohibit any kind of smoking on library property.

Aired on KSHO (10/6 2016) newscasts throughout the day.

Local event: (40 seconds)

Interview with Linn County Commissioner John Lindsey on a recent court decision affecting a case between the County and the State Forestry Department regarding the management of County Forest Lands. The County has claimed mis-management of the lands and revenue from them in million dollar lawsuit. This week the court decided agreed the county could enter into a class action suit against the state with other counties...now known as the 1.4 billion dollar lawsuit.

Aired on KSHO 10/6-7 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (53 seconds)

The Greater Albany School Board in regular session received information that indicated the District's K-12 enrollment is up from the previous year. District Spokesman, Jim Haggart added that while the number of students actually enrolled in each classroom varied, the date indicated that many of the District's schools are already at or above capacity.

Aired on KSHO 10-19-20 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (49 seconds)

Interview with Dale Stowell, Spokesman for Linn Benton Community College on the grand opening of the home of LBCC's Advanced Transportation Technology Center Phase 2 in Lebanon. This involves a 37-thousand square foot structure to train students in heavy equipment, diesel repair and an innovation center. Construction was made possible from a 34-million dollar bond that local voters passed in 2014, backed up by state and federal funding.

Local event: (31 seconds)

Interview with Jeff Powers in the Benton County Natural Areas andPak Department about feed back they received from the public concerning the North Albany County Park. The county has been working on a master plan for the park which involves increasing trails and add playground construction to the park, plus other amenities. He said they hope to have worked out the proposed ideas by mid-December. However, funding is still not available for any improvements.

Aired on KSHO (12/6-7 2016) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (59 seconds)

Interview with Patrick Rollens, Public Information Officer for the City of Corvallis regarding a recent city council meeting in which the council approved the city as a 'Sanctuary City' after standing room only meetings where the public encouraged the designation. A Sanctuary City provides defending people regarding freedom of discrimination for all people, whether they be Hispanic, Black, Gay, of any religious affiliation and more.

Aired on KSHO(12/8-9) in various newscasts throughout those days.

Local event: (45 seconds)

Coverage of the Lebanon Pioneer Elementary School all assembly event in which the “Educator of the Year Award” was given out by the Milken Family Foundation to 3rd Grade Teacher, Lisa Richard. Richard was interviewed by Jeff McMahan of the KGAL staff and Eads Broadcasting Owner Mary Eads reported on the event in several newscasts.
