1. RACE ISSUES

The topic of this category was a discussion on racial division in the United States.

Topic: Racial division in America raised its ugly head again after a Ferguson, Missouri police officer (in August, 2013) who shot and killed thirteen-year-old Michael Dunn, an unarmed Black youth, escaped prosecution when a grand jury decided, in November, 2014 not to indict him for the crime. There was rioting in Ferguson, as the black and white communities took different sides in the incident, but in Pittsburgh there were peaceful and passionate protests. Our first guests included the President of the Pittsburgh chapter of the NAACP, Constance Parker, and Tony Gaskew, Ph.D., author, former major crimes detective in Florida, and Director and Criminal Justice professor at the Bradford, Pennsylvania campus of the University of Pittsburgh, with Gaskew joined, in the second segment, by Tim Stevens, founder, President, and CFO of the Black Political Empowerment Project in Pittsburgh (B-PEP).

2. EBOLA

The topic of this category was a discussion on the spread of the Ebola virus.

Topic: The fear finally became a reality, as the first patient in the United States to be diagnosed with the potentially deadly Ebola virus was identified, in Dallas, Texas, after traveling from Liberia to Belgium via United Airlines, switching planes, in Brussels, Belgium, arriving at Dulles International Airport in Washington, D.C., and then boarding another United Airlines flight which arrived in Dallas, Texas, where Thomas Eric Duncan had planned to visit relatives. Duncan died in a Dallas hospital of the disease, on October 8th, and there were four confirmed cases in the United States, with more than 6,000 Ebola deaths in West Africa alone. Our guests in the first segment, talked about the medical and public health aspects of the disease, and in the second half, Luke Hingson, President of the Pittsburgh-based, Brother's Brother Foundation, discussed his organization's partnering with another non-profit near Washington, D.C., to send medical supplies including hospital gowns and gloves to Ebola-stricken areas in West Africa.

3. HOMICIDE INCREASE IN PITTSBUGRH

The topic of this category was a discussion on increase in the number of homicides in the City of Pittsburgh

Topic: After an increase in the number of homicides in the City of Pittsburgh, including some related to illegal drug activity, this special edition of the broadcast featured Pittsburgh Mayor Bill Peduto, and his recently-appointed acting Chief of Police, Cameron McLay (later confirmed by Pittsburgh City Council several months after this broadcast) to talk about what is being done from a community policing level to arrest and prosecute those who are committing these crimes. This was Mayor Bill Peduto's first appearance on this broadcast since his election, and the police chief's first appearance.

4. EDUCATION

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on ways to improve school safety, and a discussion on the results and successes of The Pittsburgh Promise program.

Topic: This program was recorded, after a series of national school shootings, local bomb threats at schools, and transportation problems involving threats. (One public school student was shot and killed in Pittsburgh while waiting for a bus to go to school in the Hill District.) United States Attorney David Hickton recently presented the Pittsburgh School District with a check for just over three million dollars, from the federal government to help fund research on ways to improve school safety. Our guests talked about the safety issue, as well as other initiatives to improve school nutrition and teaching methods.

Topic: The Pittsburgh Promise had some encouraging news as part of its annual report to the community: graduation rates for the Pittsburgh Public Schools have gone from 65-percent in 2009 to 71-percent in 2014. Promise graduates are also achieving success in employment, including Chalese Floyd-Ayers, who also graduated from Penn State University, and who now works as a talent acquisition assistant for UPMC. She joined Pittsburgh Promise Executive Director Saleem Ghubril on this broadcast to talk about achievements and goals yet to be reached

5. CUBA

The topic of this category was a discussion on the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between the United States and Cuba.

Topic: President Barack Obama stunned many when he announced this week that the United States and Cuba are planning to re-establish diplomatic relations for the first time since they were severed in January, 1961, more than fifty years ago. What's behind the decision, what impact will it have on trade, tourism, and the economies of Cuba and the United States, and how are Cuban-Americans reacting to this news? Our guests included Scott Morgenstern, Ph.D., Director of the Latin American Studies Center at the University of Pittsburgh, Lisa Valanti, President of the U.S.-Cuba Sister Cities Association and co-founder of the Pittsburgh Matanzas Sister Cities Partnership, and Stanley Cohen, Pittsburgh businessman, and longtime participant in B'nai B'rith International's Cuban Jewish Relief Project.

6. HEALTH CARE

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on changes in health care, a discussion on the 61st Annual KDKA-TV Free Care Fund which benefits Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and a discussion on how The Children's Institute of Pittsburgh is creating a model for treating children with multiple health challenges.

Our guests, Greg Barrett, President and Chief Development Officer for the Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh Foundation and Physician-in-Chief and Scientific Director at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC, joined Jon Delano, to explain how viewers' dollars are used to provide

groundbreaking healthcare for children in our area. This year's broadcast raised a record of more than \$2.1 million dollars.

The Children's Institute of Pittsburgh is creating a model for treating children with multiple health challenges that could become a model for the rest of the country, not only in healthcare delivery, but in cost containment. Our guest, Chief Advancement Officer for the Children's Institute of Pittsburgh, Helene Conway-Long, talked about the kinds of medical challenges, often from more than one disorder, that affect many children seen at the Children's Institute of Pittsburgh, and what kind of approach could be used, to both treat the children effectively, and contain costs. The Children's Institute was one of the institutions that treated victims of polio, before discovery of the Salk Polio Vaccine in the 1950's, also in Pittsburgh at the University of Pittsburgh

Topics discussed in this category included discussions on hunger in America as well as the Pittsburgh region, and discussions on the kick-off of the KDKA-TV Turkey Fund Drive.

Topic: A recent report about food distribution in America last year, released by the organization "Feeding America", a nationwide charity of 200-member food banks, revealed the shocking statistic that one out of every seven Americans is now receiving some food assistance, statistics that also match the Pittsburgh area, with figures even higher for military veterans. Sy Holzer, President and CEO of PNC Bank Pittsburgh, and Lisa Scales, CEO of the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, joined us, to help kick off the 2014 KDKA-TV Turkey Fund Drive, started in 1982 as "Julius' Turkeys", by then-KDKA-TV News Commentator Al Julius. Although things are somewhat better 33-years later, there are new food distribution challenges, and our guests talked about the critical need for donations this year.

Topic: During the week before the launch of the 2014 KDKA-TV Turkey Fund, our guests talked about the increasingly difficult problem of hunger in America. A recent report from Feeding America showed that one out of every seven Americans receives food assistance, many are elderly, plus, veterans who have been hit, and other people who simply cannot make ends meet, choosing between money for food or heat. Our guests, in the second segment, included a disabled couple from West Mifflin, (living in a trailer, and taking care of their grandchildren, including one, who is also disabled), who were recipients of a KDKA-TV turkey last year, and hoping to receive one, this year, and Nancy Denardo, the coordinator of the Good Samaritan Food Pantry in Port Vue, recipient of KDKA-TV Turkey Fund gifts.

8. TRANSPORTATION

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion on the poor state of Pennsylvania's highways and bridges, and a discussion about a new low cost airline what is starting service at Pittsburgh International Airport.

Topic: Pennsylvania recently received a troubling report card for the American Society of Civil Engineers about the condition of its highways and bridges, who reported that 23-percent of them are considered "structurally deficient". The state's highways are also ten years older than the national average, and many are in need of repair or modernization, and although the state legislature recently passed a bill to invest in highways and bridges, much of that spending won't go into effect until 2019. Dr. Kent Harries, from the University of Pittsburgh's Swanson School of Engineering, appeared on this broadcast to talk about what can be done, and how additional infrastructure spending could also improve the employment picture.

Topic: Pittsburgh International Airport has lost a number of flights, not only to international locations, but also to domestic flight destinations. One smaller airline is now coming to Pittsburgh International, Allegiant Travel, to provide air travelers with new ways to get to Florida tourist attractions like St. Petersburg and Punta Gorda/Fort Myers, starting in February. Allegheny County Executive Rich Fitzgerald appeared on the broadcast to talk about this development.

9. POLITICS

Topics discussed in this category included a discussion with Pennsylvania's Auditor General on a variety of topics, and discussions on the Republican's control of the both the U.S. House of Representatives and the United States Senate.

Topic: United States Senator, incumbent Republican Pat Toomey, appeared on this broadcast just days after Republicans swept to victory keeping control of the U.S. House of Representatives, and taking control of the U.S. Senate as well as winning key gubernatorial seats. The exception was Pennsylvania where incumbent Republican Governor Tom Corbett was easily defeated by Democratic businessman Tom Wolf from York County. Toomey discussed his role in the Senate, political relations between Republicans in Congress and the President, and the future leadership of the Republican Party.

Our guest, Republican Congressman Mike Kelly from the 3rd District of Pennsylvania, discussed everything from Obamacare (the Affordable Care Act) to the Keystone Pipeline, America's relationship with North Korea, controversy over the film "The Interview", and the First Amendment, and President Barack Obama's announcement that the United States and Cuba were beginning the restoration of diplomatic relations, after more than fifty years.

However, the future and size of those credits remain uncertain. Dawn Keezer, Director of the Pittsburgh Film Office, joined us to discuss the future of the motion picture industry here, and how an increase in the tax credit could result in a big boost in Pittsburgh's economy, not only from actors and producers, but also hotels, restaurants, and other businesses that work with motion picture productions here.

Topic: In the latest saga of the financially-troubled August Wilson Center for African-American Culture, three Pittsburgh foundations stepped forward, and with the blessing of the City of Pittsburgh and its Urban Redevelopment Authority, purchased the Center from Dollar Bank, sparing it from foreclosure and liquidation. However, there will be major changes in its financial and artistic operation, at least, in the interim, as the Pittsburgh Cultural Trust will assume a major responsibility in its administration and programming. In this segment, our guests included Kevin Acklin, Chief of Staff to Pittsburgh Mayor Bill Peduto and Chairman of the Urban Redevelopment Authority of Pittsburgh, and Grant Oliphant, President of the Heinz Endowments, one of the three foundations that purchased the Center.

Cosby, though innocent until proven guilty, has refused to comment on the charges. This fast-moving broadcast included KDKA-TV reporter Ralph Iannotti's exclusive interview with Renita Chaney Hill, a local woman who claims to be one of Cosby's victims, and comments from Pittsburgh defense attorney/legal expert, Blaine Jones, Alison Hall, Executive Director of Pittsburgh Action Against Rape (PAAR), and Bob Oltmanns, veteran Pittsburgh public relations executive.
