1. TAX REFORM AND THE PRESIDENCY

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on President Trump's widespread reform of America's tax system, a discussion on the first anniversary of the Donald J. Trump Presidency, and a discussion on a variety of topics regarding the Trump Presidency.

Topic: President Donald J. Trump has proposed a widespread reform of America's tax system, including a simplification of the tax form, major tax relief for the highest-income Americans, and some economic relief for middle-class citizens. However, there are concerns that some states (often in Democratic-controlled areas) would suffer from a change in deductions, and that some of the most vulnerable populations could lose healthcare benefits from efforts in this legislation to stop administration of the Affordable Care Act (Obamacare). Our guests discussed the difference in reaction to this legislative proposal between "Wall Street" and "Main Street".

Topic: We are approaching the first anniversary of the Donald J. Trump Presidency, which has been accompanied by major partisan disagreements, among members of Congress, and members of the voting public. Congressman Mike Kelly, a Republican from Pennsylvania's 3rd Congressional District (Butler), talked about the accomplishments of the Trump Administration (he is a strong supporter of the President), including benefits from major tax reform, in a bill that was about to be approved, by both the U.S. House and Senate. Congressman Kelly is a member of the powerful House Ways and Means Committee, where all revenue bills originate.

Topic: A little more than a year, after Donald J. Trump was elected President of the United States, he has transformed the American Presidency, and the methods that the President uses, to communicate with the people of this country (direct, internet tweets). Our guests talked about a growing political divide in America, gains in the stock market, but rising interest rates. We also discussed the President's bold move to recognize Jerusalem as the capitol of the State of Israel and whether that move could help or hurt the cause of peace.

2. SEXUAL HARRASMENT AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The topic of this category was a discussion regarding sexual harassment as well as domestic violence.

Topic: Two unfortunate events took place during the same general time that were discussed in the same broadcast. The sexual harassment scandal involving Hollywood motion picture executive Harvey Weinstein (a subject that would become an even bigger topic during the next few months), and the tragic murder of a University of Pittsburgh female student, Alina Sheykhat, by a former boyfriend in the student's apartment. Our first segment dealt with the Weinstein case, while the second segment examined the problem of domestic violence, and inadequacies in the law enforcement. Information about Sheykhat's murderer having a previous domestic violence charge in another county somehow was not visible in the criminal justice system.

3. AMAZON HEADQUARTERS AND TECHNOLOGY

Topics discussed in this category included discussions on luring Amazon to locate its HQ2 Headquarters in the Pittsburgh area, and a discussion on the expansion of Google's presence in Pittsburgh.

Topic: Pittsburgh and Allegheny County are working very hard to lure Amazon to locate its HQ2 Headquarters in the Pittsburgh area. Many believe that our area could be among the final candidates, but what could make the difference, and how could Amazon be a "game changer" for the local economy? Our guests included Susan Everingham, Director of the Pittsburgh Office and Senior Analyst, for RAND Corporation, which has successfully operated a Pittsburgh office, for a number of years, and Shawn Fox, local real estate developer and President of RDC, Incorporated, which was among a number of applicants presenting a proposal for a possible site for Amazon should it choose Pittsburgh.

The result would mean a drastic, economic "shot-in-the-arm", including the possibility of 10,000 or more jobs in the region. Jon Delano spoke with Kevin Acklin, about what kind of economic incentives might be offered on the local and state level to entice Amazon to choose the Pittsburgh area for its next headquarters, and why we could have some advantages because of our existing tech and other academic assets at Carnegie-Mellon and the University of Pittsburgh.

Nigam discussed the "Grow with Google" Initiative, which helps customers access products, resources, and training to gain the skills necessary to grow their business or find a job.

4. EXPNASION OF HEALTHCARE FACILITIES IN THE REGION

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the expansion of healthcare facilities in the region by the Allegheny Health Network, and a discussion regarding an even bigger expansion of healthcare in the Pittsburgh area by UPMC.

Topic: The changing face of medical care, affected by the confusion over the future of the Affordable Care ACT, and a scheduled end in 2019 to an agreement allowing Highmark Health plan customer's in-network access to UPMC doctors and hospitals, led the Allegheny Health Network (AHN) and Highmark to announce a major expansion of their own facilities, in Southwestern Pennsylvania. In this program, we spoke with David Holmberg, President and CEO of Highmark Health, and Cynthia Hundorfean, President & CEO of the Allegheny Health Network, Highmark's healthcare provider, about a \$700,000,000 investment by the Allegheny Health Network to build a new hospital in Wexford, part of Pittsburgh's North Hills, and additional satellite facilities in places like Westmoreland County. This business model creates additional healthcare locations in the suburbs but also includes renovation and possible growth, of current Allegheny Health Network facilities, like Allegheny General Hospital and West Penn Hospital in the City of Pittsburgh.

Topic: One week, after our broadcast about Highmark Health and the Allegheny Health Network's plans for healthcare delivery, our program focused on an even bigger expansion of healthcare in the Pittsburgh area, by UPMC. Under this ambitious project, UPMC would build three specialty hospitals over the next five years in the City of Pittsburgh. The facilities would include the UPMC Vision and Rehabilitation Hospital on current green space, near UPMC Mercy (Uptown), a UPMC Heart and Transplant Hospital at the current UPMC Presbyterian Hospital, in Oakland, and the UPMC Hillman Cancer Hospital to be located between the current UPMC Hillman Cancer Center and UPMC Shadyside. Our guests talked about the goals of this project, and its impact not only on healthcare, but also on the local economy and employment.

5. HURRICANE RELIEF EFFORTS

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the efforts by local volunteers to help the victims of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, and a discussion regarding relief efforts in Puerto Rico.

Topic: We devoted two segments of this program to the efforts by local volunteers to help the victims of Hurricanes Harvey (Sandra) and Irma (Rob), by providing services on the ground, to the victims. Their experiences included work at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston, and relief efforts in Key West, Florida. The segment showed how those with these rare talents and compassion, are able to balance their own jobs with volunteer work for emergencies.

Topic: One of the most compelling and heart-wrenching programs in this broadcast's history. In this program, we learned about the truly heroic efforts of one person, a junior at Pittsburgh's Carnegie Mellon University, and a native Puerto Rican, Rosana Elena Guernica, to provide mercy missions to Puerto Rico, with medical and water supplies, and the transport of Puerto Rican medical patients in desperate need of life-saving care to South Florida. On her own, Rosana raised money and chartered aircraft for four flights from Pittsburgh to Miami and Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to Puerto Rico, where thousands of people still have no electrical power from the effects of Hurricane Maria. Newsradio1020 KDKA's Robert Mangino offered his services, and accompanied Rosana, on two missions, and we heard their eyewitness accounts of terrible conditions still being faced by the Puerto Rican population. The people of Puerto Rico are American citizens, and the island is a territory and Commonwealth of the United States.

6. OPIOD EPIDEMIC

The topic of this category was a discussion regarding the opiod epidemic and addiction.

Our guests talked about addiction, through very vivid, personal accounts. Andrew

McKenna, JD, participated in a special conference at Duquesne University about addiction and the opioid crisis, talking about his own battle. McKenna has written a book, called "Sheer Madness: From Federal Prosecutor to Federal Prisoner", and told us how he now counsels addicts in a treatment program in New York State. Kate Wadsworth and the Light of Life Mission in Pittsburgh also help drug addicts. They were part of a new short-film documentary about addiction called "Eye of the Needle".

7. CHARITABLE ORGANIZATIONS

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on assistance for energy bills, a discussion on the "KD Turkey Fund", a discussion regarding the KDKA-TV Pittsburgh Children's Hospital "Free Care Fund Telethon Show", a discussion on the need for donations to the Salvation Army fund, and a discussion on how the new tax laws may reduce charitable contributions.

This special Christmas Eve edition of the broadcast, focused on how we should reflect on these challenges, and the significant role that the spirit of Christmas and religion, play in helping the community cope with these problems. Our guests also expressed concern that changes in the new tax law might discourage individual contributions to charity from those who often used itemized deductions, rather than the standard deduction, to help worthy non-profit causes.

We spoke with the Interim Executive Director of the PWSA, Robert Weimar, about the state of all of their problems,

from billing and safety to water testing. PWSA remains a financial and administrative challenge for the City of Pittsburgh and taxpayers.

10. EDUCATION

The topic of this category was a discussion regarding a report that was released regarding the Pittsburgh Public Schools.

Topic: The Pittsburgh Community Alliance for Public Education – "A+ Schools" – released the troubling findings of a report about student performance in schools in the City of Pittsburgh. There was great disparity between African-American and white students, and a "chronic achievement gap", including more white students qualifying for college scholarship funds from the "Pittsburgh Promise" (based on attendance and grade performance) than African-American students. One of our guests, former Pittsburgh City Councilman Sala Udin, was recently elected to the Pittsburgh school board, from the Hill District, whose population is primarily African-American, and he expressed deep concern that minority students are often deficient in critical science, technology, and engineering and math skills, necessary to compete in the 21st Century workforce.

11. TRASNPORTATION

The topic of this category was a discussion regarding plans for Pittsburgh International Airport.

Topic: Christina Cassotis, CEO of the Allegheny County Airport Authority, joined Jon Delano, to talk about a variety of subjects, from plans to remake the airport facility itself to new nonstop service by Alaska Airlines from Seattle to Pittsburgh, and shopping amenities for Christmas at the AirMall in Pittsburgh International Airport. Changing security restrictions now make it easier to shop at Pittsburgh International Airport. Cassotis says the addition of the Alaska Airlines Seattle nonstop service was not related to efforts to attract an Amazon headquarters, here, but that if this should take place, service could certainly expand further.

The topic of this category was a discussion year-end review of a broad variety of financial topics.

Topic: On a special New Year's Eve broadcast of this program, we asked the question "Is it, the beginning of the end, or, the end, of the beginning?" 2017 marked the first year of the Donald J. Trump Presidential Administration, and a mixed economic performance for the year. Our guests talked about record performances for financial markets, and the potential impact of the tax reform law, recently passed by the Republican-controlled Congress. Questions remain, about whether, and how much, corporations will use any money saved on taxes to re-invest in new production, or employees, and how the economic gains of some have left many others, behind.
