Topic: We were honored to host an appearance by the man considered by many to be America's leading Presidential historian, Michael Beschloss. Beschloss, Presidential Historian for NBC News, and a frequent commentator on the "PBS News Hour", is the author of nine books on the American Presidency, including a book co-authored with Caroline Kennedy "Jacqueline Kennedy: Historic Conversations on Life with John F. Kennedy" (2011). Beschloss, who was in Pittsburgh to deliver a lecture at Allegheny General Hospital, provided valuable perspective on presidential campaigns, presidential debates, and agreed with another famous presidential historian, from Rutgers University, Richard Neustadt, who wrote many years ago that the greatest power of the American Presidency is "the power to persuade". Neustadt says that in this area, President Obama has some shortcomings, and needs to borrow from the leadership handbook of predecessor, Lyndon B Johnson.

Topic: On the last weekend of Campaign 2012, two men who have spent much of this year covering it, talked about the crucial role that Pennsylvania played in the Presidential campaign. Jon Delano and Jim O'Toole said that Hurricane Sandy and President Barack Obama's response to that disaster may have changed the course of the campaign and halted momentum that had been created by the Romney campaign. President Obama even received praise from usually critical Chris Christie, Republican governor of New Jersey, after Obama toured the disaster area with him and delivered economic assistance that was requested.

They re-elected Democratic President Barack Obama, and a Democratic-controlled United States Senate, as well as a Republican-controlled United States House. Our guests on this show were retiring Congressman, Democrat Jason Altmire (PA. 4th Congressional District), and Republican Mike Kelly (PA.3rd Congressional District), found much to agree about, with each other. However, this cooperation does not extend to relationships that other members of opposing parties have with each other and the President, and now Congress faces the dire potential of the "Fiscal Cliff" if they cannot find ways to agree on solutions to the country's financial challenges.

2. VOTER IDENTIFICATION LAW

The topic of this category was a discussion on a ruling regarding the Pennsylvania Voter Identification Law.

Topic: In a mixed ruling, on a very controversial measure, Pennsylvania Commonwealth Court Judge Robert Simpson ordered a preliminary injunction against part of the state's recently passed Voter Identification Law, including requirements that registered voters apply for a PennDOT identification card. The judge ordered a partial injunction in the case where provisional ballots are concerned, meaning that if voters do not have the photo ID when requested to produce it they could still cast a provisional ballot. However, this ruling only applied to the November 6th election, so the controversy resumes with the next campaign. Our guests talked about the impact of this ruling on the November election, since the law was initiated and passed by the Republican-controlled General Assembly in Pennsylvania.

3. FISCAL CLIFF

Topics discussed in this category included discussions on the impact the "Fiscal Cliff" may have on investors, the United States economy, and on social programs.

Topic: Federated Investors' Chief Market Strategist for Fixed Income, Joe Balestrino, talked about the reaction of the New York Stock Exchange and its investors to the re-election of President Barack Obama. The economy was a central issue in the election, and the executive and legislative branches of government will now have to deal with the pending crisis of the so-called "Fiscal Cliff", when, if no agreement is reached on deficit reduction and tax cuts, automatic spending cuts could go into effect, impacting the middle-class. Balestrino discussed the potential impact on investors if the cliff takes hold.

If the U.S. Congress and the President cannot reach an agreement on deficit reduction and spending cuts, these programs would see severe funding cuts. Just Harvest's Public Policy Advocate, Rochelle Jackson, and Scott Waitlevertch, External Communications and Government Relations Manager for Equitable Gas, joined us to put a human face on a bureaucratic problem.

Topic: KDKA-TV'S Money & Politics Editor Jon Delano was a substitute host, in this interview with Democratic Congressman Mike Doyle headed back to Washington on Sunday in a last-ditch effort to reach agreement with Republicans, Democrats, and the President on how to avert the "Fiscal Cliff", which could result in drastic, across-the-board spending cuts and tax hikes for many Americans. Congressman Doyle also addressed other issues, including efforts to save the 911th Air Base in Moon Township from closure by the Defense Department, and the investigation of the outbreak of Legionnaire's Disease in Veterans Administration hospitals in the Pittsburgh area (at least two deaths believed to be associated with these hospitals). Congressman Doyle told us that he believes members of Congress can reach at least a limited agreement to avoid the fiscal cliff, but that the serious questions about spending and taxes, and programs will remain unresolved.

4. NEWTOWN SCHOOL SHOOTING

Topics discussed in this category were in regards to the school shooting in Newtown, Connecticut. Discussions in this category included the need for reform in terms of gun laws, the need for improved school security, and the need for improvements in the country's mental health system.

Our guests focused on the need for reform of gun laws governing semi-automatic weapons, the need for tightened school security, the possibility of armed school guards and teachers, and needed improvements in the country's mental health system. We also examined the critical role that teachers play in our everyday life.

Dr. Lane believes that in addition to security, there must be an increased effort to improve mental health monitoring and programs, and to look at the kinds of weapons that fire multiple rounds of ammunition rapidly.

5. HURRICANE SANDY

Topics discussed in this category included volunteer and corporate donations to assist the victims of Hurricane Sandy, and a discussion on the vulnerability of the nation's power grid when natural disasters occur.

Specter's colorful career, as both a Republican and a Democrat, included work as assistant counsel for the Warren Commission, which investigated the 1963 assassination of President John F. Kennedy (Specter is credited with authoring the controversial, "single bullet" theory about the assassination), and chairmanship, for a period of time, of the United States Senate Judiciary Committee. In this segment the dean of the school of law at Duquesne University, Ken Gormley, talked about the legal contributions of Specter.

He shared memories of the Senator, one of the hardest working members of the U.S. Senate in its history, with Jon Delano and our audience.

7. LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the announcement that Pittsburgh Mayor, Luke Ravenstahl, would seek re-election, funding for a supermarket in Pittsburgh's Hill District, and the future strategy for Pittsburgh International Airport.

The latest casualty is a daily non-stop by Jet Blue from Pittsburgh to New York's John F. Kennedy International Airport, to be eliminated next year. It's a huge political challenge for Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald, who talked with us about his strategy (including permitting drilling for natural gas on airport land whose revenues from those fees that would be charged to those drilling, could then be used to lower landing fees charged to airlines flying in and out of Pittsburgh International) to make the Pittsburgh International Airport more competitive and attractive to airlines and customers.

The topic of this category was a discussion on the One Young World Summit that was held in Pittsburgh.

Topic: The merit of Right-to-Work Laws versus the right of organized labor to solicit union membership, has been a political struggle in America for many years. Recent developments in the state of Michigan, the headquarters for the United Auto Workers' Union, led to passage by a conservative Republican state legislature, and support by the Republican governor, of a law that prohibits organized labor from forcing workers to pay union dues, to help fund employment benefits. There are movements in other states to adopt similar legislation, and our guests presented their viewpoints, separately, about this controversial issue (labor refused to appear in the same segment as Representative Metcalfe).

11. CHRISTMAS SHOPPING SEASON

The topic of this category was a discussion on the importance of the Christmas shopping season on the economy.

The issue remained unresolved, at year's end, as many urged the two entities to resume talks to resolve their differences, and prevent dissolution of this affiliation.
