Sarah’s death shocks the film community. Director, Randall Miller and others are now facing criminal charges for involuntary manslaughter and have pleaded not guilty, but has Miller previously been cavalier about safety during filming. Chris Connelly reports.
- Our lives are literally in their hands. But when a first responder makes a mistake, you could be on your own. Medic Mills, a 77-year-old man in Washington DC, had a heart attack right near a firehouse, but the firefighters refused to help him, and when his daughter called 911, the dispatcher sent the ambulance to a wrong address miles away. Are the stresses of their jobs hurting us? Jim Avila reports.
- So many of us have done it -- caught a few ‘zzzs’ on the job. Some 21<sup>st</sup> century companies even offer nap rooms.
