The pro- posed relief plan would forgive up to twenty thousand dol- lars for Pell Grant recipients with an annual income below 125-thousand dollars. Those who didn't receive the Pell Grant and meet that income threshold could be eligible for up to 10 thousand dollars of relief. One University of Wis- consin La Crosse student I spoke with says he supports the plan but has some concerns. More than twenty six million people applied for Bidens' debt relief program within the first month of application being open and overall more than forty million borrowers would qualify for loan forgiveness. Cur- rently, student loan repayments have been on pause since the beginning of the pandemic - three years ago. Payments are to resume at the end of August or once litigation has been resolved - depending on which comes first. |
