List and Narrative of Issues WXOW

1. **Government:** These stories focus on national, state and local government. Decisions regarding state law, bills, and local ordinances are covered.
2. **Courts and Crime:** Justice, courts, and law enforcement are important facets of local government. These stories focus on the processes, outcomes and impacts of local government decisions. It also includes crimes committed in our area.
3. **Agriculture:** These stories focus on the agriculture industry and the farming community that makes up much of the Seven Rivers community. Stories also include coverage of 4-H efforts, dairy prices and crop progress from planting through the harvest.
4. **Community Events:** These stories focus on events happening in the community whether for charitable reasons or for uniting the community. These stories include benefits, fundraisers, athletic events such as run/walks, farmer's markets, concerts, fairs, etc.
5. **Business and Industry:** These stories include those affecting business and employees in our market. It includes expansion plans, layoffs and other stories related to growth and development.
6. **Healthcare:** This includes healthcare initiatives, legislation and insurance. Topics include physical activities, illness prevention and treatment, diet and exercise and lifestyle choices.
7. **Recreation:** Festivals, sports, exercise, hunting, fishing and arts and entertainment are some of the activities we alert people to that are happening locally.
8. **Education:** From school news to what's going on at the Children's museum and the library, we continue to cover kids and their learning. We also focus on school district needs, teacher performance, student test scores, and budgetary challenges. We also cover issues related to our local universities and tech colleges.
9. **Politics:** Stories that cover the political arena on a local, state and nationwide basis. This also includes stories on political candidates and upcoming elections.
10. **Emergency Response/Public Safety**
