TOPIC: HEALTH

Inside Detroit

April 5, 2020

Time: 9:10am- 9:55am

Length: 45 Minutes

Mildred opens the lines for the listeners to discuss their concerns with COVID-19. Listeners that called in discussed the death rates, symptoms, and the impact of Coronavirus on the city itself, which all causes the fear that they have due to this virus.

Length: 5 Minutes

Mildred played a video of an interview conducted by Dr. James Hildreth of Meharry Medical College in Nashville, Tennessee, who is an investigative reporter specializing in poverty, economic justice, and the intersection between beats. This video contained an explanation of what COVID-19 is. He gives, in detail, the origin of the virus, the symptoms, and the updates of how to protect the world from it.

Mildred interviewed Wayne County Sheriff Benny Napoleon. They discuss his personal story of his 9 relatives that tested positive for COVID-19. He starts the interview by telling the story of his brother having the virus and the state of his condition now, along with updates on his other relatives. Next, Mildred and the guest discuss how this virus has affected his everyday life; he questions if it will ever go back to normal. He states that he has been in law enforcement for years and he's seen danger, but he did not see this danger coming. In addition, he discusses the unreal experiences that he's had in law enforcement. The guest discussed that 200 members of his agents have tested positive for the virus despite not having any symptoms from the virus.

Mildred chats with Dr. Joneigh Khaldun, who is the state's medical chief executive. Dr. Joneigh Khaldun was the former Baltimore CMO for 7 years where she oversaw 7 clinics. They chat about the symptoms of COVID-19 versus and how you might know if you're immune. She says "they have been discovering new symptoms." Moreover, Mildred questions when we will get answers. The guest goes into the anatomy of the body and explains that they have been having conversations with many researchers. At the end of the interview, the guest explains to the listeners the importance of staying home and staying safe. Also, she explains that just cause the number is flattening, it does not mean that it is improving the death rate of the virus. She says the governor has merges set up for this pandemic.

Mildred interviewed Tellis Chapman, who is the pastor at Galilee Missionary Baptist Church in Detroit. Pastor Chapman discussed what is going on with the city of Detroit during the pandemic. He shared his concern with how Detroit needs to overcome the pandemic and explained how he pays over the city of Detroit to help as much as he can.

Mildred interviewed Rev. Jimmy Womack M.D., who is a retired Doctor of Anesthesiology; he is also a former school board resident who serves on several hospital boards. They discussed the best way to navigate our way through COVID-

19. The interview begins with questioning if we are moving into another phase of life. The Rev. states that God is calling us to listen. He believes that we have political organizations that are telling us things that the CDC has not confirmed yet. Furthermore, he is referencing that the government is trying to decide when to lift the stay at home orders, but the CDC had not expressed what should be done, and that they are the ones researching the virus. Moreover, they discussed how the virus is destroying the African American community and how the community should learn from this series of events. Closer to the end of the show they discuss the government's role in this pandemic.

Mildred interviewed Senator Gary Peters. In the first part of the interview, they addressed the Black Maternal Health Crisis and recognized Black Maternal Health Week. The Senator also asked the CDC for comprehensive demographic data about testing results, health care access, and more amid ongoing limited access to tests. They ended the interview by Peters announcing a Coronavirus "Heroes Fund" proposal, as he calls for a \$25,000 pay increase for essential workers on the frontlines of this pandemic response.

At the end of the interview, he stresses everyone should stay home and stay safe. Also, Judge Mathis joins the call to let us know about free testing and Wal-Mart gift cards that he is giving away.

Mildred interviewed Rick Hampson, who is the president of Citizens Bank in Michigan. Hampson talked about how this campaign has made such a difference in the community, as they work to feed as many kids as they can over the summer.

Mildred interviewed Nicole Small, who is the charter commissary of Detroit. They discussed the question of why Detroiters are still without promised water. Nicole starts the interview by explaining the issue of the water crisis in Detroit. She states that Detroit residents have not had water since 2017. Furthermore, she goes into explaining the importance of getting water back during the pandemic. She feels this is one of many reasons why Detroit has so many cases of the virus because they don't have any sources that can help them heal. She went on to state "we will never flatten the curve because there is no water." They end the interview with her challenging Detroit city council to do something about the water restoration problem.

Mildred interviewed Ellis Liddell, the president of ELE Wealth Management. They discussed stimulus packages. The first portion of the interview contained that we are moving into another phase of this pandemic. Mr. Liddell goes into how the stimulus check will be distributed. He states that the distribution process is similar to the unemployment process. This conversation led to Mr. Liddell encouraging people to apply for unemployment. He goes into the guidelines of pandemic unemployment and regular unemployment. In the last minutes of this interview, Mildred gives instructions on how to apply for pandemic unemployment.

Mildred opened up the phone lines and posed the question “is the Governor right for the stay at home order?” Everyone that answered the question thought that she was doing the right thing. The callers that were affected discussed their symptoms and overcoming it, while one of the callers discussed him getting the virus twice.

Mildred talked with Johnathan Kinloch. He is the 13th Congressional Chairman Democrat. He calls out Democrat Tanya Whitsett for aligning herself with President Donald Trump. Moreover, he does not think she is doing her job but instead dividing the community. This comes two weeks after Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin first asked Congress for an expedited infusion of \$250 billion to help the newly created loan program for distressed small businesses known as the Paycheck Protection. They also talk about what this loan program entails and how accessible it is.

Mildred interviewed Mr. Steve Gray, who is a professor and attorney with 30 years of experience in unemployment insurance and administrative law. He serves as Director of the Michigan Unemployment Insurance Agency. They discussed the status of unemployment checks for people in Michigan. Have the wrinkles been removed from the process? He explains how to apply for unemployment and eligibility. Furthermore, the conversation moves to the fact that \$2.1 billion has been spent on unemployment. He also broke down their approach to how they are getting everyone's checks out. He explains that they are looking at the older cases first and focusing on the common questions that are being asked.

Also, they discussed hope that this will be a way for voting to increase.

Mildred interviewed the Regional Director Bethany Christian Services, Star Pettway. They discussed how May 5th is National Foster Care Month and how COVID-19 impacts the Foster Care System. Pettway explains to the audience that due to the Coronavirus pandemic, foster kids are unable to see their family. She also discussed how people that certain people's adoption process are currently on hold. Furthermore, she goes into how foster parents are being trained through Zoom. She ends the interview by explaining what is needed to be a foster parent, and how kids that are fostered are in the system for 4-6 months so that the parents can get themselves ready for placement.

TOPIC: CIVIL RIGHTS/RACISM**Inside Detroit****May 10, 2020****Time: 8:00am-9:00am****Length: 60 Minutes**

Mildred interviewed Attorney Sean Perkins, who is an Attorney of Criminal Law, Civil Law, Traffic, and Bankruptcy. She also welcomed retired Detroit Police Officer John Bennett to the show. They discussed their perspective on the murder of unarmed jogger Ahmaud Arbery in Georgia. A sheriff deputy and his son are responsible and no one has been arrested. They believe that this was a modern-day lynching. Perkins and Bennet gave their opinions on the government's actions on this situation. Moreover, they analyze the case and how they think it will play out.

Mildred interviewed Chanelle Helm of Louisville, Kentucky. She is a part of the Black Lives Matter movement. They discussed the new Spectrum news story about Helm delivering groceries to the poor. They looked deeply into the case and then moved on to the Louisville police's recent case, which is similar to Breonna Taylor's case. They ended the interview by posing one question: what is the next step for Chanelle to get justice for Breonna?

Mildred interviewed retired FBI agent Hank Glaspie. They discussed Breonna Taylor's case from the police authority's perspective. They also discussed what the protocol of an officer normally is during a raid. In addition, they talked about what the Louisville police officers did right and wrong in this situation.

Mildred interviewed Larry Watson, who is an educator, singer, songwriter, and activist. As of January 2016, Watson serves as Professor of Ensemble at Berkley College of Music. He is also the owner/operator of Save Ourselves Productions, as well as a consultant for community development agencies, corporations, civic organizations, universities, and college organizations. Moreover, Professor Waston was the Lead singer in the 2000 grand opening of the Landmark Center, Art Edible fundraiser, Scullers Jazz Night Club, Medal of Honor at the Harvard School of Law, and the Boston chapter of the NAACP. They discussed how he feels broken and isolated being a black man in America. He believes that the community is still looked at as slaves. Furthermore, they went on to discuss that people think black is not needed and ended the interview with how African American is very much needed in our society.

Siggers told his story of how he was wrongly executed. In addition, he discussed how he has turned his life around since then.

Mildred interviewed Kym Worthy who is the current prosecutor of Wayne County, Michigan. She is the first African-American woman to serve as a county prosecutor in Michigan. She became internationally recognized for prosecuting then Detroit Mayor Kwame Kilpatrick at the beginning of March 2008. They discussed how to determine the charges of the defendant in such a case. In addition, they discussed the case of Malice Green, who died at the hands of Detroit police in the 1980s. They ended the interview by discussing the fact that more than 11,000 rape kits tested since 2018.

the actions he is taking regarding protesters. During the segment, Mildred welcomed callers to call in and share their opinions on all of the topics.

Cornelius Fredricks' killing. This story is about 16-year-old Cornelius Fredricks, who died while in the youth center. Three staff members were charged in his death. Towards the end of the interview, they compared Cornelius Fredrick's killing to George Floyd's death.
