Inside Detroit January 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021

Time: 8:00am-9:55am Length: 1 Hour, 55 Minutes

Mildred paid a special tribute to both Jackie Robinson and Muhammad Ali by playing documentary clips and songs that relate to both icons throughout the show. They also focused in on the impact both men had in fighting for equality for all in our country.

Mildred interviewed Attorney Glennon Threatt, Jr., who is a criminal defense DUI, DWI, and Family Law. He established a public defender system for the United States District Court for the Northern District of Alabama court's Criminal Justice Act panel. In addition, he is an Adjunct Professor and a political analyst. They discussed the day blacks in Georgia changed the course of American History. They also went over the Georgia political race.

She has worked in West Virginia, Ohio, Detroit, New York and Washington D.C., where she covered the 2016 Presidential election and other top national stories for the Associated Press Broadcast News Center.

Mildred Interviews Attorney Byron H. Pitts is a lawyer serving Detroit in Criminal Law, Marijuana Law and Negligence Law cases. Wilson passed at her home in Nevada.

With her attorney, she also shares previous situations involving the neighbor and with the Gross Pointe police department.

Mildred Interviewed Atty. Linda D. Bernard, managing partner of Linda D. Bernard and Associates, PLC. Bernard has won three precedent setting cases before the Michigan Supreme Court and specializes in contract and business work, including entertainment and sports contracts, and criminal and civil litigation. They discussed American business executive and civil rights activist, Vernon Jordan and his mission. Jordan worked for various civil rights organizations and was an advisor to former President Bill Clinton. Jordan Passed away March 1<sup>st</sup>.

In celebration of Women's History Month, Mildred interviewed Judge Karen Fort Hood. In November 2002, Judge Fort Hood made history as the first African American woman ever to be elected to the Michigan Court of Appeals. A former Detroit Public School teacher and probation officer, Judge Hood was elected to the Recorder's Court Bench in 1992. In January 1999, she became Presiding Judge of the Wayne County Circuit Court, Criminal Division. In addition, Hood has been selected Chairperson of the Michigan Judicial Commission, the first Black American to chair the powerful legal body.

Mildred interviewed the chairperson of the Detroit Charter Commissioner Nicole Smalls, former Wayne County Clerk Teola Hunter, and Detroit resident Cecily McClendon. They discussed how Detroiters are fuming over Mayor Mike Duggan being considered a Black Bottom Saint. Black Bottom was a thriving black neighborhood located exactly where the I-375 freeway is right now. In the 1950's the area was razed and redeveloped to make way for the freeway, displacing many black families.

Mildred shared a news story with the audience for weigh in discussion. The story that is being discussed is that a local Detroit community wants answers after a black woman was attacked by a store owner, leaving her bloody. The video went viral on social media, drawing the attention and ire of community organizers who gathered outside Brandon's Liquor Store, demanding answers; prompting workers to close up shop.

Mildred interviewed Mr. Jonathan Kinloch, Chairman of the 13<sup>th</sup> Congressional District Democratic Party and former liaison to Gov. Gretchen Whitmer. During this interview they discussed the sweeping voting bills passed by the G.O.P in Georgia, and the effects those bills have on those voters of color.

They also discussed the need for those monies in the black community and the effects it could have.

Mildred interviewed Mr. Ellis Liddell of President ELE Wealth Company. They discussed the best way to navigate your finances thru COVID-19 so that you don't fall too far behind and you're ready to get back on track once we come out of this.

She gave an update on COVID-19, the vaccine, and the new strand of COVID that could be out there.

Mr. Evans was honored with the 2016 County Executive of the Year award by the National Organization of Black County Officials for his work to turn around Wayne County's finances and improve

operations. In 2018 he was named as one of Crain's Detroit Business'
"Newsmakers of the Year." They discuss COVID-19 in Wayne County; The number of cases and if Wayne County will be getting the necessary number of vaccines it needs to accommodate the citizenry.
