Puerto Ricans are fleeing their hurricane ravaged island and are pouring into the U.S. mainland. Many are bound for Florida, which is already home to more than a million Puerto Ricans, or nearly a fifth of the 5.4 million living in the 50 states. Local officials and volunteers are already scrambling to help thousands of new arrivals find new homes, jobs and schools. Millions of Americans provide their services as caregivers to relatives or friends who need help taking care of themselves, helping with daily tasks such as personal care, housework and medication administration. However, Hispanic caregivers spend most of their time caring for their loved ones, with more than 80 hours of dedicated service per month - almost twice as many hours as white. In the aftermath of Hurricane Irma and Maria many pets joined the ranks of strays, precariously living on Florida and Puerto Rico's streets.
