Or will they let him be thrown back out onto the street?
- Buy Me Weed (OAD: February 2, 2016): A small group of underage-teens are waiting outside a store that sells medical marijuana. As customers walk towards the store, the teens beg them to buy some marijuana for them. Will anyone purchase marijuana for these teens? And what will happen if the teens are boys versus girls?
- Litterbug (OAD: February 2, 2016): Portland's been called the greenest city in America. How will people react when they see our actors carelessly littering?
- Rude Barista (OAD: February 2, 2016): Portland's coffee houses are their modern day cathedrals. How will people react when a rude barista treats customers as if they are incapable of giving coffee the respect it deserves? What would you do?

#### Friday, July 15, 2016

- Stealing Employee: Nearly \$15 billion worth of goods go missing from U.S. retailers by employees every year. An employee is stealing expensive jewelry from the store where he works. Will any of the customers alert the manager or confront this employee?
- Forced Out of the Closet: At a restaurant, two gay teenage boys are threatening to "out" their closeted gay friend on Facebook. They're fed up with his hiding himself and believe that living openly is best, but he just isn't ready. How will the other patrons react?
- Rehab Bartender: Two bar patrons are pressuring our recovering alcoholic bartender to take shots with them. Will any of the other customers say something?
- Sneaker Swap: Two conniving customers at a shoe store are swapping their old shoes with a new pair in the box. They begin walking out of the store in the new pair without paying, even handing the clerk the box with the old shoes while wearing the new ones. Will anyone stop them or tell an employee?
- Atlanta Beauty Shop: How will customers react when a white man comes in to meet his black girlfriend who is getting her hair done at a salon in Atlanta? When our actor, playing a hairdresser, starts making rude comments, will the customers agree with her or will they stick up for the interracial couple?

#### Friday, July 22, 2016

- HIV+: Atlanta has one of the country's highest rates of people diagnosed with HIV/AIDS. The hardest hit is the city's African-American gay community. At a restaurant in downtown Atlanta, a young man reveals to his friend that he has just tested positive for HIV. His friend reacts negatively and has a lot of questions about the subject. As the friend grows uncomfortable, will other people at the restaurant step-in?
- Poor Family: A mother can't afford to buy her son the toy she promised him for getting straight "As" because they need the money to put food on the table. How will the people of Marietta, Georgia, react?
- Pray Away the Gay: Conservative, Christian parents just can't accept that their teenage son is gay. In a desperate attempt to "fix" him, they have their pastor try to "pray the gay out of him." What will onlookers do?
- Picky Eater: A diner can't decide what she wants to order, so she starts asking strangers if she can sample their food. Will they let her have a try?
- At the Club: Two girls are in line at a nightclub, excited about their night out. When they finally make it to the front of the line, the bouncer has a very strict and offensive admission policy, berating one of the girls about how she is not thin enough to get in. How will bystanders respond?

#### Friday, July 29, 2016

- Adderall Addiction: Two male college students in a bar start popping Adderall and drinking alcohol to stay up and party. They try to convince the girl they are with to join them. Will anyone try to stop the students from this potentially dangerous behavior?

- On the DL: A husband and wife are having lunch, celebrating their anniversary. They seem to be in love, but the husband keeps getting distracted by the texts on his phone. When the wife goes to the bathroom, a man comes in and kisses her husband on the lips. It's obvious he's cheating on his wife with this man. When the wife returns the boyfriend leaves and hides. Will customers say something?
- Parental Approval: A girl is introducing her parents, who are visiting from out of town, to her boyfriend. He arrives, and her family is surprised to see that he is in a wheelchair – something they are not happy about. When he goes to the bathroom, they express their disapproval, making derogatory remarks. How will customers react?
- Shopping While Black (OAD: 5/23/14): An African American man is shopping at an upscale clothing store near Wall Street. A salesperson tells the shopper he is watching him and asks if he can even afford to shop at the store. Continuing to follow the shopper, the salesperson tells him they don't have any "urban" clothes in this store. Eventually, the salesperson calls the security guard over to pat him down before he leaves the store. Will anyone defend the shopper from being racially profiled? "Shark Tank" host and entrepreneur Daymond John joins Quinones to discuss the results. What happens when Daymond John plays the part of the profiled shopper?
- Snarky Ventriloquist: A snarky ventriloquist street performer is berating passersby with inappropriate jokes. Will anyone stand up to the ventriloquist?

#### Friday, August 5, 2016

- Car Trouble (OAD 1/26/16): On a suburban street outside an ice-cream shop, a woman makes it clear she is having trouble changing her flat tire. Will a passerby stop to help her? What will responses be when she is wearing a traditional Muslim hijab?
- Diet Pills (OAD 1/26/16): Three teenage girls are out to lunch when two of them start to peer pressure the third into taking diet pills. As they try to convince their friend to take the pills, the pressured teen grows more skeptical. Will bystanders say anything?
- Sore Loser Dad (OAD 1/26/16): A coach takes his little league team out for ice cream after a hard-fought game. He offers to buy everyone ice cream, except his son, telling his son that his strike-out ended the game; therefore, he gets no ice cream. The son is visibly upset, telling his dad that he tried his best. The coach doesn't want to hear it, saying he wasn't good enough and needs to try harder to earn the ice cream. Will the other patrons say something?
- We're Having a Girl (OAD 1/26/16): While out to eat, a pregnant wife tells her husband the exciting news that they are having a girl. The only problem? They already have two girls and wants a boy. What will fellow diners do when they witness his very obvious displeasure?
- Online Predator 2 (OAD 1/26/16): At a café, a 16-year-old boy is waiting to finally meet up with a girl he met online – a girl he thinks is his age. But when she turns out to be an older woman in her 40's, he can't decide whether he should leave with her. Will fellow patrons say anything?

#### Friday, August 12, 2016

- Baby in a Hot Car (OAD: 8/8/14): A mother leaves what appears to be a child in the car to run an errand. When passersby hear the child crying, how will they react? How will people react when it's a dad who leaves the child in the car?
- Alzheimer's Abuse (OAD: 2/9/16): While she's supposed to be taking him out for a day on the town, a caregiver takes advantage of her dementia patient's short-term memory—or lack thereof—to take a personal day of her own. At a nail salon, the caretaker is dismissive and downright insulting to her patient while using his credit card to pay for her manicure, but she explains to onlookers that it's fine, because he won't remember in five minutes anyway. Will any of the customers stick up for the patient and tell her that she is wrong for treating him this way?
- Portland Predator (OAD: 2/9/16): A 15 year-old girl with a guitar is at a café studying when an older man approaches. He claims to have a music studio at his home and invites the teen back to his house to "jam." Our teen is intrigued but suspicious. As our stranger becomes more and more insistent, will bystanders come to her aid before she leaves with a complete stranger?
- Steroid Situation (OAD: 2/9/16): A group of three high school jocks are grabbing a meal. Two of the guys start telling their friend that the way to grow muscles and become faster is to take steroids. They tell him "Steroids is the way to go. It really enhances your performance. It's not dangerous at all." He's skeptical, but they are persistent. Will anyone step in to stop this peer pressure?
- Car Dealership: When a man walks into a dealership looking to buy a car, he is greeted by a friendly saleswoman. This car buyer will have none of it. Women can't possibly sell cars. They don't know what they're talking about. The car buyer asks for a different salesperson, insulting the saleswoman in front of other customers. Will someone stand up for the saleswoman?

#### Friday, August 19, 2016

- Veteran (OAD 7/17/15): San Antonio has one of the nation's largest active and retired military populations. So what will happen when a military veteran at the check-out counter does not have enough money to buy his groceries? How will other shoppers react?
- Interracial Couple (OAD 7/17/15): A Hispanic man and his Caucasian girlfriend are on a date at a local San Antonio restaurant when they begin to be harassed by another customer, a Hispanic woman. She tells them that they should stick to their own kind and that races should not mix. How will bystanders react?
- Young Guns (OAD 7/17/15): At a gun store, a father wants to buy his son his first gun for his seventh birthday. But a customer confronts the father telling him the son is too young and the father is being irresponsible buying him a gun. How will other shoppers react?
- PDA (OAD 7/17/15): A female customer expresses her displeasure when two cowboys hold hands and kiss while sitting at a BBQ restaurant in Blanco, Texas. How will other customers respond?
- Rude Street Musician (OAD 7/17/15): A street musician is playing his guitar at a busy plaza. He is singing songs with lyrics that include obnoxious and rude descriptions of the people walking by. How will people react?

#### Friday, August 26, 2016

- Interracial Couple: An interracial couple in their early 20s is in love and getting married. The parents of the bride-to-be know she is dating someone new, but don't know that her fiancé is Asian. When they meet for the first time, they learn the truth and tell their daughter it's unacceptable. How will bystanders react?
- Nannygate: A Father is having an inappropriate relationship with his baby's nanny. Will any of the patrons say something to the father, nanny or to the mother?
- Shoplifting Granny: A seemingly innocent elderly woman browsing in a store shoplifts. How will the other customers respond?
- Inappropriate Dad: A son introduces his new girlfriend to his father. When the son steps away, the father hits on his son's girlfriend. He tells her how beautiful she is, how the two of them should spend time together, and how she should be with a real man because his son is a kid. Will someone tell the son or tell the father to stop the inappropriate behavior?
- Domestic Abuse: A husband and wife are shopping when he begins to verbally abuse her. Will any of the shoppers defend the wife and tell the man to stop?

#### Friday, September 2, 2016

- Concerned Mom: A mother is with her son at a sporting goods store. She is trying to buy the son a new pair of soccer cleats, when the son sees a pair of football cleats. He tells his mom he wants to play football instead, and she immediately shuts the idea down. Mom cites the health concerns regarding the sport, especially given the recent attention paid to CTE, caused by repeated blows to the head. The son tries to plead with the mom, but she isn't budging. Will any of the other customers interject?
- Children Ask Customers for a Lighter: New York State law says minors cannot buy tobacco products, and in some counties they must be 21 to purchase them. But there is no law that prohibits minors from smoking if they get their hands on a cigarette. What will passers-by do when two 12-year-old boys ask for a light? What will they do when two 12-year-old girls ask?
- Angry Teens: A teenage boy is using his mother's guilt over her divorce to try to get an expensive pair of shoes. Loudly, in the middle of the store, he yells, "You're so stupid. No wonder why Dad left," and "This is exactly why I want to live with Dad!" How will the patrons react? What if it is a teenage girl saying this to her mother?
- Accessible Parking: Two people without disabilities park in an accessible spot, just because they don't feel like parking in a spot further from the door. Will anyone say something?
- Hibachi Chef From Hell (OAD 7/24/15): Customers at a Hibachi restaurant want great food and a fun show to go along with it. What happens when customers end up with the worst Hibachi cook of all time? He barely knows how to use his tools and he can't do the basic tricks. Will they tell the manager and ask for a new chef?

Money is being withdrawn, and when the card is used to order a pizza, police are there for the delivery. Expecting to find Sam, police instead find a bunch of hungry teenagers. As the thespian attempts to act his way out of the interrogation room, he confesses to his additional roles as thief and double-murderer. But why did he kill Sam and Julie?

Private Investigator Dave Marshburn believes he has found someone who's handwriting matches the writing on the take-out bag. The rescue would eventually involve the help of over a hundred volunteers and end with 16,000 mourners gathering within 17 hours of the tragedy.

The truck driver was killed; Kelli's car was left dangling over a guardrail 100 feet above the burning truck and she was alive, along with her daughters, 10-year-old Sage and 10-month-old Mylo. Nearly the entire event was captured live on TV and on rescue workers' helmet cameras in some of the most terrifying crash video ever to hit the air.

### **Murder in the Maternity Ward**

Rick Worthington, a father of eight, burst into Alta View Hospital demanding to find the doctor who performed a tubal ligation surgery on his wife two years earlier claiming the doctor performed the procedure without his wife's knowledge or consent while she was sleeping.

Jae Lowder and Cindy Tovey were at the hospital at the time and were caught in a violent hostage crisis. Glade Curtis, sharing his story for the first time ever on television, was the doctor Worthington came to kill. He was at Alta View that night and called 911; no one did more to keep moms and babies alive than the nurses, including Margie Wyler, who helped a mom deliver her baby during the crisis, and Karla Roth, who sacrificed her own life in a brave attempt to wrestle a gun away from Worthington.

**Tragedy In Tornado Alley**

On May 20, 2013, just after 1PM, the Storm Prediction Center issued a tornado watch for Eastern Oklahoma. Across town, another EMS crew waits anxiously with firemen while police try and persuade a "jumper" to come down from the roof of a building.

Saturday, August 6, 2016

Married couple Rob and Kim Stearns struggle to pull a drowning man from a frigid river. Both EMTs, not only do they share a home, but they also share an ambulance.

Also in this episode, colleagues Zackary Randall and Terry Mentele face a different challenge—calming a hysterical 6-year-old who fell out of bed and fractured his arm. And everybody's favorite boss, Lt. John Cotter, responds to a building set ablaze after a resident forgets to extinguish a scented candle.
