Local event: 40 seconds

Interview with Linn County Sheriff Office Lt. Joe Larsen, who heads up the County Search and Rescue program and talks about the recruiting process for their 10 day summer training program. This involves youth between the ages of ages of 14 and 18, both young men and women. The training Academy will be held June 17th through the 26th. The youth must sign up two attend at least one recruit meeting prior to the Training Academy and hold oral interviews, a background check and physical aptitude test.
