Dear Mr. Emmer:

On November 24, 2004, on behalf of Cebridge Connections ("Cebridge") you filed a Petition for Partial Stay and a Petition for Partial Reconsideration of the Media Bureau's *Memorandum Opinion and Order* (DA 04-3344) released October 25, 2004. The Order granted Shawnee Broadcasting, Inc. ("Shawnee"), licensee of KQOK-TV, Shawnee, Oklahoma, a mandatory carriage complaint against Cebridge for failure to carry KQOK on Cebridge's systems serving Anadarko, Purcell, Weatherford and Woodward, Oklahoma.

Subsequently, on January 11, 2005, counsel for Oklahoma Land Company LLC ("OLC"), the new licensee of Television Station KQOK, Shawnee, Oklahoma, and successor-in-interest to Shawnee, informed the Commission that after discussions with Cebridge, OLC agrees that carriage of KQOK on Cebridge's cable systems at this time is technically impractical. Therefore, the issues involved in Shawnee's initial complaint are now moot. OLC now requests that the must carry complaint filed by Shawnee be withdrawn and dismissed without prejudice. Accordingly, OLC's Voluntary Withdrawal of Must Carry Complaint is accepted and the must carry complaint is dismissed.

In view of the foregoing, pursuant to Section 0.283 of the Commission's rules, the Petitions for Stay and Reconsideration filed by Cebridge Connections on November 24, 2004 are hereby dismissed as moot.
