Our guests talked about the future of this act, as well as separate challenges to an expansion of Medicaid, which is being challenged by 26-states. Arthur Hellman is considered to be a scholar of the Federal courts and an expert on constitutional law, Louis Tarasi, Jr. is a veteran Pittsburgh attorney, and Michelle Boyle is a

practicing nurse in Allegheny County and is a supporter of national health care and the Obama/Biden presidential campaign.

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the state of Pittsburgh International Airport, planned cuts at the Allegheny County Port Authority, and the impact funding cuts will have on Pittsburgh's locks and dams.

increase Port Authority funding, and said that UPMC and Highmark need to find ways to work together for the benefit of consumers and the cost of medical care in Pennsylvania.

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on a proposed new building in Downtown Pittsburgh, and the revival of Pittsburgh's East Liberty neighborhood.

Oxford Development President & CEO Steven Guy, Rich Fitzgerald, (D) Allegheny County Chief Executive, and Yarone Zober, Chief of Staff to Pittsburgh Mayor Luke Ravenstahl and the Chairman of the Board of the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh, all appeared on this broadcast to lobby for support of this project.

We spoke with Nathan Cunningham, Director of Real Estate Development, Maelene Myers, Executive Director of the East Liberty Development Corporation, about this exciting venture and why it is likely to succeed where others have failed in the past.

The U.S. Census Bureau released figures, recently which showed that Allegheny County and the Pittsburgh metropolitan area are now in the middle of the healthiest population figures in many years. We talked with Christopher Briem, population expert and regional economist for the University of Pittsburgh's Center for Social & Urban Research, for some perspective on the factors that have led to the beginning of what many

hope is a turnaround, including small gains from more people moving into the area than leaving, and growth in areas like film production, which could see even further expansion down the road.

It has and will continue to change their lives, as well as the academic health and strength of the Pittsburgh community and beyond.

10. 911th AIRLIFT WING

The topic of this category was a discussion on the survival of the 911th Airlift Wing.

They were able to talk about the issue with First Lady Michelle Obama who recently landed at the base on a campaign trip to Western Pennsylvania. We spoke with Operations Group Commander for the 911th Airlift Wing of Air Force Reserve, Col. Daryl J. Hartman, about the status of the 911th, and what’s being done, on the government and personal level to fight for survival.

11. PITTSBURGH FILM INDUSTRY

The topic of this category was a discussion on state tax credits that have benefitted the film and television production in Pittsburgh.

However, tough business times have created budget stress, and the future of these tax credits is not as certain as it might have been. Dawn Keezer and Mike Matesic appeared on this broadcast to talk about the economic progress made in the entertainment industry in this area, with the help of these credits, which have been endorsed in current budget talks by Pennsylvania’s Republican governor, Tom Corbett.

12. BRAIN INJURIES AND SPORTS

The topic of this category was a discussion on the long term health impact of individuals that have suffered brain injuries due to playing sports.

Topic: The sports world and its fans were shocked to learn of the recent death of Tiaina Baul “Junior” Seau, Jr., a Samoan linebacker in the National Football League who became a star with the San Diego Chargers, Miami Dolphins, and New England Patriots, retired in 2010, and committed suicide with a shotgun wound to the chest, on May 2nd. Seau suffered from repeated brain concussions, and an investigation is underway to determine what role they played in the deterioration of his health. Our guests included Jack Wilberger, M.D., the Chief of Neurosurgery at Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh and an expert on repetitive brain injuries and their result, and Garrett Webster, Administrator for the Brain Injury Research Institute (based in Pittsburgh), and son of the late Pittsburgh Steelers’ NFL Hall of Fame Center, Mike Webster, who also was the victim of repeated brain injuries related to concussions and football blows to the head. “Iron Mike” Webster, a Pittsburgh Steelers Super Bowl champion was diagnosed after death with chronic traumatic encephalopathy, a neurodegenerative disease associated with repeated blows to the head, from football. Our interview dealt with medical research that is being conducted about this phenomenon, and what can be done to help its victims.

13. LOCAL SPORTS

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on a new sports exhibit at the Heinz Regional History Center, and a new book by a former Pittsburgh Pirate.
