TOPIC: EDUCATION LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Dr. Clarence Nixon, Jr., business executive, educator and author of "A Crisis of Competence (How our Education System is Failing Kids and What to Do About It). They discussed the impact of his book and his non-profit organization. Nixon explained he is the CEO and founder of t.Lab, a non-profit organization that operates accelerated learning centers for students in pre-kindergarten through undergraduate. Mildred commended Nixon for his work in the community.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Donavan McKinney, Michigan State Representative of the 14th District. She explained an officer was accused of punching an elderly man outside a bar in Midtown Detroit. She also shared the elderly man has since died and Moore had accused Chief White of changing the narrative surrounding the incident after the victim was in grave condition. Listeners called in to weigh in their opinions on the topic.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Hattiesburg, Mississippi City Councilwoman Deborah Delgado. They discussed the recent report of several states, including Mississippi, involved in court battles over racial gerrymandering claims. Delgado explained the US Supreme Court is hearing arguments in the case of Alexander v. South Carolina State Conference of the NAACP. She shared that the case involves a dispute over the congressional map that South Carolina's Republican-controlled legislature enacted after the 2020 census. Listeners called in to discuss their opinions on the topic.

TOPIC: LAW ENFORCEMENT LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney Brunetta Brandy. They discussed the legal issues surrounding the reports of the Baton Rouge Police Department being investigated by the FBI for assaulting detainees in an unmarked police warehouse. Brandy explained that three Baton Rouge Police officers have been arrested in connection with what the media called "Brave Cave Tactics". Listeners called in to weigh their opinions on the topic.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed consultant and former Michigan State Senator Virgil Smith, Jr. They discussed the recent chaotic and emotional board meeting at Michigan State University, calling for the resignation of Rema Vassar, chair of the MSU Board of Trustees. Mildred shared Smith led Detroiters to Lansing to show support for Vassar. Mildred also highlighted the call for Vassar's resignation stemmed from a seven-page letter from Trustee Brianna Scott, accusing Vassar of bullying board members and violating codes of conduct and ethics. Smith shared that Vassar has called the allegations baseless and untruths and that she would not resign.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed former Detroit Police Chief James Craig. They discussed the recent rash of mass shootings around the country, specifically the recent report of a 40-year-old firearms instructor suspected of killing 18 people in Maine. Craig explained the suspected killer was recently found dead. He also highlighted that Congress should pass stricter laws for gun control. Mildred highlighted Craig recently announced he would be running for the Senate seat in Michigan being vacated by Sen. Debbie Stabenow.
