Government	6pm	7/5/2023	:49	Governor Tony Evers signing Wisconsin's two-year budget into law today while using his authority to veto 51 provisions in the GOP created plan. Following the signing today the governor stopped by a farm in Bangor. That's where News 19's Bowen Kedrowicz caught up with him and Bowen what are some of the highlights of what made it through the partial vetoes? Governor Evers says with his vetoes he is set to provide 15 million dollars for childcare providers and increase funding for K-12 schools across the state by 325-dollars per student unless undone by future lawmakers during the governor's time at the farm. He also highlighted 125 million dollars to help fight pfas contaminants in drinking water around the state but he says it is not enough just to provide clean water but also hold those who damage public wells accountable. Governor Evers says that while the budget is improved it is not complete the governor says this move will give the legislature a "second chance" to finish the budget work and provide more help for childcare in Wisconsin.

News 19's Chandler Brindley had the opportunity to take a walk through the facility and find out more about it located on the 5th floor of the UW La Crosse Health Science Center is the Gundersen Lutheran Bio Bank which houses thousands of tissues and blood samples used for research. Director Paraic Kenny says the bank was started when there was not much cancer research happening. The Bio Bank has grown tremendously since its beginning. Kenny says this is a neat resource for a community the size of la crosse. And the sole purpose of the bank cancer research has really taken off. Bio banks allow doctors like Kenny to narrow down types of cancers and find new treatments. Doctor Kenny says donations to the biobank are important because patients will benefit from it in the future.

The names of the two men and the girl have not been released. However, the Goodhue County sheriff's office says all three were from the same household. The swimmers were part of a family gathering Monday night when they began to struggle in the water, sadly drowning minutes later.

Sheriff Roy Torgerson spoke on the matter. News 19's Chandler Brindley was in Hillsboro today. Chandler, what did the sheriff tell us? Late last week investigators were looking for individuals who broke into a home just north of the city of Hillsboro sheriff Torgerson luckily reached out to social media and local news outlets for help in finding the suspects several photos from surveillance cameras as well as a tip led officials to Tomah. By Monday July 3 rd the first of three suspects were taken into custody. Torgerson appreciates the help from neighboring Tomah police in the case. The three men arrested were blaze rouse, joseph Trumble, and Dustin Sprague all from Tomah. According to Torgerson all three men currently charged with burglary. Recovered stolen items included the 8 firearms all three men are due back in Vernon County court on august 2 nd . Rouse and Sprague are in the Vernon County jail on \$5,000 cash bonds. Trumble was released on a \$3,000 signature bond.

The tri county hospital in Whitehall is getting a major upgrade. The brand-new facility priced at 51 million dollars will gain a 50 % increase in patient capacity. That is double the space they have now. The new facility stresses the importance of healthcare in rural Wisconsin. The new hospital features state-of-the-art amenities for care. The hospital will also include brand new state-of-the-art operating rooms, private pre and post op rooms that were not offered before as well as specialty services for the specialists that travel to Whitehall. One of the registered nurses of the hospital shared that there is quite a buzz between workers at the hospital. Tri county hospital will also include a much-needed space for emergency vehicles. With a new facility comes new technology. One of the major improvements coming to the new facility is a med-flight landing pad. Officials said prior to the re-build patients would be flown to the fire station then taken by e-m-s to tri-county hospital

Six people were injured when grant fired at people, he was involved with in an altercation earlier that night grant's next hearing is set for July 27. he remains in La Crosse County jail on a one-million-dollar cash bond.

Crime	6pm	7/14/2023	:37	A La Crosse man is facing four counts of possession of child pornography enhanced because he is a repeat offender. 42-year-old Donovan Cadogan back in court this week. The criminal complaint shows investigators received a tip from the national center for missing and exploited children saying they discovered Cadogan had child porn in his possession. Police then found images on a flash drive and on Cadogan's phone. Cadogan was previously found guilty of child enticement and indecent exposure so he is facing enhanced penalties. If convicted of all charges he could face more than 75 years in prison and upwards of 300 thousand dollars in fines
Health	6pm	7/14/2023	:26	The Wisconsin Department of natural resources issued a statewide air quality advisory today. Officials say the advisory went into effect at noon and will last until noon on Sunday. You can see the sky a little hazy in this drone video of West Salem earlier today. The air quality is unhealthy for sensitive groups of those with pre-existing health conditions. This again coming from smoke from wildfires in Canada.

Minnesota State College southeast in Winona recently took home 100-thousand dollars and the national title in the project m-f-g advanced manufacturing championship. Teams were tasked with machining hip replacement parts on a 5-axis machine as well as welding a small-scale autoclave pressure vessel. They were judged on their machining, programming, welding, cost tracking, and time management. The benefits for students go beyond just the prize or prestige. The prize money is being shared 50-50 with the students and the school plans to use its share as seed money to add a new 5-axis machine for the advanced manufacturing lab.

It's expected to include mixed use real estate featuring apartments in six buildings, 30-thousand square feet of commercial and community space and outdoor green space. They say the delay is the result of an unforeseen rise in construction costs over the past 12 to 18 months combined with supply chain issues. They also mention rising interest rates impacting the area. But 360's development director Jeremy Novak says. The community is excited about the project and they will see it through adding "it is a matter of when we start, not if."
Ind/Bus	6pm	7/20/2023	:31	The sun is shining bright on Wisconsin's economy as the solar industry is witnessing a significant surge in job opportunities across the state. Last year the interstate renewable energy council says the solar industry added 332 jobs for over 32-hundred workers. The rapid increase of interest in solar power by consumers is causing solar-related services to hire as quickly as they can to meet the demand. With an 11% industry growth in 2022 solar appears to have a very bright future especially for those looking to get into the work force. Some of the factors as to why solar power is becoming so popular is due to the lower cost due to tax credits and long-term payoff. Not to mention a smaller carbon footprint as well as sustainability. Once a solar panel is installed it can last over 25 years at full power.
Health	6pm	7/20/2023	:22	We're learning more about the newly FDA approved RSV treatment for infants. The drug is used for babies born during or entering their first RSV season. It is not a vaccine but is an injection used to treat the seasonal illness that ramps up in the fall and is transmitted from close contact with an infected person. Experts at Mayo Clinic say children with high risk are more susceptible. A common RSV symptom is oxygen levels dropping, which can cause blueness around the lips and difficulty feeding. The CDC is expected to review and give its final approval for the drug on August 3rd.

News 19s Chandler Brindley stopped in Winona to find out what sort of impact some are now expecting. August 1st marks the first day of legalization of recreational marijuana in the State of Minnesota. The legalization of cannabis is leading to some concerns and changes that are being made to cater to the law because of the change sheriff Ganrude says there is some training that law enforcement will need to go through. What does this training include? Winona State University will not be altering its substance policy with the law change but rather this gives an opportunity for updating terminology. McDowell says that the university will look to other states for changes to its protocol regarding substance use. Sheriff Ganrude says that this law is similar to the open bottle law for alcohol and will be treated the same.

The Vernon County sheriff's office says last Friday night around 10 pm 17-year-old Marvin Miller, 20-year-old Ervin J Miller and a 12-year-old boy were riding a toy wagon downhill near La Farge. The wagon went off the road down an embankment and hit a tree, ejecting all three from the wagon. Ervin miller was able to call for help. The 12-year-old suffered serious injuries and was later transferred to Madison. Lifesaving efforts were unsuccessful for 17-year-old Marvin Miller who died on the scene. Authorities are continuing to look into the incident.

Government	6pm	8/15/2023	:29	A newly proposed bill would allow Wisconsin state parks passes to be valid for a full year no matter when you buy them. Right now - a pass is only good for the calendar year, so whether you bought it in January or in august, it's only good until December 31 of that year. A bill from two republican lawmakers would change that making passes good for an entire year based on month of sale. So, if you bought it in August of 2023, it would be good until August of 2024. The bill is still circulating for co-sponsors.
Government	6pm	8/15/2023	:38	A unanimous vote by the la crescent city council last night outlaws the use of marijuana in public spaces this includes both indoor and outdoor places that are used by the public whether that be owned or operated by public or private interests. That includes both smoking and imbibing cannabis products. La Crescent mayor Mike Poellinger says this ordinance, something of a mix of common alcohol and tobacco limits is also a safety measure. Violation of this ordinance can be punishable by a petty misdemeanor. People are still able to use these now legal products within their private residences including yards.
Ind/Bus	10pm	8/15/2023	:21	Wisconsin cranberry farmers can expect to see a larger harvest than last year. Crop projections from the u-s cranberry marketing committee said that the state should see an increase of one hundred fifty thousand barrels from 2022. Wisconsin is set to produce roughly sixty percent of the nation's supply of cranberries this year harvest begins in late September.

The school built in 1924 is an example of what's called neoclassical architecture. He said the system plans to submit a proposal to spend the money on engineering, data, science, and nursing programs. Republicans have said the system could get the money if it uses it to develop the state's workforce. Gop leaders have said the \$32 million is what they estimated the system would spend on diversity, equity, and inclusion programs.

The motion made public today argues justice Protasiewicz cannot fairly hear these cases because during her campaign. She called the state's GOP drawn maps "unfair" and "rigged". Despite the comments justice Protasiewicz did not specifically say how she might rule on such cases and did not commit to recusing herself from such cases. However, she did say she would recuse from cases brought by the Wisconsin democratic party which donated nearly 10 million dollars toward her campaign.

Data from the Wisconsin department of health services show Wisconsin saw more than 53-hundred cases of Lyme disease in 2022. News 19s Chandler Brindley tells us about how Gundersen Health System is doing research toward the disease. Lyme disease is the most common vector-borne disease in the United States according to the CDC and transmitted to humans by ticks. Research is being done at Gundersen Health System to better understand the disease. Dr. Sabin says some of the work being done at Gundersen is to advance research toward tests. Gundersen Health System infection interventionist Brian Simmons mentioning that Wisconsin is one of the states that reports high numbers of Lyme disease every year. Wisconsin and the us continue to see a rise in Lyme disease with Nebraska having its first case in 2021. With testing and research continuing at Gundersen. In the meantime, Simmons added that wearing loose fitting clothing when in tall grass or wooded areas and some bug sprays will prevent your chances of getting Lyme diseases from a tick bite. He will, however, transition into a faculty position at the university. Gow became chancellor in 2007 and is the longest serving active chancellor in the UW-System the second longest serving chancellor in school history. Tackling loans with the largest interest rates first can mean paying less money in the long run but at the very least she says to make the minimum payments. And if you're unable to there are resources available. You can start with student aid dot gov to research repayment programs such as an income driven plan and look into what types of deferment or forbearance options may be available to you based on a change of circumstance over the last three years. Irwin says the last thing you want to do is miss a payment which can impact your credit score and affect things like your ability to borrow money for a car or home.

Wave of Deceit

Texas housewife Laura Day seemed to have it all: a large home on the water, a loving marriage with her husband, David Syring, and a close relationship with her 6-year-old stepson, Taylor Syring. But, when Taylor drowned on a beach trip with Day under suspicious circumstances, police discovered her shocking criminal past, and the façade of her picture-perfect life quickly came crashing down. A two-hour "20/20," in collaboration with Plum Pictures, features ABC News anchor John Quiñones' interview with Day from prison, nearly a decade after her first-degree capital murder conviction for Taylor's death. In the interview, Day opens up about what she claims really happened that day and her past crimes of bigamy and murder while also maintaining her innocence in Taylor's death, alleging it was an accident. Truth and Lies: The Family Manson

It was one of the most gruesome crime sprees of the 20th century that shocked and haunted the nation. As Leslie Van Houten is released from prison this week, "20/20" explores Charles Manson, his cult of devoted followers and the grisly murders in Los Angeles that he instructed his members to carry out. Amidst an era of sex, drugs and rock and roll in 1969, Manson's followers killed seven people in two consecutive nights, including actress Sharon Tate, who was more than eight months pregnant at the time, in the home she shared with her husband, Roman Polanski. The terrifying and violent acts instantaneously eliminated a sense of safety and security for many people across the country. After serving 53 years for her role in the murders, Leslie Van Houten, a former cult member, was released from prison this week. This episode includes ABC News' interview with Van Houten from her time in prison and takes a look at the details surrounding her release. The program includes footage from ABC News' interviews with Manson, in his last network television interview from prison, and former cult member Patricia Krenwinkel, who is serving a life sentence for the murders masterminded by Manson. The documentary explores the crime scene footage and features interviews with law enforcement, first responders and the production crew who met Manson during his final TV interview. The special also features interviews with Debra Tate, Sharon Tate's sister; family and friends of the victims; actors who worked with Sharon; Mike Love of the Beach Boys, who met Manson before the killings; reporters who were in the courtroom during the trial and more. The Dating Game Killer

In 1968, Rodney Alcala lured a young girl outside the iconic Chateau Marmont hotel in Hollywood and into his car, which marked the beginning of his reign of cross-country attacks that spanned over a decade. Posing as a professional photographer, Alcala often used his good looks and charm to trap his victims. But perhaps his most brazen move came in 1978 when he made a chilling appearance as a contestant on the hit show "The Dating Game" and won. Through first-hand accounts from investigators, victims, eyewitnesses and even his court-appointed psychologist, "20/20" reports on one of the most notorious serial killers of modern times. Home Sweet Murder
