### Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **Louisiana's COVID-19 Response and Vaccine Plan:** Louisiana continues to grapple with COVID-19, and we explore all the aspects with elected leaders and medical professionals--from treatments to the economic fallout. As details began to emerge about the COVID-19 vaccines, we shifted our attention to that news including how Shreveport played a role in getting the vaccine through its trials, and how the vaccine will be distributed in the state.
- **Police Pay Raises in Shreveport:** While also dealing with a pandemic, the City of Shreveport witnessed a large fight within the city government over raising the pay for the Shreveport Police Department. The Police Union took out billboards to attack members of the City Council, while members of the Council themselves openly attacked each other during meetings. We spoke to members of the City Council, as well as the President of the Police Union to fully understand the issues.
- **Attempts to Overturn the State's COVID Restrictions:** Members of the Louisiana Legislature pushed back hard against Governor John Bel Edwards COVID Emergency Orders, going all the way to the State Supreme Court. They worked through a Special Session of the Legislature, and even brought forward an old piece of state law to sign a Legislative Petition in an effort to undo the Governor's orders, and reopen the state.
- **2020 Elections:** This year was a Presidential Election year, with a lot more on the ballot in Louisiana. There were more than half a dozen State Constitutional Amendments, and a US Senate race that involved Shreveport's current Mayor. To complicate the situation further, the COVID-19 pandemic caused numerous issues, and brought on new early voting and mail-in voting rules for just this year. Early voting lines stretched for blocks at Shreveport's ONLY Early Voting location, with wait times lasting hours in some cases.
