October 2nd, 2022

TIME: 8:00am – 11:00am

TOPIC: COMMUNITY OUTREACH

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Dawn Bell, CEO of Early Child Investment Corporation. The Early Childhood Investment Corporation is an independent, publicly-owned nonprofit committed to helping Michigan strengthen its economy through early childhood supports and resources that deliver better education, health, and economic outcomes. They discussed the recent announcement from Gov. Gretchen Whitmer regarding Regional Childcare Planning Grants. Bell shared that the Regional Childcare Planning Grants will help local advocates, employers, parents, and leaders develop plans that start more childcare businesses, support existing child cares, and lower costs for Michigan families.

TOPIC: LAW ENFORCEMENT

LENGTH: 25 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis shared with listeners a breaking report regarding the Detroit Police responding to a mental health check that turned deadly. Mildred explained that the Detroit Police shot and killed a 22-year-old mentally ill man who charged them with a knife. Mildred expressed that she felt the force was excessive and called on city officials to allocate funds for proper training of the mentally ill. Listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

TOPIC: DETROIT POLITICS

LENGTH: 65 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Art Blackwell, political strategist and former Wayne County Commission Chairperson. They discussed the importance of the upcoming November election, specifically Proposals 1, 2, and 3. Blackwell shared that he is opposed to Proposal 1, which amends the Michigan Constitution to require lawmakers and top state executive officials to file personal financial disclosure reports. Blackwell also shared that the Proposal would change legislative term limits to an overall total of 12 years, instead of two four-year terms in the Senate and three two-year terms in the House. Blackwell explained that Proposal 2 seeks to legalize early voting and ballot drop boxes. They both agreed that Proposal 3 is the one that citizens should be putting their emphasis on. Prop. 3 adds the right to abortion and contraceptive use to the state constitution. Mildred urged listeners to be sure to get out to vote in the upcoming election. Mildred also commended Mr. Blackwell for his work in the political realm and the community.

TOPIC: DETROIT INFRASTRUCTURE**LENGTH: 40 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Karen Dumas, writer for The Detroit News. They discussed her recent article where she calls out city officials for the construction of Downtown Detroit structures, yet the city is under-occupied. Dumas also expressed her concern over the legitimacy of The Detroit Land Bank. Dumas explained that the process for average Detroit residents to obtain homes using this process is one-sided. Mildred agreed, sharing that she too was not able to use The Detroit Land Bank to purchase a home. Listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Michigan Attorney General Dana Nessel. They discussed her campaign and the upcoming November election. Nessel also debunked the rumors of voter suppression in the city of Detroit. Nessel shared that she has filed several lawsuits against Republican ran robocall systems that have called citizens Detroit, spreading misinformation. Listeners called in with questions for the Attorney General. Mildred commended Nessel for always working hard for the Michiganders, especially Detroiters.

TOPIC: EDUCATION**LENGTH: 25 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed former Detroit City Council President, Brenda Jones. Jones shared details regarding her upcoming College Scholarship Fair at Detroit Eastern Market. She also highlighted that there will be over 40 colleges in attendance at the fair. Mildred also highlighted Jones' tenured past while serving on the city council. Mildred also commended Jones for hosting a great event that will benefit many children in the Metro Detroit area. Listeners called in with questions regarding the scholarship fair.

TOPIC: LAW ENFORCEMENT**LENGTH: 60 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney Todd Perkins of The Perkins Law Group. They discussed the recent fatal Detroit Police shooting involving a mentally ill man who charged police with a knife. Perkins explained that the Detroit Police were called to the home for a mental health check. When police arrived on the scene,

the victim, Porter Burkes, charged police with just a knife in his hand. Perkins highlighted that nearly 40 bullet casings were found on the scene, citing the police used excessive force on a man with just a knife. Mildred agreed, sharing that there needs to be a special unit that handles mental health crises. Listeners called in to weigh their opinion on the topic.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed media professional and former BET Producer, Montez Miller. They discussed the recent Women of Color STEM Conference at Huntington Place in Downtown Detroit, where Mildred was the host of the event. Miller also shared that she was behind the scenes for the event as the event's producer. Miller explained the conference culminates with the ultimate celebration of women who are STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), trailblazers in the industry, government, military, and academia. Mildred highlighted what an honor it was to co-host the event with retired Fox2 Anchor, Huel Perkins. Mildred commended Miller for producing such a great event and thanked her for asking to host.

TOPIC: LOCAL MUSIC

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Gospel singer, Farreece Grimmatt. They discussed his upcoming single release concert for his latest Gospel song which has been gaining national attention. Grimmatt explained the title of the single, Breakthrough, was written at a time in his life when he was heavily depressed. He also shared details regarding the concert, including which national artists will also be in attendance. Mildred highlighted that she loves the new single, explaining that she has been a longtime fan. Mildred commended Grimmatt for staying the course and continuing to make great music.

TOPIC: NATIONAL POLITICS

LENGTH: 40 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Democratic Congressman Jamaal Bowman of New York. They discussed the upcoming November election and how the pending results will impact citizens on a national level. Bowman highlighted he has visited several states in the Midwest, including Michigan, in the past weeks to push voter

knowledge and registration. Mildred expressed that coming out from the last Presidential administration, voters need to be more cautious and aware of the candidates they are voting for. Bowman commended Mildred for using her platform to inform listeners of their voter rights.

TOPIC: NATIONAL POLITICS

LENGTH: 60 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed journalist A.R. Shaw of Real Times Media. They discussed the recent Senate debate in Georgia between Herschel Walker and incumbent Sen. Raphael Warnock. Shaw highlighted the debate started strong, with Warnock getting his points across. They also discussed Walker bringing a prop to the debate, which spark a viral moment on social media. Mildred expressed that Walker misrepresented the facts and that the voters need to get out to the polls in the November election. Shaw also shared that for Warnock to keep his seat in the Senate, he needs to stay on message. Listeners called in to chime in on the debate.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 15 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis shared audio from the first debate for the Gubernatorial race in Michigan with candidate Tudor Dixon and Gov. Gretchen Whitmer. Mildred expressed that she doesn't trust Dixon with holding the office of Governor. She also shared that Dixon is vehemently against abortion, even with those that are raped or a victim of incest. Mildred explained that Dixon is alienating herself from voters, as some don't agree with her stance. Listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS

LENGTH: 25 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed former WDIV Local 4 anchor and singer, Evrod Cassimy. They discussed his recent move to Chicago as well as his latest single. Cassimy explained that he took the job in Chicago for not only a better opportunity work-wise but also to be closer to his family whom he hasn't seen in years. He also shared details on his latest EP and single titled "Life of James". Mildred highlighted the great work Evrod has done for the Metro Detroit community. She also wished Cassimy the best of luck in his new ventures. Listeners called in to share their best wishes for Cassimy.

TOPIC: NATIONAL POLITICS

LENGTH: 45 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Dr. Matt Grossmann, a political scientist at Michigan State and author. They discussed the upcoming Midterm elections and what the results could mean for the country. Grossmann shared that the Democratic party is doing everything it can to hold on to what power they have in the House and Senate. Mildred highlighted that eyes will be on certain swing states, like Arizona and Georgia. Grossmann agreed, sharing that Arizona will have provisions in place so voters won't witness a tumultuous situation like the 2020 election. Mildred encouraged listeners to make sure to check if they are registered to vote and to be sure to vote in November.

TOPIC: LOCAL NEWS

LENGTH: 40 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed businessman, Robert Carmack. In 2018, Carmack, a collision shop owner with a hand in Detroit's political scene, was charged with selling a piece of property he didn't own for \$1 million in 2016. Earlier that year, Carmack aired footage in the middle of Downtown Detroit that appeared to show Duggan arriving at a woman's house and insinuating he was having an affair. Carmack shared that after over 4 years, the case was finally dismissed against him. Mildred shared she feels that Carmack was wrongfully charged. Carmack explained that he was charged out of retaliation from Detroit Mayor Mike Duggan. Carmack also explained that his life has been forever changed since and might seek a lawsuit against the city of Detroit.

TOPIC: NATIONAL SPORTS

LENGTH: 40 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis shared an excerpt from a 60 Minutes interview with Jackson State Football coach, Dion Sanders. Mildred explained that since Sanders took over the football program at Jackson State, HBCUs have grown in student attendance. Mildred interviewed Rev. Kenneth Fairly of Mt. Caramel Ministries in Mississippi. Fairly explained the surge in community involvement since 'Coach Prime' took over. He also shared that there are plans to build a bigger stadium for the Jackson State Football team. Mildred expressed that Sanders has given HBCUs hope.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis encouraged listeners to call in to weigh in on the topics of the day's show. Listeners called in with their opinions on the topics. One listener commended Mildred for highlighting HBCUs and Coach Prime. Another listener shared Mayor Duggan was no different than Kwame Kilpatrick. Mildred agreed,

sharing that those who abuse their power should be held accountable. Mildred also shared with listeners the importance of voting and to make sure they are registered. She highlighted that this election, like so many is incredibly important.

TOPIC: INTERNATIONAL NEWS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed political scientist and former Wayne State University professor, Dr. Alisa Moldavanova. They discussed the ongoing war in Ukraine against Russia. Moldavanova shared details of what is happening on the grounds in Ukraine. She highlighted that the people of Ukraine are holding their own against Russia. Mildred expressed that this war needs to stop, highlighting it is destroying families. Moldavanova commended Mildred for using her platform to bring attention to the war.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Gov. Gretchen Whitmer of Michigan. They discussed her ongoing campaign ahead of the November election. Whitmer shared she is in the final stretch of her campaign, highlighting she is more than hopeful she will succeed. They also discussed the blatantly false political ads that have aired on TV. Gov. Whitmer shared that the negative ads have gotten worse over the years. She also expressed that it is harder for voters to receive the correct information when there is so much misinformation being put out. Mildred wished Whitmer the best of luck on her campaign.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 45 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Kristina Karamo, the Republican candidate for vying for Michigan Secretary of State. They discussed her campaign ahead of the November election. Karamo shared that the negative ads being aired against her used audio that was taken out of context. She also explained the reason she got into the race was to protect the voting rights of all Michiganders. Listeners called in with questions for the candidate.

TOPIC: POLICE BRUTALITY

LENGTH: 45 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney Dionne Webster-Cox and her client David Hurley. They discussed the lawsuit he filed against the Farmington Hills police

department. Hurley explained that he was at his home one night and heard a commotion outside his home. When he stepped outside, he shared that the police drew their weapons on him and jumped him outside his home. His attorney, Webster-Cox shared that the police were pursuing a man that looked nothing like her client. Mildred shared she was upset when she first heard the story. Hurley thanked Mildred for allowing him and his attorney to use her platform for getting this story out.

TOPIC: NATIONAL POLITICS

LENGTH: 60 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney, Avery Bradley. Mildred broadcasted live from Cutter's Bar & Grill for her "Get Out the Vote" broadcast to energize listeners ahead of Election Tuesday. They discussed Governor and Senate races in Georgia as well as voter suppression. Bradley shared that the numbers are extremely close between candidates in both races. Mildred explained the types of voter suppression listeners may encounter, but encouraged them to remain vigilant in the fight. They also discussed the power of voting and explained the history of black people finally getting their chance to vote.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 25 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Michael Joseph, President of CBTU Detroit Chapter (Coalition of Black Trade Unionists). CBTU represents workers at polling sites. They discussed the upcoming election and the importance of voting. Joseph shared how voters are misinformed when it comes to the information on candidates. He also highlighted that listeners can learn a great deal by listening to The Mildred Gaddis Show.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed political strategist, Mario Morrow. They discussed the importance of the upcoming election and what voters need to know. Mildred shared going into this election, the Democratic party needs to stay on message; citing that is the difference between them and the Republican party. Morrow agreed and explained the Democrats need to seek a way to connect to the younger voting group as well.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS**LENGTH: 30 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Nicole Small, Vice-Chairperson of the Detroit Charter Commission. They discussed the disconnect between politicians and voters ahead of election day. Small shared the disconnect stems from a lack of voter knowledge. She called out leaders for not allocating funds to get the vote out. They also discussed the decline in black men voting. Small shared that the city may need new leadership. Small commended Mildred for using her platform to push out voter information.

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Eric Doeh, CEO of the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network. They discussed the challenges those might face with mental health. Doeh also shared that the DWIHN not only helps with mental health but substance abuse as well. They also discussed ways to help those dealing with mental health issues. Doeh also highlighted the services provided by the company are free of charge.

TOPIC: COMMUNITY OUTREACH**LENGTH: 30 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Michael Garrett, President, and CEO of CNS Healthcare. They discussed his company's 10th annual Turkey giveaway in partnership with the Detroit Police Department and Wayne County Sheriff's Office. Garrett explained CNS Healthcare is one the largest providers of health services in the Metro Detroit area. He shared that his company is giving away over 1800 turkeys in 3 locations. He highlighted the turkeys will be given away on a first come, first serve basis. Mildred commended Garrett for providing this event for over 10 years, benefiting the community. Listeners called in for more information on the event.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS**LENGTH: 40 Minutes**

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Chad Livengood, political columnist for The Detroit News. They discussed his recent article detailing the public view of the Republican party after the right to abortions was presented on the recent election ballot. Livengood highlighted that at the beginning of the election season, the Republicans seemed to be pulling ahead in all polls. He shared that when so many

Republicans became highly vocal opposing abortions, that turned many of their supporters away. Mildred agreed, sharing that women's rights should not be decided by men in 2022.

TOPIC: NATIONAL POLITICS

LENGTH: 50 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney and political strategist, Avery Bradley. They discussed the results of elections across the country, especially the results in Nevada and Georgia. Bradley highlighted the elections across the country saw a surge in younger voters. Mildred explained that many young people were at the polls to fight for abortion rights. Bradley agreed, also highlighting that women voters were at the highest it has ever been as well. They also discussed the election results in Georgia, where senate candidates Walker and Warnock will head to a run-off election. Bradley shared he was surprised that the vote in Georgia came to this as Walker is clearly a bad choice to be in the Senate.

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Gwen Thomas, founder of Fresh Perspective Seminars. They discussed Thomas' upcoming college boot camp, which aims to not only prepare children for college but the parents as well. Thomas shared that parents are not as prepared as they think to send their kids off to college. She also shared tips parents can use to make sure they'll have the monies for their future scholars.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 40 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed journalist Paul Egan. They discussed his recent interview with newly re-elected Michigan Governor, Gretchen Whitmer. Mildred highlighted Egan was the first journalist she heard to get the governor to mention whether she would run for President of the United States in 2024. Egan shared that Whitmer explained she would never run for president. Mildred and Egan also discussed what is next for Whitmer's administration. Mildred commended Egan for being a steadfast journalist.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS

LENGTH: 70 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Macomb County Prosecutor, Peter Lucido. They discussed the recent rash of students calling in fake threats to schools. Lucido shared that he is moving to charge the parents in addition to the student for making the false claim. He also explained that it is not fair to students or taxpayers. Mildred agreed and highlighted that the students should spend time in a youth home to think about their actions. Several listeners called in to weigh in on the topic and for questions of the prosecutor.

LENGTH: 35 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Brenda Price, Director of Community Outreach at AARP. They discussed AARP's focus on helping entrepreneurs over 50. Price shared details with listeners regarding AARP's upcoming workshop for business owners to participate. She explained that there will also be resources on site to discuss funding for small businesses. Mildred commended Price for hosting this event for local entrepreneurs.

TOPIC: EDUCATION

LENGTH: 20 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed author Noah Harris. Harris served as Harvard University's first black male student body president. Harris shared he has been admitted to Harvard University Law School but is taking a two-year detour to learn on Capitol Hill. Harris also thanked Mildred for having him back on the show and using her platform to highlight education in the Metro Detroit area.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN JUDICIAL SYSTEM

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Kyra Harris-Bolden, newly appointed Supreme Court Justice and the first Black woman to sit on the state's highest court. They discussed her rise through Michigan's judicial system. They also discussed what are her plans starting day one. Bolden shared she was appointed shortly after Gov. Whitmer won her re-election. She explained she plans to be fair and non-biased for all Michiganders. She also shared she was a bit reluctant to accept the position. Listeners called in with questions and to congratulate Harris-Bolden.

TOPIC: DETROIT POLITICS

LENGTH: 70 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Richard Clay of the National Federation for the Blind Detroit Chapter and Lisa Franklin, Founder of Warriors on Wheels. They discussed the Detroit City Council's recent rejection of a proposal from Mayor Duggan's administration. Clay explained Detroit's disabled community will be left without tax-funded transportation after the city council rejected Duggan's efforts to retain a company plagued with complaints of unprofessionalism, tardiness, and other issues. Several listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

TOPIC: COMMUNITY OUTREACH

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Sherri Collins, Michigan's first Chief Diversity/Engagement Officer of the Make a Wish Foundation Michigan Chapter. They discussed exactly what Make a Wish does and debunked misconceptions listeners might have regarding the organization. Collins shared that in her role, she leads the strategy of reaching more children in underserved communities, with emphasis on children of color having equitable access to "Making a Wish". Collins also explained the process of making a wish and where listeners can seek out more information. Mildred commended Collins for being a part of such a great cause.

TOPIC: CURRENT EVENTS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed attorney Eric Williams of The Detroit Justice Center. They discussed the recent lawsuit filed against the city of Detroit by The Detroit Justice Center and The Sugar Law Center. Williams explained the city did not have the authority to approve a 7-million-dollar contract to expand Detroit's Shot-Spotter program. The shot-spotter program is designed to alert authorities where gunshots are coming from before a 911 call is even placed. Williams explained that the system itself is flawed, citing that several other cities have either disbanded the program or sued the company behind it. Listeners called in to weigh in on the topic.

TOPIC: MICHIGAN POLITICS

LENGTH: 30 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Greg Bowens, political strategist and President of Bowens & Company. They discussed the shift of the Presidential Primary calendar by the Democratic Party and how that will affect Michigan. Bowens shared that

the Biden administration proposed to make Michigan the 5th state to hold a nominating primary in the year 2024. He shared that the proposal would go before the Democratic National Committee. Mildred explained that this move could energize the voter base in Michigan.

TOPIC: DETROIT POLITICS

LENGTH: 80 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Richard Clay & Robert Parson of the National Federation of The Blind and Lisa Franklin, Founder of Warriors on Wheels. They discussed their recent press conference where they promised to engage the Federal Government to weigh in on the catastrophe that will leave most of the city's disabled without service. Mildred explained that come the 1st of January more than 65% of the city's disabled will not have transportation to their physicians, dialysis appointments, or other medical facilities. Clay expressed that the city simply cannot do that. He shared that he will do whatever he can to help the citizens. Several listeners called in to weigh in on the topic, including those that were treated unfairly by the transportation company.

LENGTH: 175 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis broadcasted live from Mcdonald's in the Eastern Market area of Detroit. She hosted her 8th Annual Sleeping Bag Drive for The Homeless Radiothon. The drive/radiothon was designed to raise monies to purchase heavy-duty sleeping bags as well as other necessities for the homeless citizens of Detroit. Several guests not only called in to donate but showed up in person as well. Guests included Gov. Gretchen Whitmer, State Rep Shri Thanedar, Detroit Councilwomen Mary Waters and Angela Calloway, and other dignitaries across the city. This year's drive raised nearly 100,000 dollars in monetary donations! Mildred commended everyone who donated and assured them that she will be giving out the sleeping bags on Martin Luther King Jr. Day.

Length: 90 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis paid tribute and respect to the late Colin L. Powell. Powell was a 5-star US General who served under several Republican presidents. Powell was also the first African-American US Secretary of State and held that position from 2001 to 2005. Mildred spoke on his legacy and dedicated the first half of her show to him and his many accomplishments. Mildred also shared audio from the "Colin Powell: An American Dream" documentary with listeners. Colin Powell passed away due to complications with Covid-19; he was 84 years old. Listeners called in to pay their respects as well.

TOPIC: DETROIT POLITICS

Length: 80 Minutes

Mildred Gaddis interviewed Mary Waters, Latisha Johnson, and Angela W. Callaway, newly elected city council members. All three ladies won their elections for their respective districts within Detroit. Ms. Callaway shared her recent work in Detroit and commended HBCUs (Historically Black Colleges and Universities) for their help and for setting good examples for young black students. Ms. Waters shared that while campaigning, she was inspired by citizens who encouraged her to keep running. She also spoke about how she waited for the results until fully declared victory. Mildred said about how Ms. Callaway unseated the incumbent city council member of District 2. Callaway spoke about her campaigning tactics in Detroit and how she had no significant endorsements from The Detroit Free Press or Detroit News as media outlets but could still speak to the people by canvassing local areas. Mildred and Latisha Johnson discussed when she knew she had won the election. Johnson explained that she didn't know that she had won until the next day. Ms. Johnson also shared that the FBI raids on city council members might have played a factor in Detroiters' decision on the election. Mildred also inquired if Detroit Mayor Duggan reached out to any winners. Most of them shared that they were scheduling meetings with the mayor. Ms. Waters said that she has sat down with the mayor and explained that the 6 million dollars coming from the auto insurance reform should be allocated to Detroiters. She also explained how she would work with legal groups to ensure that this is done right for the citizens. Mildred spoke about Mayor Duggan and his past in governing and explained how he might not have full support in the city council going forward. The ladies who recently won are demanding and expecting respect from the Mayoral office. They're working together to bring more legislation on day one for Detroiters. The ladies also highlighted their work in neighborhoods, including getting more affordable water bills and money for block clubs as some of the ideas they have to uplift the communities. They're looking to find funds within the

Detroit government for these plans and ideas. Listeners called in to speak to the ladies and weigh in on the various topics discussed.
