#### 1. WINTER WEATHER

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the impact of the harsh winter weather in relation to Pittsburgh's locks and dams, a discussion on the impact of that costs for salt and snow removal will have the budget for bridge and road repairs, and a discussion on the impact the winter had on the local economy.

Pittsburgh is one of the largest inland ports in the world.

How will that impact PennDOT's budget for road and bridge repair and construction in the spring and summer months? We asked PennDOT's District Engineer, Dan Cessna, to join us for some analysis.

Topics discussed in this category included discussions on the conflict in the Ukraine, the Russian annexation of Crimea, and the impact on the cost of energy in the world market due to the unrest in the area.

Topic: This broadcast brought a sharp contrast in opinion about the deteriorating situation in Ukraine. Wendy Goldman, historian, clashed with Ukrainian native Taras Filenko, about the causes and impact of the conflict. In the second segment, Tymofiy Mylovanov, Ph.D., recently in Ukraine, where protests were currently being held, talked about the impact of this crisis on the people, and how humanitarian aid is being collected for the victims.

Guest: <u>Jonathan Harris, Ph.D.</u> -Professor of Political Science, University of Pittsburgh Topic: The political crisis in Ukraine and Crimea continued to worsen, with Russian President Vladimir Putin annexing Crimea, and political sanctions being instituted by both sides. In this broadcast, Dr. Jonathan Harris, Russian expert at the University of Pittsburgh, gave great insight into the history of this area, and why it is viewed as so strategically important by the Russians. Harris also talked about the likelihood of American troops being brought into the conflict.

Guest: <u>Jonathan Harris</u>, <u>Ph.D.</u> - Professor of Political Science, University of Pittsburgh Topic: The world's attention suddenly turned from Russia's "goodwill" image, after the Olympics at Sochi, to outrage, after Ukraine's president suddenly departed, after being elected, Russian troops moved into the Crimea area, and the United States and its NATO allies threatened economic sanctions against Russian. Our guest, Dr. Jonathan Harris, Professor of Political Science at the University of Pittsburgh's Center for Russian and East European Studies, provided valuable insight about these rapidly-changing developments, Russia's controversial President Vladimir Putin, and the composition and history of countries which once were part of the USSR and now find a rocky road to democracy. The Pittsburgh area has a large Ukrainian population, which has mixed views about this crisis.

Topic: The growing crisis in Ukraine and Crimea (an area rich in energy reserves) is likely to have an impact on the price and supply of energy from that area, especially to one of its biggest customers, Western Europe. Our guest, Dr. Kent Moors, founded and edits a new website about energy, called "Oil and Energy Investor", which boasts thousands of subscribers. Dr. Moors has also been named chairman of the Global Energy Symposium, an outreach of the World Affairs Council of Pittsburgh.

## 3. MALAYSIA AIRLINES DISSAPPEARANCE

The topic of this category was a discussion on the disappearance of Malaysia Airlines Flight #370.

Topic: Our broadcast dealt with the mysterious disappearance on March 8th of Malaysia Airlines Flight#370 on its way from Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia to Beijing, China (as of this writing, the wreckage had not been located). Three passengers with ties to Western Pennsylvania were on that flight and unaccounted for. Our guest in both segments was a former US Airways pilot, NASA Aerospace Engineer, and Visiting Professor of Aerospace Engineering at West Virginia University, Dr. Peter Gall. He was joined in the first segment by local attorney Dennis Unkovic, a frequent flyer between Pittsburgh and Asia, who had just returned from Asia on a Boeing 777, who also frequently flies Malaysia Airlines. In our second segment, Gall was joined by attorney John Gismondi, who represented families of victims of US Airways Flight#427, which crashed in Hopewell Township, Beaver County, PA on its way from Chicago to West Palm Beach, Florida, on September 8, 1994, killing 132 on board the Boeing 737.

#### 4. HEROIN

Topics discussed in this category included discussions on the rise in heroin deaths in Southwestern Pennsylvania.

Topic: A rash of heroin deaths in Southwestern Pennsylvania from a particularly powerful mix of heroin and fentanyl has law enforcement officials scrambling to find the source of the material and arrest the deliverers, and health care and treatment providers scrambling, to warn drug users that this material could kill them. One of our guests, Barney Seaton, told us that a client failed to show up for treatment, and became one of the fatalities. County Health Director Karen Hacker discussed her experience in Massachusetts handling a similar public health crisis.

Topic: As heroin deaths in Western Pennsylvania continue to rise, there is evidence that the material is coming from out-of-state. We discussed the prosecution of these cases with United States Attorney for Western Pennsylvania, David Hickton, and Eugene Vittone, District Attorney for Washington County, Pennsylvania, which has lost some citizens to heroin overdoses. The total of deaths as we recorded this broadcast was 22.

## 5. NEW PITTSBURGH MAYOR

The topic of this category was a discussion on the inauguration of Bill Peduto as Pittsburgh's new mayor and the challenges he faces when he takes office.

Topic: We previewed Bill Peduto's inauguration as mayor of Pittsburgh, with an interview with two people who know him well. City Councilwoman Natalia Rudiak is a member of council from the 4th District (Carrick) and has served with Peduto, and has been a supporter of his mayoral campaign. Dan Gilman, elected to succeed Peduto as council member from the 8th District (Shadyside), was Peduto's Chief of Staff. The guests talked about the challenges facing the city and its government, and the performance of outgoing Mayor Luke Ravenstahl.

## 6. HEALTH CARE

Topics discussed in this category included an update on the Affordable Care Act, and a discussion on the announcement of a partnership between the Pittsburgh based Allegheny Health Network and Baltimore's John Hopkins University.

Although the rate of sign-ups improved, great uncertainty remained, about Pennsylvania's short-term and long-term plans to meet the insurance needs of its population. In addition there was a disagreement between Republican Governor Tom Corbett and Democratic President Barack Obama over how to make sure citizens are adequately covered. We talked with Karen Wolk Feinstein, Ph.D., President & CEO of the Jewish Health Care Foundation, and a recognized expert on healthcare delivery in Western Pennsylvania and the nation, about what is necessary to complete the task.

Topic: In a rapidly-changing healthcare delivery system, colored by deep battles between UPMC and Highmark over insurance coverage for patients, Highmark's healthcare partner, the Allegheny Network, increased its prestige and standing, by announcing a partnership with Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore, Maryland, a five-year affiliation for a collaboration/initiative for cancer patients. Our first half featured Allegheny Health Network's Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Tony Farah, and Dr. David Parda, Chairman of the Allegheny Health Network's Cancer Institute. The second half featured the Chief Operating Officer of the Pittsburgh-based American Healthcare Solutions, Stephanie Dorwart, who advises healthcare institutions on delivery of services.

#### 7. ECONOMY AND EMPLOYMENT

Topics discussed in this category include a discussion on the positive announcement of the drop in unemployment in the Pittsburgh region, a discussion on the announcement that US Airways will close its operations center in Pittsburgh, and a discussion on the state of the Pittsburgh economy,

Recently, US Airways, which merged with American Airlines, and a former airline hub in this area, announced that it plans to close its operations center here, which will result in the loss of many jobs. The future of the United States Air Force Reserve's 911th Airlift Wing also continues to be in doubt in the long-term. We discussed these challenges with Danny Persuit, President of Transport Workers Local#545, and attorney Charles "Chip" Holsworth, Chairman of the Military Affairs Council of Western Pennsylvania, about what's being done on the political and economic level to preserve the 911th and cushion the blow of the closing of the US Airways Operations Center.

Topic: Where does Pittsburgh's economy rank with other cities of similar size? *Pittsburgh Quarterly Magazine* recently released its Regional Annual Report which shows that the local economy improved, but that consumer spending still lags behind other areas. Editor and publisher of the magazine, Doug Heuck, and Christopher Briem, regional economist for the Center for Social and Urban Research at the University of Pittsburgh's Center for Social and Urban Research, joined us to give their analysis of the past, present, and future of Pittsburgh's economy and population.

## 8. NATURAL GAS INDUSTRY

Topics in this category included a discussion on an explosion of a natural gas well in Greene County, which killed a man, and the political repercussions that may occur in the aftermath of this accident, also a discussion on the proposal to drill for natural gas underneath Deer Lakes Park, in Northern Allegheny County, and near Pittsburgh International Airport.

Topic: A gas well explosion in Dunkard, Greene County, operated by Chevron Appalachia, shook not only the ground, killing one employee and injuring another, but also the political landscape, as the controversy over the environmental impact of drilling and fracking continues to divide citizens. In the first and second portions of the broadcast, we heard from Democratic State Senator Tim Solobay of Canonsburg, whose district includes the area where the explosion took place. Solobay also has experience as a volunteer firefighter. Joining Solobay was John Ryder, District Director, Oil & Gas Management for the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, in the Corbett Administration. Solobay was joined in the second segment by the RAND Corporation's Dr. Aimee Curtright, a specialist in assessing the risks and advantages of drilling and other energy initiatives.

But Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald also discussed major changes in leadership at the Port Authority and Pittsburgh International Airport, and the race for governor of Pennsylvania, this year. One of Fitzgerald's Democratic political opponents, Jack Wagner, announced this week that he was dropping out of the Democratic primary for Governor.

The topic of this category was an interview with Senator Pat Toomey on national political issues and how they impact the citizens of Southwestern Pennsylvania.
