Topic: Republicans seemed to be on a roll, as the race for President of the United States between President Barack Obama and expected Republican nominee, former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney, was neck-and-neck. Romney recently announced his choice of a running mate, Congressman Paul Ryan of Wisconsin (Chairman of the U.S. House Budget Committee). The worst challenge to convention delegates seemed to be the effects of Hurricane Isaac headed toward the area of New Orleans and portions of Florida where the convention was being held. Our guests, Mike Turzai, Republican state representative from Bradford Woods and State House Majority Leader, and KDKA-TV Money & Politics Editor Jon Delano, previewed the Republican National Convention.

Topic: This broadcast took a little bit of time to review last week's Republican National Convention, in which Republicans blasted the leadership of the Obama presidency, but concentrated on a preview of what we might expect to see at the following week's Democratic National Convention in Charlotte, North Carolina. Both guests have years of experience, either participating at national political conventions or covering them, and Jim Burn was prominently shown, as the Pennsylvania delegation cast their votes at this convention (after this broadcast aired). Guests and co-hosts agreed that the spouses of the presidential candidates were important assets to each campaign, and that Ann Romney had given a very effective speech, in support of her husband, former Massachusetts Governor Mitt Romney's candidacy, for President.

Chelsa Wagner (D) - Allegheny County Controller, Former PA State Representative, Delegate to the 2012 Democratic National Convention, and Obama/Biden Supporter

Topic: Our guests, although supporters of opposite candidates, found much to agree upon in terms of challenges that the presidential candidates face in attracting the support of women AND men in this election, as well as the role of the media and political ads in the campaign. We used advertisements from each campaign to highlight themes of both the Romney and Obama candidacies, and discussed the strengths and weaknesses of both candidates. It was noted that sometimes qualities that might make a candidate more "electable" might not necessarily lead to the election of the most qualified person for the job.

Topic: Dr. Gus Faucher talked with us about the economic perspectives of opposing Democratic and Republican campaigns, and how they will impact the 2012 Presidential election. There are great disparities on how the parties and candidates view the economy, and what must be done to climb out of recession. However, much of the debate centers around what sacrifices must be made in order to achieve these objectives, and the answer to the political question "are you better off than you were, four years ago?"

2. PENNSYLVANIA VOTER IDENTIFICATION LAW

The topic of this category was a discussion on the Pennsylvania Voter Identification Law and the impact it may have on the Presidential election.

Topic: An issue that may supersede whether voters support Romney or Obama is the Pennsylvania Voter Identification Law, which was enacted by a Republican-controlled state legislature, and supported and signed into law by Republican Governor Tom Corbett. The law is being challenged in

court, was upheld by Commonwealth Court, was appealed and was sent back to Commonwealth Court by the State Supreme Court. For all intents and purposes, the law has now been put on hold for this election by Commonwealth Court. Our guests argued about voters who might be disenfranchised, because of complicated requirements for them, particularly elderly and minorities, some of whom have no readily available form of transportation to travel to a Penn DOT office to obtain a voter ID card, and who might benefit most from implementation of this law (PA House Majority Leader Mike Turzai of Bradford Woods, a recent guest on this program, had told an audience that passage of the voter ID law would insure a Romney victory.)

3. PENN STATE

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the contents of “The Freeh Report” which chronicled the cover-up and child sex abuse scandal at Penn State, a discussion on additional regulations regarding Penn State’s Enabling Status, and a discussion on what the school needs to do to repair its reputation.

Topic: As part of our continuing coverage of the Penn State Child Sex Abuse Scandal, this program concentrated on the findings of an eight-month, independent investigation of that scandal, led by former F.B.I. Director Louis Freeh, called "The Freeh Report" which were released that week. The report blasted the top management of Penn State University from late football coach Joe Paterno, to former university president Graham Spanier, for a cover-up, and overriding concerns over the future of the athletic program at Penn State, rather than the welfare of children, who were allegedly sexually abused by former assistant Penn State football coach Jerry Sandusky who was recently convicted as a serial child molester. Our guests included Bob Dvorchak, co-author of a recent book about the Penn State scandal, called "Game Over", and veteran local attorney William Caroselli. Dvorchak is also a veteran news and sports journalist, who currently contributes a weekly video feature to the *Pittsburgh Post-Gazette* called "Sports 'N At".

Topic: Pennsylvania's Auditor General Jack Wagner, our guest on this broadcast, says that there are important lessons to be learned from the Penn State University Child Sex Abuse scandal and that those lessons affect more than Penn State. Wagner wants the Pennsylvania General Assembly to approve recommendations from him regarding Penn State's Enabling Statute. Wagner said that proposed changes in the composition of the Penn State Board of Trustees would prevent the president of a state and state-related university from being both a member of the Board of Trustees and the Board's Secretary.

Veteran Pittsburgh public relations executive Bob Oltmanns appeared on this broadcast to talk about what steps must be taken for Penn State to repair its heavily-damaged reputation because of this scandal. He also discussed Penn State's (including its Board) response to this crisis.

4. HEALTH CARE

The topic of this category was a discussion on the United States Supreme Court's ruling regarding the Obama Administration's "Affordable Health Care Act".

Topic: In somewhat of a surprise, the United States Supreme Court's historic, 5-4 ruling upheld the majority of the Obama Administration's "Affordable Health Care Act", also known as "Obamacare", which is certain to affect the way health care is delivered in the United States. The ruling was also certain to affect Campaign 2012 itself, especially on the issue of potential future appointments to the United States Supreme Court. Our guests, Duquesne University's Law School Dean Kenneth Gormley and KDKA-TV Money and Politics Editor Jon Delano (also an attorney), talked about the critical role that Chief Justice John Roberts, a George W. Bush appointee, played in providing the fifth vote with the Democratic-appointed justices for this ruling.

5. MUNICIPAL FINANCES

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the impact that tax-exempt property has on city revenue, and a discussion on the financial condition of the city of Pittsburgh.

Guest: Chelsa Wagner (D) - Allegheny County Controller

Topic: While government revenues dwindle because of the recession and costs rise, there is growing concern about the increase in the amount of property within municipalities (in this case, Allegheny County), which have become tax-exempt, because they are owned by so-called "non-profits". Allegheny County Controller Chelsa Wagner joined us, to talk about this issue, which is a problem nationwide, and the impact that it makes on municipalities' budgets. If this property were owned privately, there would be more likelihood that this property would be taxable by municipalities. In Pittsburgh, after much debate and political pressure, some non-profits have provided "contributions" to the community to help pay for services. However the disparity is great.

Topic: Pittsburgh still faces some oversight from state government, but its financial condition has improved from several years ago, when it was facing the possibility of bankruptcy. However, Pittsburgh City Controller (D) Michael Lamb says that legacy costs for pensions for city employees are one area that remains a trouble spot. Lamb appeared on this broadcast, to talk about Pittsburgh, and financial problems that other cities like Scranton, Pennsylvania and Stockton, California are facing.

6. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on tax credits for a refinery in Beaver County, a discussion on the placement of Pittsburgh by Independent Travel as a destination to visit which has the potential to provide an economic boost with increased tourism, and the

further development of the successful Bakery Square office and residential project in Pittsburgh's east end.

Topic: Pennsylvania's new budget includes tax credits that are designed to help attract a multi-billion-dollar refinery to economically-depressed Beaver County, which would result in the construction of an ethane "cracker" plant in the Potter Township-Monaca area of that county. That provision of the budget received bi-partisan report in the legislature, especially from members who reside in that county, and we spoke with Republican Jim Christiana and Democrat Bob Matzie. Each provided a personal account of growing up in that county, and what such a plant would mean to the people who live there. Thousands of jobs are expected to come, if this plant is built, but this proposal is only the first step in attracting a company, or companies to build this "cracker" plant.

Topic: A Nabisco Baking Company plant once stood in Point Breeze, but closed leaving many wondering about the future of that Pittsburgh neighborhood. However, Walnut Capital saw a different Point Breeze that could house high-tech, like Google, shops and restaurants, and a residential area. Thus, Bakery Square was launched, and it was so successful, that we are now awaiting Bakery Square 2.0, in which a former Pittsburgh Public School will make way for new residential housing, and perhaps more high tech. Our guests talked about this vision, and how Bakery Square has been a selling point for more high tech industry to locate in Pittsburgh.

7. 911th AIRLIFT WING

The topic of this category was a discussion on the state of the 911th Airlift Wing.

Topic: Facing increasing political pressure, especially during a Presidential campaign, U.S. Defense Secretary Leon Panetta gave the 911th Airlift Wing of the U.S. Air Force Reserve at Pittsburgh International Airport extended life for another year by ordering the Air Force to suspend all scheduled transfers and equipment retirements until fiscal year 2013, pending Congressional action on defense authorization. In such a politically divisive year, there was rare, bi-partisan support united among Pennsylvania's Congressional delegation to pass legislation within the budget process, which barred the 911th Air Base from being eliminated. Congressman Tim Murphy, Republican from the 18th Congressional District in Pennsylvania (Upper St. Clair), was a key political player in this effort,

and talked about where the 911th stands (members of Congress want an independent audit to prove the financial effectiveness of this base).

8. MARK SCHNEIDER

The topic of this category was on the death and legacy of Mark Schneider, a real estate developer who was responsible for many of the city's major development efforts.

Schneider was considered a visionary who was crucial to the development of PNC Park, Heinz Field, the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, and the Summerset housing development on land formerly known as a slag dump near Squirrel Hill. Former Pittsburgh Mayor Tom Murphy joined us, to talk about Mark Schneider's legacy, and the significant accomplishments achieved during his all-too-short life.

Topic: Pittsburghers were shocked to learn of the sudden death of 58-year-old Mark Schneider, a real estate executive and former head of the Sports & Exhibition Authority and Stadium Authority in Pittsburgh, who was killed in a bicycling accident in the state of Maryland. Schneider was considered a visionary and was instrumental in the financing and construction of major Pittsburgh facilities like PNC Park, Heinz Field, and the David L. Lawrence Convention Center. He also created a major high-income housing development (Summerset) from a slag dump. Our guests, a business partner, and two friends, joined us to talk about Mark Schneider's all-too-short life, and his legacy.

9. ENERGY

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on gasoline prices, and a discussion on the role energy plays in the economy.

Topic: Dr. Kent Moors, a recognized expert in international oil and gas policy, joined us to talk about gas prices, and the potential impact from Hurricane Isaac, which struck the New Orleans and Gulf Coast areas shutting down drilling and production for a brief period. Dr. Moors also discussed other factors affecting the price of gasoline, including fuel efficiency standards, and what we are likely to see in the weeks ahead. Moors told us that there would be short-term increases in price from the hurricane, but that prices were expected to drop within a small period of time.

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the role Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh is playing in developing technology such as robotics, and smart traffic signals.

CMU's National Robotics Engineering Center worked on the efforts to build the Rover that is now moving on the surface of Mars. Tony Stentz joined us to talk about this project, and what this special expertise means to Carnegie Mellon, NASA, and the Pittsburgh area

CMU's Dr. Stephen Smith talked about this effort, how it will work, and how it could change Pittsburgh traffic and beyond. Robotics will play a role in this project.

11. TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

The topic of this category was a discussion on bridge safety.

Topic: We used the fifth anniversary of the bridge collapse of the Interstate I-35 Bridge in Minneapolis, which resulted in the deaths of 13-people, with 35-others injured, to talk about the state of bridge safety in this country and this state since that tragedy. Our guest was Penn DOT District #11 Executive, Dan Cessna, who talked about improvements in bridge repair and inspection, but also discussed challenges posed by aging bridges and highways, and dwindling federal and state funding for those repairs. We looked at potential budget cuts, and what they could mean for bridge safety on the state and national levels.

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the state of women's athletic programs, and a discussion on the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Topic: This was a favorite segment, as we stopped to remember the 40th anniversary of Congressional passage of Title IX, an Educational Amendment of 1972 which forbid anyone in the United States from being excluded from participating in, being denied benefits, or being discriminated against, in an activity on the basis of their sex. One of the results over the past forty years has been a large increase in funding for women's sports programs at educational institutions, including universities, to try to overturn the disparity between women's and men's athletics. Our guests included University of Pittsburgh Women's Basketball Head Coach Agnus Berenato, Susan Bassett, Director of Athletics, Physical Education, and Recreation at Carnegie Mellon University (this includes both men's and women's athletics), and Susan Frietsche, the senior staff attorney for the Women's Law Project in Pittsburgh. These outstanding women talked about past struggles in the athletics field, involving women, the accomplishments achieved, and the challenges that lie ahead.

Topic: When this broadcast aired, long-suffering Pittsburgh Pirates fans were hopeful that the spell of nineteen years of losing seasons might be broken, as the Pirates were surging, to a tie for first-place in the Central Division of the National League. Our guests, hopelessly devoted Pirate fans and authors, Michael Lowenstein and Brian O'Neill, talked about the excitement generated by the Pirates' season, up to the July airdate of the program. Sadly, their enthusiasm faded, close to season's end, as the Pirates' pitching, and other portions of the team's play fell apart again, and the team not only failed to make the playoffs, but added a twentieth season in the losing column.

13. LAW ENFORCEMENT
