Crime/Courts	6рт	1/30/2024	1:42	Human trafficking is defined as using force, fraud, or persuasion to obtain either labor or commercial sex acts and it can happen anywhere in the United States, even in your neighborhood. Christine Commerce, program director, Alliance to End Human Trafficking: "It is important to note that it does happen in every single city, in every single state around the United States. It's happening not only in the cities, in the big cities but in towns. It's just basically hidden in plain sight." And in order to recognize this crime it's important to know how it works within the United States. "What we know is that most trafficking happens through some type of force, fraud, or coercion. It often takes place through a grooming process." And with so many big events happening across the states from sporting events to fairs, a time of celebration can actually lead to an increase in trafficking. Nora Gonzales, anti-human trafficking advocate, Reach Counseling: "Of course there's more possibilities it might happen because you have so many people there. You're going to see that there's going to be a lot of alcohol involved too. So, if somebody is very vulnerable to an addiction, there's going to be easier to be engaged in trafficking." When you're in a large crowd it can be hard to pay attention to your surroundings but Commerce gives a few red flags to be aware of. Christine Commerce: "Is someone much younger with a much older male or even female that don't seem like they don't quite belong together. Does someone seem fearful or submissive. Is someone not appropriately dressed for the weather." In any scenario if you are concerned someone is being trafficked both women say to not confront the victim in a public space as can be a very dangerous situation but to call 9-1-1.

Every 10 years that information is then used to draw new legislative districts—depriving vulnerable minority communities of fair representation through the state's electoral maps. The issue severely impacts communities of color—African Americans make up less than 8 percent of the state's total population but 42 percent of its prison population. The ideal solution is for incarcerated people to be counted back in their home communities. That way, those communities aren't losing political clout. lars of funding to improve local roads that cause problems for the agriculture industry due to weight postings. This first round of appli-

La Crosse County has 11 miles of what is called cable guard. It's similar to regular guard rail we see alongside the road but one county board member is looking to get rid of these cable guards. Nearing his second year on the La Crosse County board, Dennis Jacobsen noticed an issue with some of the guard rails in the county. This led Jacobsen on a hunt to find out how much cable guard is on the roadsides in La Crosse County. And after multiple conversations Jacobsen found out some discouraging news. Although sometimes we don't think about quardrails when driving, they are crucial to reducing road deaths. According to a study done by the national library of medicine, quardrails reduce fatal crashes by 44 percent. Jacobsen's not sure the guard that he's wanting replaced could prevent anything. The 11 miles of the cable guard is spread throughout the county. (Map visual) Most of it is north of West Salem around the Mindoro Farmington area Because some of this cable guard is in Jacobsen's district, he has calculated out a plan to replace it. But state funding has put a kink in Jacobsen's plan. La Crosse County approved a 10-million-dollar budget which was reduced to 9 million according to Jacobsen. This has resulted in some of the roads needing repairs with the cable guardrails having to be pushed back. La Crosse County highway commissioner Joe Langeberg agrees there's a need for removal of the cable guardrails and it's not as easy as it sounds. Jacobsen says the new stuff that would replace the cable guardrails is called flexbeam and is designed differently than any old guardrail. As for replacement, the county does have road projects scheduled for completion this year that includes guardrail replacement. Although Langeberg stresses that it's going to take some time to replace the cable guardrails in the county, the end goal is to make a safer shoulder of the roadway for both you and I.

The La Crosse County Historical Society is preparing for a busy summer tourism season driven largely by the 30 scheduled cruise boat stops at Riverside Park. They're looking to add another 12 guides and docents to help share our region's history, heritage, and culture with visitors. The guides will lead the weekend trolley tours. Join coach buses hired by the cruise companies. And docents will monitor Hixon House tours. Hixon House and guide manager Margaret Lichter says even guides who have lived here their entire lives in the area are surprised to learn about the richness of La Crosse's culture.

A drug investigation on la crosse's southside leads to one arrest and the seizure of over 100 grams of fentanyl and three pounds of methamphetamine. The la crosse county sheriff's office along with the la crosse police and "meg" unit served a search warrant on Wednesday at 1317 Redfield. During the search, the drugs as well as \$7,000 cash were found. Stephen Johnston was arrested. The La Crosse County jail record shows Johston was booked on charges of maintaining a drug trafficking place and multiple charges of possession with intent to manufacture and distribute methamphetamine and fentanyl. He is currently being held on a \$50,000 cash bond.

Designed and printed to perfection smith makes each of his keychains with love. Quinton Smith, keychain designer: "3d printing is fun for me so I like 3d printing stuff and keychains." He started in fifth grade by making keychains for his classmates and hasn't stopped since. He's used his gifted hands to build his 3d printing business from the ground up. "It feels pretty good like my business before all of this, it used to just be a couple orders, maybe like a week or something, and now I've been getting like five orders everyday basically." He took his business to the streets of the Chiefs victory parade where he made a profit of \$300 selling custom keychains of fan favorite jersey numbers, and a little something for the Swifties. From there business took off, and his mother Julie says proud is an understatement. Julie Smith, mother: "Just the smiles and how excited people get, like I just feel like, it's a keychain, it's a keychain, who would've thought? But it's really just making a difference." Proceeds from keychain sales are going toward local hospitals. It's a cause near and dear to the Smith's heart who received care during a complicated delivery of her youngest son Zeke. The keychains have become part of the family's random acts of kindness, bringing joy to those who receive them. Their reach has spanned as far as Germany, and it all started from a Facebook post, Julie Smith. mother: "I was texting with Lynn Weirdwolf this morning and I said, so many big things are happening just because of you and he just said no they're not happening because of me, they're happening because of Q's kindness.

We are running about a thousand acres of vegetables and we also do corn, soybeans and sweet corn. But right now, it's the potatoes that are keeping Pete Van Erkel busy. He and his crew grow them near Hollandale, clean them in Maple Island, and then send them off to hungry consumers. Years ago, there were farm kids on every farm site, and with an ag background, who were interested in ag. That era has been over for a long time. Which is why Pete began hiring help from other countries. In April, migrant workers will begin arriving for another growing season at Van Erkel Farms. Part of what's called the H2A Visa program. I normally get a resume a day from somewhere across the pond. Maybe from South America. Maybe from Mexico. If you didn't have this, where would your farm be right now? Well, we certainly wouldn't be doing the vegetables anymore. We need people. The program is in all 50 U.S. states. And it's estimated that 1 in 4 agricultural workers in the country are now part of the H2A Visa program. A percentage that Mary Garcia believes will continue to grow. They simply cannot find enough U.S. workers to fill their seasonal temporary need. Garcia is with the Department of Employment and Economic Development. She says H2A workers receive a wage set by the government, and it's up to the farmer to supply them with transportation and housing- all of which is inspected by the state. The land is still the same amount of land but there are fewer people to farm it. Garcia says in 2019, about 300 Minnesota farmers applied for the H2A program. Last vear, that number jumped to 450. And unlike some neighboring states, Minnesota offers these workers overtime. They leave their homes and families for 10 months at a time and come here and work in our state and make 3 or 4 times more than what they would make back home. Van Erkelisnt surprised demand for foreign workers is at an all-time high. He also views this as a food security issue. Without the help, he believes the food supply would shrink significantly. We need people. You can talk about innovation in our industry which we are always open to, but you still need people in our industry.

GROW, a non-profit organization dedicated to fostering connections between youth, healthy food, and nature, is celebrating the expansion of its educational programming through greenhouse field trips for local schools as well as year-round programming. Immersive field experiences, hosted at the Western Technical College (WTC) Horticulture Education Center, offer students the opportunity to deepen their understanding of nutrition and indoor food production while making curriculum connections. By leveraging partnerships with WTC, UW Extension's Food WIse & Farm 2 School, and local school districts, GROW has broadened its reach to include greenhouse field trip experiences during the indoor growing season. Students engage in hands-on learning about urban agriculture, exploring topics such as hydroponic growing, pollination, taste tests, and sustainability. Additionally, they gain insights into the college's agribusiness and horticulture programs, learning about the sustainable efforts employed on campus and in the construction of its cuttingedge facilities. These community collaborations have enabled GROW to deliver impactful learning experiences to students ranging from pre-K to high school, enhancing the organization's capacity to engage youth in garden-based learning year-round. In the second year of opening these experiences to all the number of student participants has more than doubled. Over 1,100 local students are experiencing firsthand the joys of experiential education in the greenhouse this season. On March 5 hundreds of thousands of veterans across the u-s will be eligible for VA healthcare as part of a pact act expansion. "That will increase the eligibility and available abilities for patients to get

care within a VA system prior to requiring all of the enrollment processes, they will be eligible immediately." The pact act was first passed in 2022 and provides comprehensive care for veterans exposed to toxic materials. Originally due to the large numbers of veterans with exposure to burn pits, chemicals, and radiation eligibility was to be granted in phases. Now these phases have been struck out. Based off of the VA's statistics at the VA hospital, they have about 4,100 veterans here in Chippewa, out of those 4,100 veterans, there's about 800 veterans that are eligible but aren't enrolled in VA healthcare." Johnston works with local veterans every day and he feels there's a couple factors that keep veterans from accessing benefits. I think it's just not knowing a lot about the VA health system and the stigma to think that they either don't deserve it or they don't qualify." for those who can enroll Chippewa Falls is home to its own VA clinic. That's a team-based care model using a provider team with nursing support as well as pharmacy support, social work, dietary, we have mental health services on site. The Chippewa Falls

clinic is part of the Minneapolis VA health care system which covers

Western Wisconsin and Minnesota.

Law enforcement got the clarity they were looking for in a bill designed to ease their concerns and get school resource officers back in the classroom. "We are very, very glad that this will provide more school safety." At issue: a small section of a big education bill last year that prohibited them from using certain types of restraints and physical holds on students. Questions about the impact pushed dozens of SRO's to pull out of districts. "We were able to come up with a bipartisan fix to this issue that quite honestly didn't need to be if it went to go the correct process." Under the new proposal those restrictions remain for teachers and other school staff, but law enforcement is carved out from those rules. But they still have to follow other laws governing their conduct including a ban on chokeholds except in narrow circumstances. It passed with broad bipartisan support Monday with everyone but eight Democrats voting yes. "That's always the hope anytime we can get something bipartisan or with that board lit up green." The proposal requires new training for SROs on topics like de-escalation and responding to violent threats. The Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training or POST Board would oversee that instruction and develop a model policy for officers by collaborating with stakeholders. "For me, it's a center piece of the legislation. It creates an opportunity for the community groups, the law enforcement groups and education groups to come together to put something together that I think everybody can be, can be happy with."

The laughter inside representative William Penterman's office Wednesday carried a serious edge.18-year-old Blake Boreman came to press his representative to support youth apprenticeships. How it has helped people, and how it can affect people in the future. Especially with funding. Through an opportunity offered by Cooperative Educational Service Agency 5, Blake got an apprenticeship at ek in fall river. Used to be bullied quite a bit. Now, like, I used to react to it, but now I just really don't care. At 15, Blake was diagnosed with autism. His mother, Bobbie Smith, says the apprenticeship helped her son in multiple ways. I'm at peace. I should say with his future because of the skills he has been taught. And his employer, who came with Blake to advocate for apprenticeship funding and support, says they want to keep him. If he decides to stay with us it is great, but whoever has him after graduation will be very lucky. For apprenticeship programs have become an important way attract talent in a tight labor market. Trying to find quality people has been difficult as well. We're expanding, we're growing another, we're building another facility in Fall River. The apprenticeship came with unexpected perks like these seats at a Packers game and landing this first-place northern pike at the company fishing tournament.

A former substitute teacher at Altoona high school is charged with four felony counts of exposing a child to harmful descriptions. According to the criminal complaint, James Worley worked as a substitute teacher for a woodworking class at the Altoona high school in February. Multiple children interviewed by police said Worley was having a conversation with a couple of the students at the front of the class but was loud enough for the entire class to hear. Worley allegedly described multiple sexually explicit acts after asking students if they knew what they were. Multiple students overheard Worley, who is 40, tell the students that the lowest age he would date was 14 years old. A video recording of the incident was also given to the police and transcribed in the criminal complaint. When guestioned by police, Worley admitted to talking with two boys about "guy humor" and answering questions they had about sex and relationships. Worley said some of the other statements were made sarcastically. He was released on a \$25,000 signature bond.

Measles is on the rise around the globe, the CDC warning of an increase in cases and outbreaks here in the US and abroad. So far this year there have been 58 confirmed cases across 17 states. That's equal to the total number of cases we saw in all of last year. Jessica Colletti says her three-year-old son was recently infected. Her son is doing better now but she doesn't know how he got it. She says he got his first dose of the vaccine but isn't old enough for the second. Measles is highly contagious. One infected person can infect 9 out of 10 unvaccinated people. Officials say 93 percent of the cases this year have been linked to international travel, mostly in kids over 1 year old who did not have the MMR vaccine. Countries like Austria, the Philippines, Romania and the UK are all seeing outbreaks, the CDC urging any child over 6 months old who is traveling overseas to get vaccinated before leaving. And those who are not traveling should still follow the standard CDC vaccine schedule with children getting their first dose at about a year old and their second dose between 4 and 6 years old. Now the risk of this spreading widely is low across the US given overall high population immunity. However, some pockets that have lower vaccination rates are at higher risk for outbreaks.

Bond is set for the man arrested on homicide charges for a UTV crash that killed a Sparta woman early Sunday morning. Keegan savor made his first appearance in Monroe County court today. He was arrested Monday after he was released from the hospital where he was treated for injuries suffered when the UTV he and 23-year-old Danielle Fields were riding in went off the road and overturned. Fields was pronounced dead at the scene from her injuries. Savor was booked on charges including homicide by intoxicated use of a vehicle. Bond has been set at 15-thousand dollars. But there is a point where there is just not going to be someone there" Her job is to help recruit and retain EMS workers and she says it takes a certain type of person to fill this role. "If you have a desire to care for the people within your community, and be that calming person in the storm, that is a great reason to get into EMS" So whether it is help with the worker shortage or lack of equipment Thornstrom says he is happy to have the support. "Fortunately, the federal government and congress and state government as well have been very receptive to our challenges and have been helping but there is always room for more." This operating referendum seeks authorization from area taxpayers for the Sparta Area School District to exceed their revenue limit by \$750,000 which will be split over the next two years. SAM: "The monies are for operating. The largest portion is our salaries and benefits for our wonderful staff we have, but it also goes toward our infrastructure and technology." Over the last couple of years, the district has grappled with budget cuts, and they expect further reductions in the upcoming years. So, they are using this referendum to soften the financial blow of what's to come. SAM: "If the referendum does pass our district is still looking at \$2.1 million over the next two years. If it does not pass, we'll be looking at \$3.8 million in reductions just next year alone." The Sparta school district attempted a similar operating referendum two years ago, but it did not pass. Consequently, they now fall under a law called Act 141 which states that if a district has failed to pass an operating referendum, then their funding per student would be frozen for the following 3 years and would not increase with inflation, even if necessary. LEAH "This operating referendum will not only provide us the \$750,000 it will also release us from that Act 141, which will provide us additional funding per student in the state formula as well." The district emphasizes the importance of this referendum in sustaining the quality of education and services provided to students. SAM: "Our goal is to have as minimum of an impact on our students as much as possible. We understand that any impact on our district probably has an impact on kids eventually, but we're really trying to minimize that. We're not looking to take opportunities away from students at all." Additionally, if approved, this referendum would result in an additional \$0.42 per \$1,000 of property value for the 2024-25 tax year.

Three Shots in the Dark

In May 2022, Anna Moriah Wilson, a promising young cyclist bringing new energy to the emerging sport of gravel racing, was suddenly gunned down in Austin, Texas, just days before a major race. The last person to see her alive was fellow cyclist Colin Strickland, who had a brief romantic relationship with Wilson before turning platonic again. Authorities quickly identified a suspect: Colin's on-again/off-again girlfriend, Kaitlin Armstrong. ABC News chief national correspondent Matt Gutman investigates the details of the grisly murder, the 43-day hunt for Kaitlin that crossed state and international lines, and the trial that reached a verdict in November of 2023. The two-hour episode includes exclusive interviews with Mike Armstrong, Kaitlin's father; Nicole Mertz, Kaitlin's former friend who tipped off police to disturbing comments she allegedly made about Moriah; and a neighbor at the crime scene who provided key surveillance videos to authorities. The episode also features the first interviews with Jose Garza, Travis County district attorney, and prosecutors Rickey Jones and Guillermo Gonzalez. Additional interviews include Kaitlin's neighbors in Costa Rica, including one who witnessed her arrest.

On a November afternoon in 2003, Dru Sjodin, a senior at the University of North Dakota, was finishing some Christmas shopping when she vanished from the parking lot of her local mall. When authorities arrived at the scene, they discovered a chilling piece of evidence — the sheath of a handheld knife. In a new "20/20," "Nightline" co-anchor Juju Chang reports on Dru's disappearance, the investigation that led police to Alfonso Rodriguez — a local man with a violent history — and the trial that ended in North Dakota's first death sentence in over 100 years that was later overturned. However, the details of the gruesome murder and Scott's motives remained a mystery until 2022, when Scott's writings about his life and crimes found in a trailer next to his dead body shed new light on the case. In a case that reverberated across the nation, experts revealed that this was likely a case of Munchausen by proxy, a form of abuse, usually by a parent to their child, in which a guardian exaggerates or induces illness in a child often motivated by a desire for attention and sympathy — Gypsy says she was a healthy young woman. In a new "20/20," co-anchor Deborah Roberts sits down with Gypsy one week after her release from prison to talk about life behind bars, her reckoning with her past, and how she is dealing with her newfound fame.

The documentary is a galvanizing look at actor, model and icon Brooke Shields as she transforms from a sexualized young girl to a woman discovering her power. Holding a mirror up to a society that objectifies women and girls, her story shows the perils and triumphs of gaining agency in a hostile world.

Truth and Lies: The Hunted

After 23-year-old escort Shannan Gilbert disappeared in 2010, police stumbled upon a serial killer's graveyard in Gilgo Beach, Long Island — which held the human remains of four other missing sex workers. Shortly after, authorities discovered six more bodies along the same stretch of road. "Truth and Lies: The Hunted" chronicles the twists and turns in the decade-long investigation to find the Long Island serial killer, uncovering allegations of corruption and police biases that slowed the investigation and enraged the victims' family members. This episode takes viewers inside the task force that used new technology that led to the July 2023 arrest of the man now accused of murdering those four sex workers: Rex Heuermann, a husband and father who police claim was leading a dark double life. Heuermann has pleaded not guilty to these charges. "Truth and Lies: The Hunted" explores the police's ongoing investigation of this notorious case and dives deep into the subculture of sex work, giving viewers the point of view of the women behind these headlines.

Soul of a Nation Presents: X / o n e r a t e d - The Murder of Malcolm X and 55 Years to Justice

The special profiles Muhammad Abdul Aziz, a man who was wrongfully convicted of Malcolm X's assassination. Featuring the first TV interview with Aziz following his exoneration in 2021, conducted by ABC News "Nightline" co-anchor Byron Pitts, the special retraces Malcolm X's shocking 1965 assassination, Aziz's decades behind bars and on parole, and the devastating impact on Aziz's family. The program also takes viewers through the pivotal moments that ultimately led to the demise of the Titan and all on board its final tragic journey into the deep sea.
